

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES INFORMATION

In addition to working with districts and agencies to provide traditional educational programs, the state system offers services that safeguard students, assure that all students have access to an education, and promote safe driving on the state and national highways.

Immunizations and health screenings are preventative programs addressing basic public health issues where children gather in considerable numbers for their formal education. The health services offer nursing interventions for health conditions that can affect a student's performance, emergency medical attention, and implementation of special health procedures that enable a student to attend school.

The State Adult Education Program offers formal education to adults who wish to complete their secondary education and provides for the special educational needs of pregnant students. An Alternative Education Program gives the opportunity for educators to provide and for students to receive, formal education in a less conventional format including different school settings and/or different curriculum and instructional methodology.

Driver education is provided to both adults and secondary students in public and nonpublic schools to help ensure a greater number of drivers in the state receive formal driver training and knowledge of good traffic safety practices.

The tables in this section provide information concerning the additional educational services that are offered in our state.
