Appliances (toaster, blender, small microwave)	Candy/gum
Baby bottles and nipples	Cigarettes
Bibs	Classroom activity items
Bleach/sanitizing solution	Clothing
CACFP training tools	Coffee and cream
Cookbooks	Diapers
Cookware (pots, pans, etc.)	Facial tissue
Cups	Floral arrangements
Dish cloths	Food costs for meals/snacks NOT claimed or NOT
Dish soap	approved on-site application
Food costs for meals/snacks claimed	Food NOT for daycare children/adults (parents and/or
Food service equipment replacement parts and repairs	staff meetings)
Food storage containers	Food served to non-program persons
Kitchen aprons, hairnets, uniforms	Hand soap
Laundry soap for washing aprons, bibs, etc.	Holiday decorations
Paid staff time spent on food service duties	Paper towels for bathroom or classroom
Paper plates	Personal purchases
Placemats	Pet food
Spray bottles for sanitizing solution	Pop/soda and bottle deposits
Tablecloths	Toilet paper
Thermometer for refrigerator/freezer	Toothpaste
Trash can and lid for food service	Toothbrushes
Utensils (forks, spoons, etc.)	Toys
