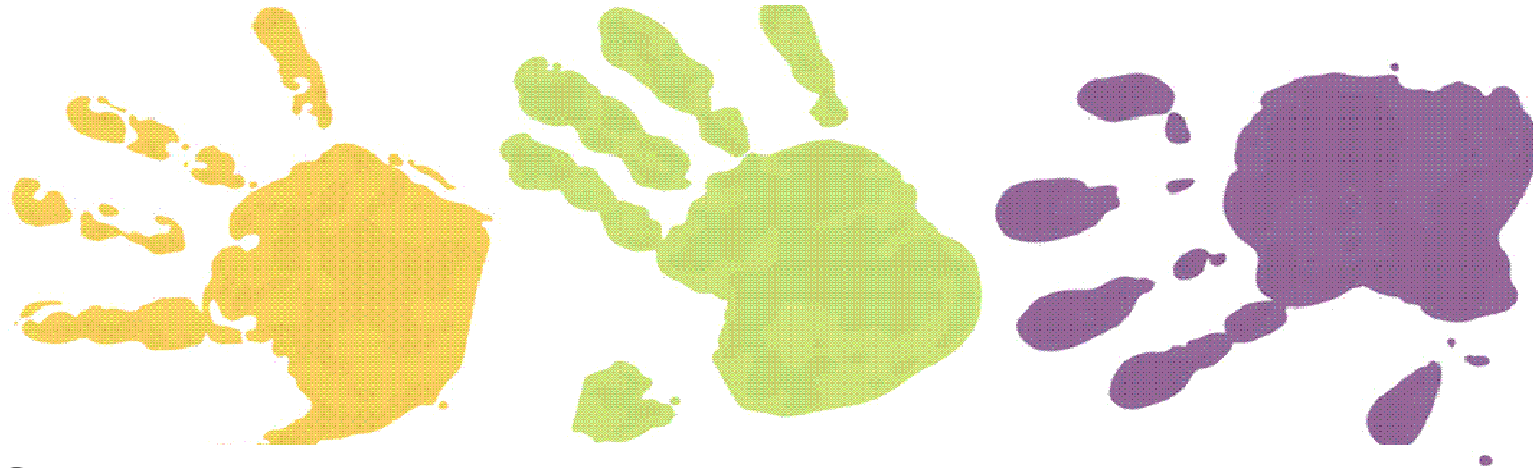

Child Abuse and Neglect Report Line

National: 800-292-9582

Title 16 § 903 of the Delaware Code requires that anyone “who knows or in good faith suspects child abuse or neglect” make a report to the Child Abuse & Neglect Report Line. The Report Line operates 24/7/365. Reports may be made in Spanish as well as English. Division of Family Services staff is also available on three shifts and weekends/holidays to conduct investigations.
