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Organizational Performance Framework Guidance Document

The purpose of the Organizational Performance Framework is to provide to each charter school and the public a useful annual assessment of the school's organizational soundness, public stewardship, and fulfillment of essential legal obligations. The Organizational Performance Framework reflects expectations the charter school is required to meet through state and federal law and the charter performance agreement, and seeks to provide information regarding these key questions:

- Is the school organizationally sound and well operated?
- Is the school fulfilling its legal obligations, fiduciary duties, and sound public stewardship?
- Is the school meeting its obligations and expectations for appropriate access, education, support services, and outcomes for students with disabilities?

As much as possible, the Organizational Performance Framework seeks to focus on:

- outcomes rather than process or inputs (except where the law dictates particular compliance processes or requirements);
- matters that are material or significant to a school's organizational health and effectiveness; and
- measures that can be objectively judged or determined.

The purpose of the Organizational Performance Framework Guidance Document is to provide charter school leaders and boards with clear expectations, fact-based oversight, and timely feedback while ensuring charter autonomy. The Organizational Framework Guidance Document is a living document that will be reviewed and enhanced on a regular basis to align with the improvements in educational systems and school regulations. It is the goal of our current Organizational Framework Guidance Document to:

- Clearly communicate standards and expectations to schools;
- Conduct a transparent, consistent, and predictable oversight process;
- Conduct an oversight process that is respectful of schools' autonomy;
- Focus on student outcomes; and
- Provide evidenced-based feedback to schools and communities indicating where schools stand relative to performance framework expectations and standards.

Organizational Performance Framework Guidance Document Goals:

The Organizational Framework Guidance Document contains:

- 1. A clearly defined list of Indicators, Measures, and sub-measures required to operate a high functioning quality school.
- 2. A system to measure a school's Organizational Performance in relationship to 'quality' that:
 - a. Is specific and measureable.
 - b. Identifies critical sub-measures that must be met for an overall category to be considered meets standard.
 - c. Utilizes a clear set of business rules.
 - d. Is based in accurately timely data.
 - e. Provides for inter-rater reliability.
- 3. A system that clearly defines Meets Standard, Approaching Standards, and Far Below Standard for each of the key indicators and sub-indicators.
- 4. A system for providing tiered technical assistance and monitoring based on a school's performance and number of years in operation.

Organizational Performance Framework Guidance Document Scoring:

For each measure, a school will receive one of the ratings described below:

Rating	Description
Meets Standard	The school generally meets the stated expectations and/or minor concern(s) are noted.
Approaching Standard ¹	The school meets some of the stated expectations but not others and/or moderate concern(s) are noted.
Far Below Standard	The school falls below the stated expectations and/or significant concern(s) are noted. The failures are material and significant to the viability to the school.

Organizational performance is often tied to absolute standards for compliance established in law, regulation, or contract. Legal and contractual requirements are either met or they are not. In order to avoid penalizing charter schools for anything less than perfection, the authorizer will apply a reasonable interpretation of sufficiency that acknowledges attentiveness, prudent compliance, and generally sound stewardship.

"Material" and "significant" mean that the authorizer deems the matter relevant to:

- The authorizer's accountability decisions including but not limited to decisions about whether to renew, not renew, or revoke a charter; or
- Information that a family would consider relevant to a decision to attend the school.

For any measure where a school is rated **APPROACHING STANDARD** or **FAR BELOW STANDARD**, the authorizer will provide an explanation of the rating. If a school receives an overall rating of **FAR BELOW STANDARD** on the Organizational Framework, the authorizer, in conjunction with the school, will conduct a comprehensive analysis of the identified areas and collaboratively develop a plan for technical assistance that will include on-site monitoring.

The Department of Education will conduct at a minimum two on-site visits the preceding year for each school that fails to meet standards in the overall Organizational Framework. The Department of Education will provide guidance for each school partially meeting standard or not meeting standard in an overall measure and will conduct on-site monitoring as agreed upon and needed.

A school is not permitted to be 'approaching standard' in the same indicator, rating, or overall rating for 3 consecutive years. If a school achieves a rating of "Approaching Standard" for 3 consecutive years in the same indicator, measure, or overall rating, that measure, indicator, and/or overall rating will be converted to **FAR BELOW STANDARD** in the third year.

For the purpose of clarity and alignment across the academic and organizational performance frameworks, Does Not Meet Standard was changed to Far Below Standard in 2016. These terms will be used synonymously for the purposes of annual reporting.

¹ Due to the developmental nature of establishing a high-performing charter school, it is not unusual for schools in their first charter term to receive "Approaching Standard" for certain measures.

Scoring the Organizational Framework

Scoring Measure Ratings

Business Rule: Each measure is scored using the rubric included for each measure and sub-measure within the Organizational Framework Guidance Document. Once the rubric is completed in its entirety, the scoring for each measure is calculated. The number of points required to achieve each performance level rating for each measure is defined below. Please note that not all metrics can be populated for all schools. For example, some schools do not receive state grants and therefore can only earn 8 of the possible 10 points for measure 1.b. The metric is adjusted accordingly for these schools.

Business Rules for Overall Ratings

The calculation of each indicator rating is a percent. All percentages, including the overall percent are rounded up for all numbers ending in 0.5 through 0.9.

In order to earn a rating of Meets Standard, a school needs to:

- 1. Obtain an overall rating of 95% or higher in their overall rating.
- 2. Achieve Approaching Standard or Meets Standard in all Measures Ratings.
- 3. A school is not permitted to receive an overall rating of Meets Standard if they receive a rating of 'Far Below Standard' in any measure rating.

In order to earn a rating of Approaching Standard, a school needs to:

- 1. Obtain an overall score between an 87% and a 94% in their overall rating.
- 2. Achieve Approaching Standard or Meets Standard in the majority of the Measures Ratings.
- 3. A school is permitted to receive an overall rating of Approaching Standard if they achieve no more than one rating of 'Far Below Standard' in any measure rating.

In order to earn a rating of Far Below Standard, a school must:

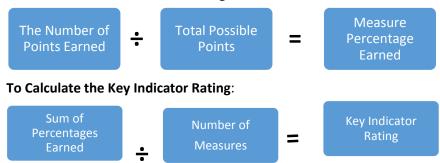
- 1. Earn an overall rating on 86.4% or less and/or
- 2. Achieve more than one rating of 'Far Below Standard' in any measure rating.

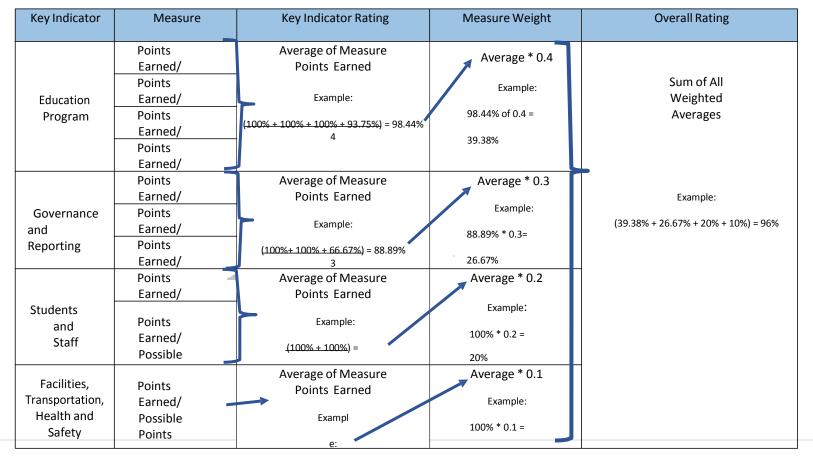
