Assemble all required  
documents  
(See document checklist)

Student and one parent should  
apply for a pin number at  
[www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov).  
The pin number is a 4-digit num-  
ber used to electronically sign the  
FAFSA and other financial aid  
documents

Arrive 15 minutes before your  
scheduled appointment

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- Student and parents' last name, first name and middle initial as it appears on your social security card
- Student and parents' social security number
- Student and parents' date of birth
- Student's driver's license number if you have one
- Student's Alien Registration Number if you are not a U.S. citizen
- 2009 federal tax information :
  - Student federal income tax returns including all schedules
  - Parent federal income tax returns including all schedules
  - Student W-2 form(s) (even if you worked and did not file federal income taxes)
  - Parent W-2 form(s) (even if they worked and did not file federal income taxes)

If you have not yet filed a 2009 income tax return, you can submit your FAFSA but you must still provide income and tax information. Once you file your federal income tax return, you can access the FAFSA website at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov) and correct any income and tax information that is different from what you initially submitted on the FAFSA.

- Student and parent untaxed income including but not limited to:
  - Payments to tax-deferred pension and savings plans
  - Child support received
  - Workers' compensation and disability
- Student and parent information on savings including but not limited to:
  - cash, savings and checking accounts
  - stocks, bonds, mutual fund accounts
  - business and farm assets
