Certificate of Multiliteracy

The Delaware Department of Education has established a ***Certificate of Multiliteracy*** to recognize high school students who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English. Delaware high school students may apply for two levels of certificate:

- **Gold Level *Certificate of Multiliteracy*** for Intermediate-Mid level of proficiency
- **Diamond Level *Certificate of Multiliteracy*** for Advanced-Low level of proficiency

Include it with your resume, college applications, and job applications. The back of the certificate outlines what valuable 21st century language skills you bring to the job market, the university or to the military.



Directions to Applicants:

1. Complete all sections of the application. Type or print legibly all information.
2. Submit application and documentation of qualifying scores to your high school counselor at any time during the school year.
3. The DOE will process applications once at the beginning of the months of November, February, and May.
4. Allow 4 weeks for certificates to be processed and returned to your school counselor.
5. **If you are a senior at the time of application, application must be received by the Department of Education by May 1.**
