1	THE HEARING OFFICER: Good
2	evening. I declare this public hearing to be
3	open. My name is Donna Johnson. I am the
4	Executive Director of the Delaware State Board
5	of Education. I will be acting as the hearing
6	officer for this public hearing.
7	Providence Creek Academy has
8	applied for renewal of its charter. As
9	required by law, the matter was referred to
10	the Charter School Committee.
11	This joint public hearing is
12	being held by the Department of Education and
13	the State Board of Education to assist in the
14	decision of whether the criteria set forth for
15	approval in the Delaware Code have been
16	satisfied.
17	This hearing provides the school
18	an opportunity to receive public comment.
19	I will now ask the others with
20	me today to introduce themselves.
21	MS. HICKEY: Catherine Hickey,
22	Deputy Attorney General with the Delaware
23	Department of Justice, serving as counsel to
24	the hearing officer this evening.

1	THE HEARING OFFICER: I would
2	like the record to reflect that the notice of
3	the time, date and place of today's public
4	hearing was published in The News Journal and
5	the Delaware State News. In addition, notice
6	was posted at the Charter School
7	Accountability Committee's official place of
8	business, on the Department of Education's
9	official website, and on the State Public
10	Meeting Calendar on the State's official
11	website. Further, the school was personally
12	notified of the time, date and place of
13	today's public hearing.
14	A court reporter is present so
15	that the record of this hearing can be made.
16	It will be necessary for each speaker to
17	clearly identify his or herself before
18	beginning to speak so that the court reporter
19	will be able to note who you are. The record
20	of this hearing will be provided to the
21	Secretary of Education and members of the
22	State Board of Education together with any
23	written or electronic comments received at or
24	before this hearing.

1	We will proceed in the following						
2	manner. First, we will hear from any						
3	representatives of the charter who wish to						
4	comment. Then we will take comments from						
5	anyone else who desires to speak.						
6	I have collected the sign-up						
7	sheets, which were placed at the front of the						
8	room. I have six individuals who have						
9	indicated that they would like to speak. I						
10	will now pause for a moment for anyone else						
11	who desires to sign up to do so.						
12	Having just six individuals						
13	signed up to speak, I will try to be as						
14	liberal as time and reason allow in accepting						
15	comments. However, I do reserve the right to						
16	limit comment if it is purely repetitive or						
17	cumulative.						
18	At this point, I will accept						
19	comments from any representatives of the						
20	school, and I ask that you please come						
21	forward. And representatives of the school,						
22	please be seated at the table.						
23	The order in which you have						
24	signed up is: Chuck Taylor; Christine Kubik;						

1 Audrey Erschen; Meeshach Stennett; Kelly 2 Clark; Amy Santos. Would you like to speak in that order? 3 4 MR. TAYLOR: May I defer? I'll speak first, 5 MS. SANTOS: 6 if that's okay. 7 THE HEARING OFFICER: Yes. 8 MS. SANTOS: My name is Amy I'm the President of the Board of 9 Santos. 10 Directors of Providence Creek Academy. 11 I have been involved with the 12 school since 2002 as the original Director of Curriculum and as a board member, and this is 13 14 my second year as board president. The things 15 that I know that you will hear about our 16 school, you've already seen all the data and 17 the things that we can quantify, but the 18 things that I'm hoping that you'll hear this evening are the things that we can't quantify, 19 the feelings, and the things that parents feel 20 21 that we just can't put into numbers. And so I'm hoping that those kinds of things will 22 23 carry some weight.

One of the biggest things that

1	is a asset of in my opinion of
2	Providence Creek is the sense of family that
3	we have there. I don't have family nearby,
4	and Providence Creek has become my family.
5	And for my children, that is a hugely
6	wonderful experience for them, and for me,
7	too, to have other parents to reach out to, to
8	have support from the community, and to have
9	that sense of community.
10	Providence Creek really
11	encourages parent involvement, which has been
12	a really great thing for the children. We
13	have so many parts that come and volunteer
14	who our PTO is amazing. They have done so
15	many wonderful things. They have a fall
16	festival. They have raised funds for
17	playground equipment, among other things, and
18	they have had dances for the children.
19	They've had all sorts of wonderful programs
20	for the kids. And that sense that what we are
21	doing matters I think carries great weight for
22	our children, and it brings the community
23	together.
24	Our board has recently gone

