1 MS. STOUFFER: Good evening. I  
2 declare this Public Hearing to be open.

3 My name is Denise Stouffer. I  
4 am the Lead Education Associate. And I have  
5 been appointed by the Secretary of Education  
6 to conduct this Public Hearing.

7 With me this evening is  
8 Catherine Hickey, the Deputy Attorney General  
9 for the Delaware Department of Education, an  
10 employee of the Delaware Department of  
11 Justice.

12 The Early College High School  
13 at Delaware State University Charter School  
14 has filed an application to renew its charter  
15 for a term of five years.

16 The matter was referred to the  
17 Charter School Accountability Committee for  
18 investigation and report.

19 This Public Hearing is being  
20 held to receive public comments.

21 I would like the record to  
22 reflect that the notice of the time, date and  
23 place of today's public hearing was published  
24 in The News Journal and The Delaware State



1 News on November 5, 2017.

2 In addition, notice was posted  
3 at the Charter School Office Accountability  
4 Committee's official place of business on the  
5 Delaware Department of Education's official  
6 website and on the State Public Meeting  
7 Calendar on the State's official website.

8 Further, the Early College High  
9 School at Delaware State University Charter  
10 School was personally notified of the time,  
11 date and place of today's Public Hearing on  
12 October 31, 2017.

13 A court reporter is present so  
14 that a record of this hearing can be made.  
15 It will be necessary for each speaker to  
16 clearly identify his or herself before  
17 beginning to speak so that the court reporter  
18 will be able to note who you are.

19 The record of this hearing will  
20 be provided to the Secretary of Education and  
21 Members of the State Board of Education,  
22 together with any written or electronic  
23 comments received during the course of the  
24 new renewal decision.



1                   To date, we have received one  
2 written comment.

3                   We will proceed in the  
4 following manner.

5                   First we will hear from any  
6 representatives of the charter school who  
7 wish to comment on the renewal application.

8                   Then we will take comments from  
9 anyone else who desires to speak.

10                  There was a sign-up sheet as  
11 you entered the room. If you desire to  
12 speak, please sign up now.

13                  I will pause for a moment off  
14 the record to permit anyone who desires to  
15 sign up to speak.

16                  MS. STOUFFER: Off the record.

17                  (Off the record.)

18                  MS. STOUFFER: Let's go back on  
19 the record.

20                  (Back on the record.)

21                  MS. STOUFFER: At this point, I  
22 will accept comments from representatives of  
23 the school.

24                  Thank you.



1 DR. EVELYN EDNEY: Good  
2 evening, everyone. Evelyn Edney, the very  
3 proud principal of the Early College High  
4 School at Delaware State University.

5 What if students who were  
6 unlikely to go to college had the opportunity  
7 to enroll in college courses while they were  
8 still in high school?

9 What if they were given extra  
10 academic and social support from instructors  
11 and the chance to experience a college  
12 culture before graduation?

13 Would more of these students  
14 end up graduating from high school, enrolling  
15 in college and ultimately obtaining a college  
16 degree?

17 According to a 2014 study by  
18 the American Institute for Research, the  
19 answer is yes.

20 The study explored the impact  
21 of the Early College High School Initiative  
22 that was launched by Bill and Melinda Gates  
23 Foundation in 2002.

24 The initiative provided funds



1 for the development of Early College High  
2 Schools to give students, who are  
3 traditionally underrepresented in  
4 post-secondary education, the opportunity to  
5 enroll in college courses and receive credit  
6 while pursuing a high school diploma. The  
7 goal is to better prepare these students for  
8 college and career success.

9                   The Early College High School  
10 Initiative Impact Study compared educational  
11 outcomes for students who applied for  
12 admission to an Early College, participated  
13 in a lottery, and were admitted, these are  
14 Early College students in the study, and then  
15 compared them to educational outcomes for  
16 students who applied for admission,  
17 participated in the lottery but were not  
18 admitted, and their comparison students.

19                   This randomized controlled  
20 trial design allowed researchers to provide  
21 strong evidence to answer the study research  
22 questions.

23                   So that made all of the  
24 differences between Early College and





1 comparison students reported statistically  
2 significant. These were the key findings.

3 Early College students were  
4 more likely to graduate from high school,  
5 rather than the comparison students.

6 Early College students were  
7 more likely to enroll in college than  
8 comparison students.

9 Early College students were  
10 more likely than comparison students to  
11 enroll in two-year colleges and were as  
12 likely to enroll in four-year colleges.

13 Early College students were  
14 more likely to earn a college degree than  
15 comparison students.

16 Early Colleges benefit all  
17 types of students.

18 Early College students had more  
19 positive high school experiences than  
20 comparison students.

21 Well, at the Early College High  
22 School at Delaware State University, we are  
23 happy to be graduating our first class this  
24 year.



1                   We are happy that one  
2 hundred percent of our students applied to  
3 Delaware State University and hope that all  
4 or most of them attend in the fall and to  
5 contribute to DSU's historical enrollment  
6 numbers.

7                   We are happy that all of our  
8 students have a leg up and will be that much  
9 closer to their futures because they attended  
10 an Early College High School.

11                   And although there are over 300  
12 Early College High Schools in the country, we  
13 are happy that we are the only ones in the  
14 State of Delaware.

15                   We bring something to Delaware  
16 that no other school has.

17                   We are unique that way, and it  
18 would make us happy to continue on this path  
19 of affording students this opportunity. And  
20 we hope that this will make the School Board,  
21 State School Board happy as well.

22                   We want to personally thank the  
23 CSAC Committee who took so much time to come  
24 to the conclusion that we should be renewed.



1           We wan to also thank you for  
2 the Charter School Champions, Denise Stouffer  
3 and John Carwell, who supported us through  
4 this process and support us every day.

5           We thank you very much for your  
6 time and have a great evening.

7           MS. STOUFFER: At this point, I  
8 will accept comments from anyone else who  
9 desires to speak. Please remember to  
10 identify yourself before you begin your  
11 comments.

12           If not, I want to thank you all  
13 for participating today.

14           The Secretary will consider  
15 your comments in making her decision at the  
16 conclusion of the renewal process.

17           The Secretary will announce her  
18 decision at the meeting of the State Board of  
19 Education on December 14, 2017.

20           This hearing is now closed.  
21 However, should additional people attend the  
22 meeting, we will re-open the record so that  
23 their comments can be included.


