**Meeting the Standard (%):**



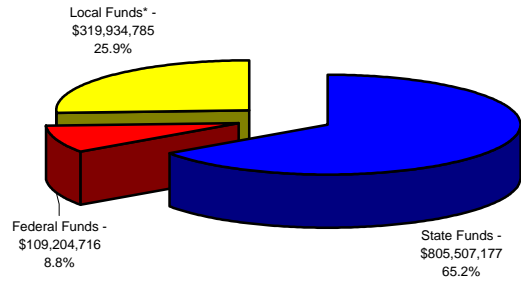
**National Percentile Ranking:**



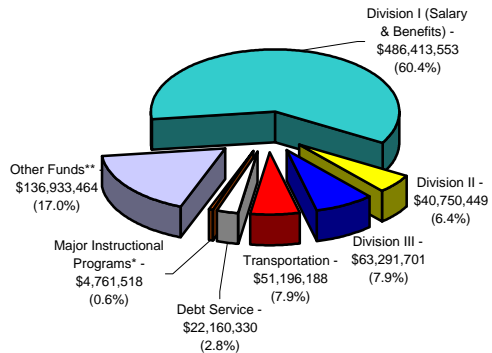

**Delaware School Finance 2002-2003**

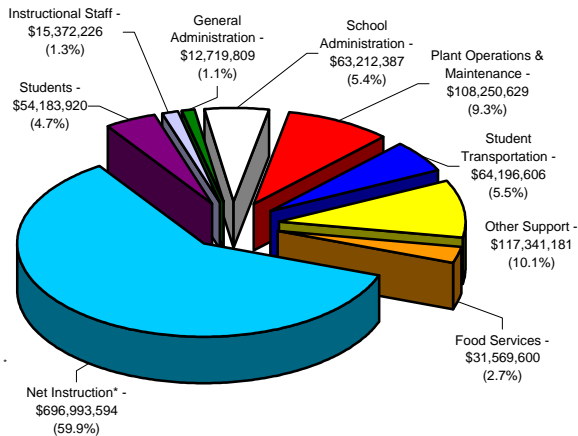
**Sources of Educational Revenue**



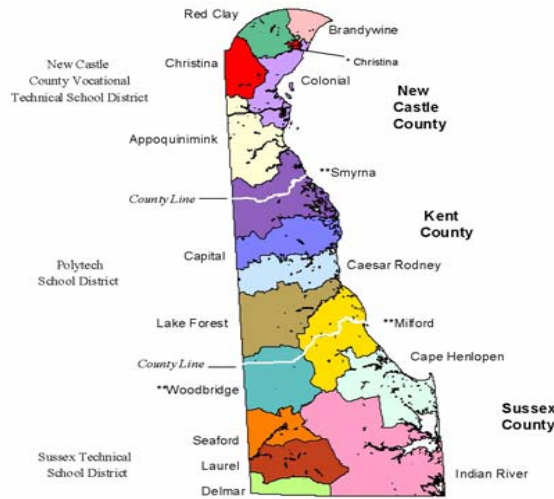
**Revenue Receipts - State Appropriations**