through some training, and we have also had a retreat where we worked on our vision statement and our mission statement. One of the most powerful things that came out of that meeting was why we're doing what we are doing. We all unanimously agree we are doing what we are doing because we all firmly believe childhood really matters, that it is one of the most important things that you can contribute your time and efforts to. It can make such a huge difference. And that the board is committed to making sure that what we do at Providence Creek puts the children at the center and that we remember that why we're here is because the childhood matters and the children matter, and that it's important that they have a great school experience and a great foundation. The three things that Providence Creek really focuses on is academics, which pretty much any school does, but we have a very strong arts and athletics commitment at our school. The arts, if you ever get a

chance to see the ballet performed, it's

1 really, really breathtaking that a school, 2 K through 8, can put on such an amazing performance. And, again, that's something 3 4 that you can't quantify, but you can feel it when you witness it, and it brings a tear to 5 6 your eye to see the young girls looking up to 7 the older girls and boys. My son dances as well at the school. And from a bullying 8 perspective, it's wonderful that there is a 9 caring environment that he doesn't get picked 10 11 on for it. We're K through 8, so kids have 12 that sense of family and caring. And then the other thing that's 13 14 really powerful at our school, if you have 15 seen the percussion ensemble perform, again another feeling, you feel it. 16 The kids are 17 They are improvising their own into it. 18 music. And it's an African themed type of music, but all percussion mouth. 19 Just very powerful. Again, something that can bring a 20 21 tear to your eye. So those kinds of experiences 22 23 that our students can have that you can't 24 quantify with data and test scores and things

1 of that sort, those things are important. I want my children to do well in those areas 2 and I want them to have that experience, but I 3 4 really want them to have those experiences that allow us to feel why we are human, why 5 are we here, and that education can be a big 6 7 part of that. And then athletics as well, the opportunities for students to be part of a 8 team and be part of something bigger, but also 9 10 that athletics is not just winning and losing 11 and being part of the team, but it's a lifestyle, that we all need to do active 12 things to feel healthy. And so we want to 13 14 instill that with our children. 15 So I hope that those kinds of 16 things that I know the other parents and 17 representatives at our school will say, again, 18 things that you can't quantify that we all feel and we all know when you drive up to the 19 school and you experience what Providence 20 21 Creek Academy is. 22 So that's all I have to say. 23 THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. 24 MS. SANTOS: Thank you.



1	THE HEARING OFFICER: Who would								
2	like to speak next?								
3	MR. TAYLOR: I'll speak next.								
4	My name is Chuck Taylor. I'm the Head of								
5	School for Providence Creek Academy. I								
6	started with Providence Creek Academy in 2002								
7	and retired in 2011, and now I'm back at the								
8	school to finish my retirement, I should say,								
9	and it's been a wonderful experience.								
10	Overall, I've seen the school								
11	grow from a couple hundred kids to 700 kids,								
12	on the average, for the last five or six or								
13	seven years. And we maintain our enrollment								
14	because we don't lose students. We retain								
15	students. And retaining students means a lot.								
16	It's not retaining them as far as education.								
17	We retain them because of the family								
18	atmosphere that we do have here. The students								
19	and the parents love the safe environment.								
20	They love the the names, I heard another								
21	school talk about the names and the parents.								
22	It's pretty much the same at Providence Creek								
23	because it is a small family.								
24	And we maintain our enrollment								



because of the things that we do that
Ms. Santos talked about. You feel it. It's
not all about the grades all the time. It's
about what you do for a child. And we do put
the children in the center of the circle. So
every decision that's made is, what impact is
it going to have on kids? Because the bottom
line is, the kids don't have their careers, we
do, and we owe it to the kids to continue on.
And that's our philosophy behind all the
decisions that were made.
Like any school, we've had our
rough times, and we've had our great times.
We've just gone through a rough time, but we
have recovered, and we are on our way to where
we need to be for the next 15, 20 years, or
more, depending.
And I'd like to thank the State
Board and the Department of Education for the
opportunity to reapply for a charter. And I
hope that we can be successful and carry on
our mission forever.
THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you.



1 MS. ERSCHEN: I would like some of our parents to, if that's all right. 2 I 3 will close, if that's okay. 4 MS. CLARK: Hi. I'm Kelly Clark. I have two children at Providence 5 My daughter, Grayson, is in the third 6 Creek. 7 My son, Brendan, is in the first grade. 8 grade. And my daughter has been 9 10 straight A's the whole time that we've been at 11 Providence Creek. And first of all, when you 12 go to the campus and you drive in, it is gorgeous. 13 They have really spent the eye on 14 the details at Providence Creek. It is like 15 going on a college campus. So first of all, 16 it's breathtaking. Second of all, it is such a 17 family school. We feel so welcomed and so 18 19 My children -- I feel like a helicopter mom at times, and I feel very safe with my 20 21 children there. As a matter of fact, we just had our fall festival, and I volunteered. 22 23 I told my kids: Have at it, just have fun. 24 And this is the first time I've ever let them



