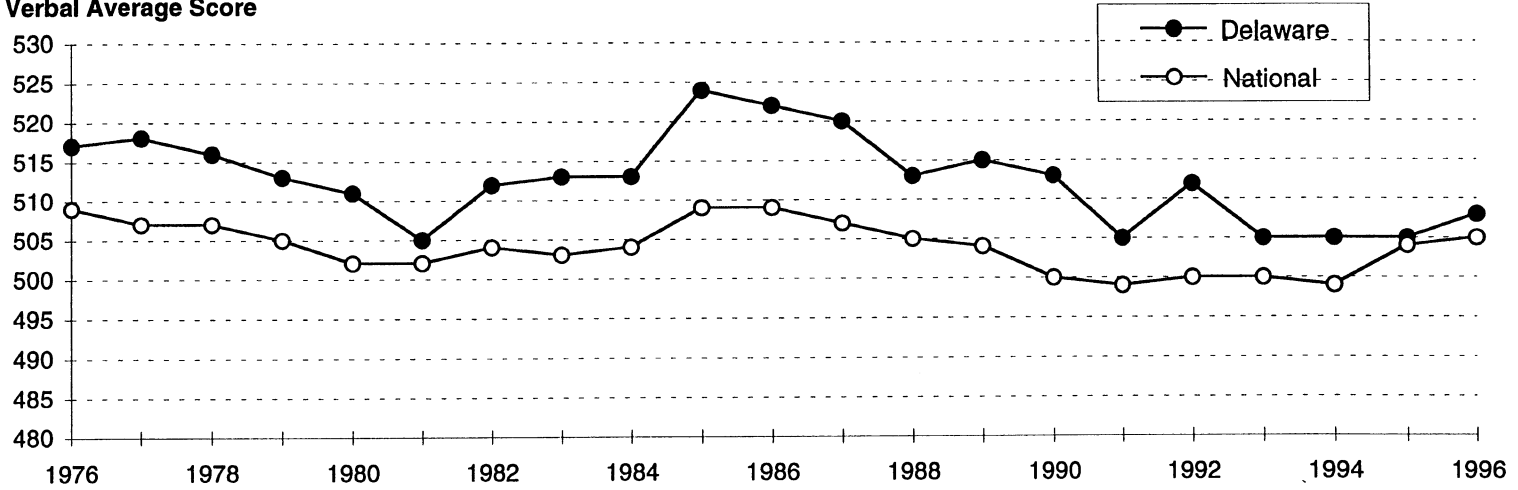

SAT I Mathematics Average Score

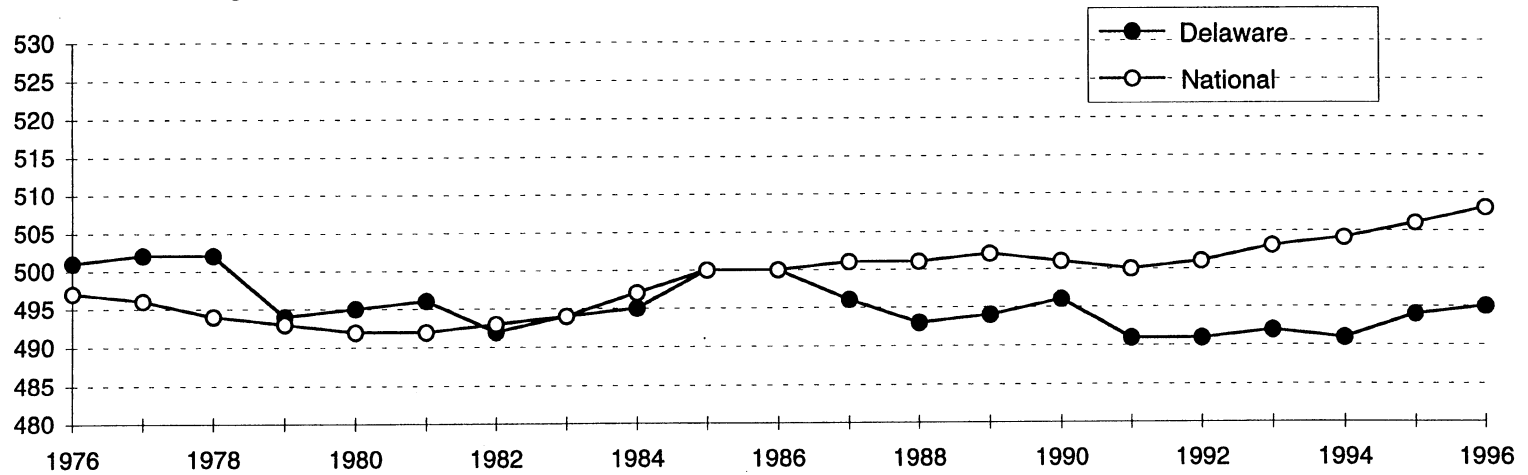

Countywide Dropout Rate By Race, 1995-96

