MS. NAGOURNEY: Okay. Good evening. I declare this public hearing to be open. My name is Jennifer Nagourney. I am the Executive Director with the Charter School Office for the Delaware Department of Education. And I have been appointed by the Secretary of Education to conduct this public hearing. Providence Creek Academy has applied for the renewal of its charter. As required by law, the matter was referred to the Charter School Accountability Committee. The Committee has issued its final report, which recommended renewal of the charter without conditions. This joint public hearing is being held by the Department of Education and the State Board of Education to assist in the decision of whether the criteria set forth for renewal in the Delaware Code have been satisfied. This hearing provides the school with an opportunity to receive I will now ask the others with me public comment. today to introduce themselves. Good evening. MS. HICKEY: My name is Catherine Hickey, and I'm a Deputy Attorney General with the Delaware Department of Justice, and

7	MS. NAGOURNEY: I would like the					
8	record to reflect that the notice of the time, date,

We will proceed in the following First, we will hear from any manner: representatives of the charter who wish to comment. Then we will take comments from anyone else who desires to speak. I have the sign-up sheets here from Providence Creek Academy with two speakers. MR. TAYLOR: Yes, ma'am. MS. NAGOURNEY: Thank you. I will ask you to consider limiting your time to three minutes. At this point we will accept comments from representatives of the school. MR. TAYLOR: Hi. My name is Chuck I'm the Head of School for Providence Creek Taylor. Academy. And I would like to thank the Charter School Accountability Committee and the Department of Education for allowing us to reapply for a charter. The process has been flawless, as far as I'm concerned, with the amount of -- the amount

of work that we have done with the Department in 1 2 answering the questions and also providing input. And, hopefully, that with our work that we worked 3 4 collaboratively with the Department, we will be approved at the next State Board meeting. 5 6 again, we thank you. 7 That was less than three MR. COOPER: 8 minutes. (Laughter) My name is Guy Cooper. 9 I'm a third grade teacher at Providence Creek Academy, and I'm a 10 11 teacher member of the board. 12 Thank you for allowing me to speak this evening. I just wanted to sort of touch on a 13 14 learning experience that I have had since last year, 15 which was my first year at PCA. 16 Last year I came in as a third grade teacher, and halfway through the year I was elected 17 18 to the board of directors. So through this whole process and through my career at PCA so far, I have 19 had a real opportunity to see the different dynamics 20 21 between the two, being a teacher and being a board member. 22 23 And, you know, I would just say that 24 seeing it from both sides, hearing it from both

1 sides, it's been a smooth transition. It has been a 2 very fluid process as far as the renewal goes. have seen morale at our school with our teachers and 3 4 our staff members really change since last year. You know, especially since last 5 6 year's scores came out with Smarter Balance, it 7 really gave us kind of a pickup in our spirits, in 8 our energy at the school. The staff at our school really 9 collaborates. We are a family. We all look out for 10 11 each other. I have never worked at a place quite 12 like PCA where we all kind of -- we share. know, a lot of the teachers don't want to share 13 14 their things and their tricks and their materials, 15 but at PCA we collaborate. Even, you know, I'll 16 collaborate with a fifth or sixth grade teacher just 17 to get some ideas. I will get my students familiar 18 with the higher grades and seeing other teachers. And so my point is that as a teacher, 19 as a board member, I have been able to see these 20 21 things change and, you know, I think we have got a good thing going at PCA. 22 23 So, you know, thank you for considering our charter renewal. And we are looking 24

1	forward to it.