just have free rein, and they had a blast. I felt perfectly safe with wasn't scared. everyone there. You get to know each other, so it's not just, oh, I've seen their faces, you actually know them and their children. And you make relationships at the school. I've made several really wonderful relationships with the teachers. I'm a hairdresser, so you know, you hear everything. Everyone tells you everything. And I'm just here to tell you that I have heard so many people say, I've heard of Providence Creek; I've heard of really good things; I've heard that they have really good I said, absolutely, my kids are test scores. there, that's the reason why. So I feel like even -- I was asked to do some murals on the cafeteria walls, and I feel like them asking me that alone is wonderful because they want the kids to be enriched when they go to school. it's not just about, hey, this is your lunchtime, we have a strict schedule, boom, boom, boom, get in, get out. They want the

1 kids to be interactive in everything. they want them to just succeed in everything 2 And I think it's so wonderful that 3 they do. 4 they go beyond what they need to do and they think outside the box. 5 And my daughter is also in the 6 7 ballet program and it is amazing. The teachers are wonderful. The older kids are 8 9 wonderful. The sports teams are great. The 10 music, we had several nominations at the 11 charter DEA awards. So they had several 12 nominations, several awards, which was really 13 wonderful. I hope that Providence Creek 14 15 actually gets a high school because I want my kids to follow with the same families, the 16 17 same friendships that we've grown to love so 18 much. And also, the school, they couldn't pick better teachers, better people on the 19 I love them all dearly. And I mean, I 20 board. 21 owe them my children's education. 22 So I thank you for your time. 23 THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. 24 Who would like to speak next?



1 MS. KUBIK: Sure, I'll go. Myname is Christine Kubik. 2 I'm a parent of an 8th grade student at Providence Creek Academy. 3 4 My son, Joseph, has attended PCA since 4th 5 grade. Our story is much like others; 6 7 we reached out to find alternative choice to the public school Joseph was attending because 8 it simply was not working for him. 9 In public school, we went two years straight in 2nd and 10 11 3rd grade, having had to supplement daily 12 class activity with hours of home tutoring, and by paying for a professional tutor three 13 14 nights a week, just to help Joseph barely 15 He was unable to play sports or any 16 extra activities, because academics had to 17 take priority. He struggled and was 18 frustrated and ultimately hated school. As 19 his parent, I truly felt the same. I sought an alternative, after 20 21 no one in the school or school district board was ever responsive to me. I wanted to find a 22 school to teach Joseph the way he learned 23 24 best -- not expect him to conform to how the



teacher taught. This philosophy, to teach to his abilities, was key.

After researching alternatives,
Joseph was fortunate to be accepted as a
student going into the 4th grade at PCA in
their lottery that year. My eyes wide open on
a change for my routine kid, I explained to
all three of the teachers from day one of his
strengths, weaknesses, how learned best, and
the type of learning environment he needed to
thrive.

Quite quickly, in amazement, Joseph's attitude towards school work turned positive, his willingness to work hard on his studies increased, and most importantly, his desire to do his best became evident. has continued in every grade since, even during some personal family hardship, when a child would have typically been negatively The school and teachers became affected. extremely supportive and responsive to Joseph's needs. Joseph has had admirable relationships with teachers built on a mutual respect. His teachers push him to succeed in his academics. And in amazement, I watch as
Joseph works hard and sets even his own
personal learning goals, holds himself
accountable, and strives to meet his teacher's
expectations.

In the last two years, he has achieved Honor Roll each trimester. I very proudly take time off from work to attend every assembly to watch him stand so proudly and receive his honor roll certificate with a beaming smile on stage.

On top of his academic accomplishments he has made at PCA, he is active on many sports teams, and currently plays for the PCA Saints football team. We're undefeated. I had to add that.

entity, but rather incorporated into the very fabric of PCA -- whether it is the football teammates volunteering hours just this last weekend for the PCA fall festival activities or it's his football coach staying on top of all his players' academics to encourage their success not just in the field, but in the

1 classroom. I've enjoyed a close, 2 3 collaborative relationship with each teacher 4 at PCA year over year, quickly establishing 5 myself as a supportive parent to the 6 Every teacher is accessible and classroom. 7 responsive and communicates classroom activity I have 8 to keep parents informed and engaged. found the sense of family and school community 9 10 at PCA to be warm and welcoming. 11 PCA's dedication goes beyond 12 learning, as they encourage proper discipline and values to the children to raise a "better 13 14 citizen." They support and encourage 15 community service amongst the students -- that 16 humbling quality that I teach all my children, 17 to always help others. That said, I find the school 18 19 matches principles and values of respect and character that I, as a parent, instill in my 20 21 children. The school's leaders, including our principal, Audrey Erschen, are always 22 23 accessible, and more importantly, always 24 remarkably caring towards "her kids."