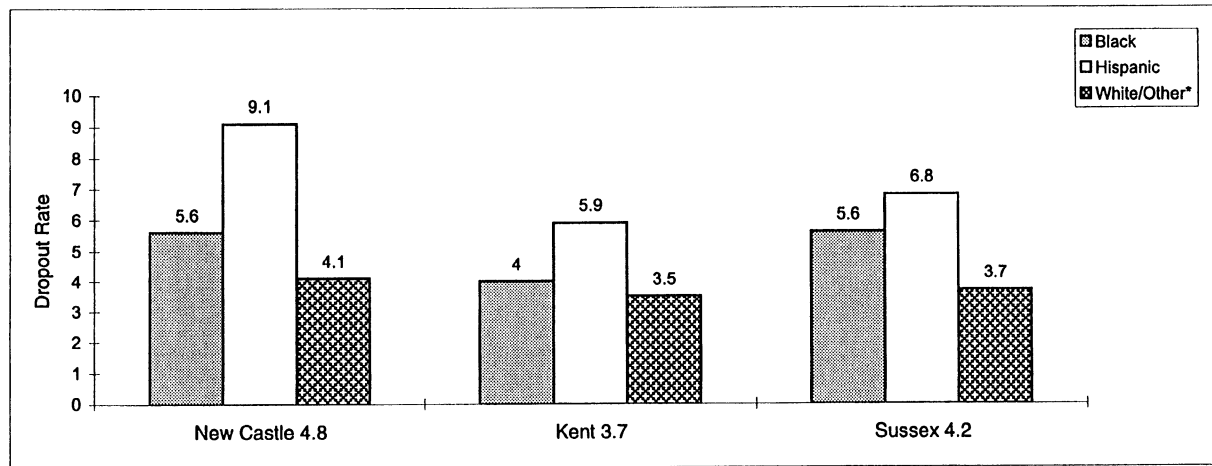

Countywide Dropout Rate By Grade, 1995-96

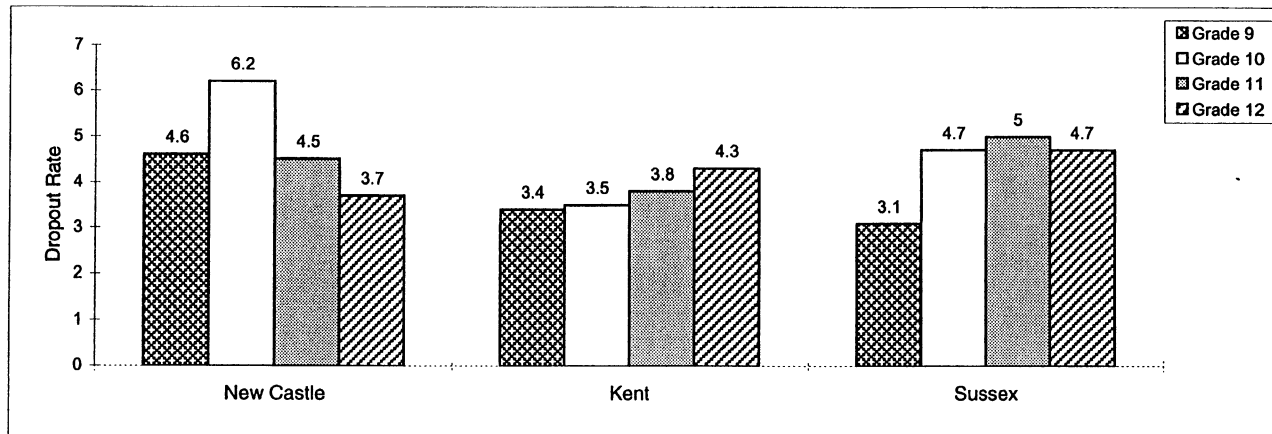
