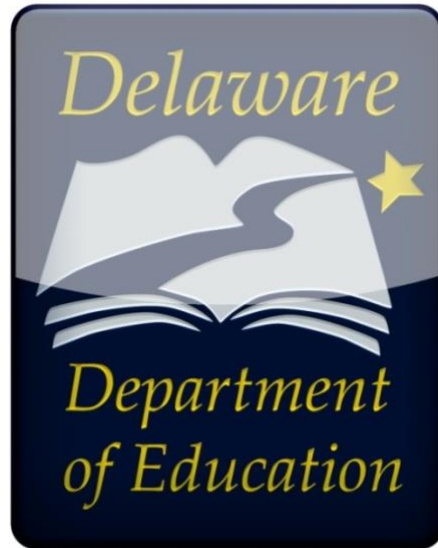

CAMPUS COMMUNITY SCHOOL RENEWAL APPLICATION FINAL REPORT

CSAC Final Meeting: December 2, 2020
CSAC Final Report Published: December 4, 2020

By September 30, 2020, Campus Community School (CCS) submitted an application to renew its charter. Consideration of this application is in accordance with the applicable provisions of 14 *Del. C.* § 514A and 14 DE Admin. Code § 275. Written renewal application guidance is provided by the Delaware Department of Education (DDOE) on its website. The renewal application template developed by DDOE is aligned to measures and targets within the Performance Framework, which outlines the academic, organizational and fiscal standards by which all Delaware charter schools are evaluated. The evaluation of the school's performance as measured by the Framework is a major component of the decision on the renewal application. The decision on the renewal application is based on a comprehensive review, guided, in part, by the following three questions:

1. Is the academic program a success?
2. Is the school financially viable?
3. Is the school organizationally sound?

This report serves as a summary of the strengths, areas of follow-up, and/or concerns identified by members of the Charter School Accountability Committee (CSAC) during their individual reviews of the charter applicant's renewal application, Performance Review Reports, Annual Reports and Performance Agreements and during the CSAC meetings.

Discussion

Ms. Klein stated that on March 12, 2020, Governor Carney issued a declaration of a state of emergency for the state of Delaware due to a public health threat. The State of Emergency allows all public meetings of executive branch public bodies, including CSAC, to be conducted electronically, either by means of telephone or video-conference call. This meeting was open to the public electronically only, as was reflected on the State's Public Meeting Calendar.

Ms. Klein stated that the Charter School Accountability Committee (CSAC) held its initial meeting on October 27, 2020 and the CSAC issued its Initial Report on November 5, 2020. The school was provided an opportunity to submit a response to the CSAC Initial Report by November 20, 2020 and the school submitted a timely response. Ms. Klein also stated that the Department of Education and State Board of Education held a virtual initial joint public hearing on November 9, 2020.

Ms. Klein stated that the purpose of the CSAC Final meeting was for the CSAC to continue its review of the Renewal Application, pursue any areas of concerns through a discussion with the applicant, and issue recommendations on the application. She added that the CSAC would issue a final report on the application no later than December 4, 2020.

Ms. Klein noted that the minutes for the CSAC Initial Meeting on October 27, 2020 were distributed in advance. She then asked if there were any amendments to the minutes as presented. The motion was made and seconded to approved the minutes and was carried unanimously.

Ms. Klein noted that at the October 27th initial meeting, the CSAC identified areas that required a response and/or additional information from the school. The information included the following:

1. Math Curriculum (Grade 4): Provide response to address where the standards in modules 2 and 7 are embedded in the units of instruction for Grade 4 (see Appendix A).
2. School Climate and Discipline:
 - a. Provide an updated copy of the school's cyber-bullying policy;
 - b. Add a link on the school's homepage with the contact information for the State Ombudsman's anti-bullying hotline;
 - c. Provide an updated Code of Conduct with a correction to the section regarding written notice requirements for out of school suspensions. Specifically, the regulation requires that parents receive written notice with information on their right to appeal prior to the out of school suspension;
3. Educator Support: provide validation from the DEEDS Mentoring Center that mentors and mentees are paired.

Ms. Klein asked each member to share any comments or questions regarding the school's response to the CSAC Initial Report.

Dr. Fulkerson thanked the school for its submission regarding the Grade 4 math curriculum to demonstrate alignment to the state math standards. He stated that the Education Associate for math determined that the submission meets expectations for alignment. Dr. Fulkerson noted a minor concern for the school to be aware of – the new plan attempts to address the standards in a very short amount of time. Specifically, the school's submission indicates that Modules 1 and 2 would be addressed together and, similarly, Modules 3 and 7 would be addressed together. Dr. Fulkerson explained that the time recommended by the vendor to complete Modules 3 and 7 is about 12 weeks total but the school's pacing guide indicates that the modules will be covered in half the time or 6 weeks. The pacing for Modules 1 and 2 is only slightly short of the vendor's recommendation. Dr. Fulkerson stated that the school's curriculum documents in all of the submitted content areas have been determined to meet expectations for demonstrating alignment to State standards.

Mr. Moore thanked the school for updating its cyber-bullying policy, homepage information, and code of conduct. In particular, he commended the school for the updates to its code of conduct regarding student suspensions. Mr. Moore added that he shared the language with other schools to inform the updates to their codes of conduct. Lastly, he reminded the school that the State vendor for the Emergency Response Information Portal (ERIP) has changed and the school should contact the Comprehensive School Safety team at the Delaware Emergency Management Agency (DEMA) to receive its new log in credentials for the new platform.

Ms. Klein asked the CSAC if they had any questions or comments regarding the application that required further discussion. There were none.

Conclusion

Ms. Klein then asked if there was a motion to recommend that Campus Community School has met the standard for charter operations under the charter school law and, therefore, its charter should be renewed for a five-year term beginning on July 1, 2021 with or without conditions. The motion was made and seconded to recommend approval without any conditions and was carried unanimously.

Ms. Klein reminded the school that the CSAC's recommendation was just that: a recommendation to the Secretary of Education on the renewal application.

Next Steps:

- The public comment period closes on December 11, 2020.
- The Secretary of Education will announce her decision at the December 17, 2020 State Board of Education meeting and seek the assent of the State Board, as necessary.