1	I volunteer at the school to					
2	give back. I sit on the Citizen Budget					
3	Oversight Committee and make monthly meetings					
4	to over see and ensure that PCA's personnel					
5	are making fiscally responsible decisions.					
6	Many times discussions or advice are sought					
7	from me or others who are professionals on the					
8	committee, who are also out in the business					
9	community, who may be able to provide better					
10	cost-savings measures on a purchase.					
11	By my testimony this evening,					
12	please accept my support towards the school,					
13	who I will always commend for offering the					
14	right choice for Joseph. PCA offered him the					
15	right learning style philosophies in the					
16	classroom that turned around, saved, and					
17	positively influenced my son's education. I					
18	offer my support for the renewal of Providence					
19	Creek's charter.

1 you. THE HEARING OFFICER: 2 And? 3 MR. STENNETT: Meeshach 4 Stennett. 5 THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. 6 MR. STENNETT: Good evening. 7 name is Meeshach Stennett. My wife and I are 8 parents of current PCA students and one PCA 9 alumnus. 10 We originally lived in 11 Middletown, Delaware, and we also heard of the 12 advantages of attending a charter school. when we started to look out, and PCA was an 13 14 option, we were fortunate to get our son in 15 PCA. That was back in 2005. And so we got 16 him into the kindergarten. Once we got him 17 in, it took us a very short amount of time to 18 understand that we had made the right 19 decision. We've heard the comment being a 20 21 family said several times here, and I agree with that sentiment. You know, families 22 23 are -- they're not the types that really care 24 about what you are, they care about who you



are and who you become, and they provide the support and the resources to enable that.

My son -- when it was time for us to move, we actually moved down to Clayton because we wanted to be closer to the school. We had -- at the time, it was our only child, but we've had another child since then -- two, actually. And we moved so we could be closer to PCA because we knew that the education he was receiving was the type that we wanted for our other children.

what I say when I mean "family." My son, who graduated -- he currently is in 10th grade.

But when he was in 8th grade, he was involved in a situation with bullying, which we know is very common today. And he made a poor decision. That decision could have resulted in him not being able to go to PCA and possibly, you know, have legal issues as a result. PCA had the opportunity to abandon us, and they didn't. And as a result, I'm proud to say that my son right now is a 10th grader at St. Andrews High School, which is

1	one of the most prestigious high schools in
2	the nation and definitely in the state.
3	And we look forward to
4	continuing our daughter's education there, and
5	I'm just hoping that I don't want to talk
6	long, but I'm just hoping that I add value in
7	the renewal process and the board understands
8	the importance of PCA not just to the
9	children, but to the community.
10	Thank you.
11	THE HEARING OFFICER: Danielle
12	Moore.
13	MS. MOORE: Hi. I'm Daniel
14	Moore. I'm Director of Curriculum at PCA.
15	Sorry I was a little late. I went upstairs.
16	So I started my educational
17	career at PCA. It's the only place I've been.
18	And it truly is my family. I don't know where
19	I would be today without them. I started from
20	8th grade ELA teacher, moved to 5th grade, and
21	then moved into outside the classroom and now
22	in an administrative role.
23	The things that I've seen our
24	students accomplish, be it our students now or

our students that have graduated and left, that are now my former 8th graders that are now in college or have their own families or own careers and things that they've started, it's really amazing to see how far they've And it truly is because we instill -it's not just the academics. There's -- we teach them how to be successful in society, in no matter what they come up with. No matter if they're struggling with how to deal with things at home, we help them with that. So I think that's a big strength for us, is that aspect of the whole child, that, you know, they're there. We're going teach them what they need to learn, but we're also going to teach them how to be successful in life and how to get past the struggles that could knock them down and prevent them from maybe getting to where they need to be. And we help them to get past that and get through it and persevere. THE HEARING OFFICER: Thank you. Ms. Erschen. MS. ERSCHEN: I did not bring

I was not always the principal, but I was in the right place at the right time, and I still believe that I was when they appointed me principal in November of our first year. We have reflected, and we are strengthening, you know, each of those three As, the academics, the athletics, and the We reach out to our parents for their support and suggestions. As Mr. Taylor
