1 MS. NAGOURNEY: Good evening. I
2 declare this public hearing to be open. My
3 name is Jennifer Nagourney; I'm the executive
4 director of the Charter School Office for the
5 Delaware Department of Education, and I will
6 serve as hearing officer for this public
7 hearing.

8 Academia Antonia Alonso has
9 applied for a major modification to its
10 charter. As required by law, the matter was
11 referred to the Charter School Accountability
12 Committee.

13 This joint public hearing is
14 being held by the Department of Education and
15 the State Board of Education to assist in the
16 decision of whether the criteria set forth for
17 approval in the Delaware Code have been
18 satisfied. This hearing provides an
19 opportunity for public comment.

20 I will now ask the others with me
21 today to introduce themselves.

22 MS. HICKEY: Good evening. My
23 name is Catherine Hickey; I'm the deputy
24 attorney general with the Delaware Department



1 of Justice, and I'm here today serving as
2 counsel for the hearing officer.

3 MS. NAGOURNEY: I would like the
4 record to reflect that the notice of the time,
5 date, and place of today's public hearing was
6 published in the News Journal and the Delaware
7 State News. In addition, notice was published
8 at the Charter School Accountability
9 Committee's official place of business, on the
10 Department of Education's official website, and
11 on the State Public Meeting Calendar on the
12 State's official website. Further, the school
13 was personally notified of the time, date, and
14 place of today's public hearing.

15 A court reporter is present so
16 that a record of this hearing can be made. It
17 will be necessary for each speaker to clearly
18 identify himself or herself before beginning to
19 speak so that the court reporter will be able
20 to note who you are. The record of this
21 hearing will be provided to the Secretary of
22 Education and members of the State Board of
23 Education, together with any written or
24 electronic comments received at or before this



1 hearing.

2 We will proceed in the following
3 manner. First, we will hear from any
4 representatives of the charter who wish to
5 comment. Then we will take comments from
6 anyone else who desires to speak.

7 I will now pause for a moment.
8 If I could see a show of hands for everyone who
9 wishes to speak for Academia Antonia Alonso,
10 just raise your hands. For the sake of time, I
11 ask everyone to keep their comments to three
12 minutes. If there's something you want to turn
13 in, you can hand it to me on paper and it will
14 be added to the record as if you spoke the
15 words aloud.

16 At this point, we would like a
17 representative from the school to come forward
18 and speak.

19 MR. PHELPS: My name is Mark
20 Phelps, principal at Academia Antonia Alonso.

21 I first just want to offer my
22 thanks to our parents and our PTA and our board
23 members for being here. I think with this
24 potential move exists a really unique



1 opportunity to really realize the mission and
2 the vision of our school as it's created. We
3 are an expeditionary learning school; we are a
4 dual-language school. Obviously with
5 expeditionary learning being based on outward
6 bounds, the new location with the green spaces,
7 the idea of an outdoor classroom I think is
8 something we really feel can maximize what we
9 do with regard to making learning come to life.

10 You know, coming in new this
11 year, I think there has been some tremendous
12 learnings, some tremendous growth with our
13 school. I think in taking an analysis of the
14 opportunities that are out there, I think it's
15 really going to strengthen what it is that we
16 do as a school profoundly.

17 With that, the next person who
18 would like to speak.

19 MS. CHAVERRA: Good afternoon.
20 I'm one of the parents from Academia Antonia
21 Alonso. My name is Luz Chaverra.

22 We definitely need the space.
23 Every time I go pick up my son for the
24 afternoon pick up --



1 MS. NAGOURNEY: If you could
2 speak up; the mike isn't working.

3 THE INTERPRETER: I'm sorry. She
4 said she's having problems when she goes to
5 pick up her son every afternoon because of the
6 parking situation.

7 And also, one of the things that
8 her son always tells her that he's having a
9 problem with is that there's not enough time
10 when they go to recess, not enough time when
11 they go to gym or do all their activities
12 within the school.

13 MS. CHAVERRA: I know the
14 problems that we as parents are having is we
15 have to go take the elevator to pick up the
16 kids because they're on the 6th floor. And
17 other problems that we have when we go pick up
18 the kids, when we're in front of the elevator
19 is that there's so many different people from
20 different schools in there, and everybody is
21 confused because you don't know where we're
22 going, and we don't feel safe. Thank you.

23 MS. LLEWELYN: Hi, my name is
24 Kathleen Llewelyn. My son is a first grader at



1 Academia.

2 I feel the move is very important
3 for the future not only of my son, but of the
4 school. Moving us to the Odyssey Campus I
5 believe would be the most perfect spot because
6 of the learning philosophy that the school has.

7 And also, the restrictions that
8 we are currently dealing with now with our
9 current situation, the children don't have the
10 ability to go out and run off any energy
11 whatsoever. They have a play area, but it's a
12 blacktop; it's an old parking lot. They're
13 exposed to many elements that they should not
14 be exposed to during recess.

15 I don't know what else to say. I
16 just can't imagine a more perfect, ideal spot
17 to take my son to school at. Thank you.

18 MS. RODRIGUEZ: Hi, my name is
19 Erica Rodriguez. My son, Maurice Antonio
20 Rodriguez, goes to the wonderful school.

21 It has been awesome, but I also
22 believe that he needs the green; he needs to
23 have that playground. I mean, he doesn't have
24 it in our school, and given this opportunity to



1 move to Odyssey, I think that he will like it
2 more. I mean, he likes it now, but just having
3 that, I think it will really, really help him a
4 lot.

5 Also, safety. I just don't feel
6 safe anymore in our building. There's so many
7 stuff that's happening around, that a lot of
8 parents are not aware, but I am. I work not
9 too far away from there, and there's a lot of
10 stuff that's happening. And I just don't feel
11 it's safe for my child or anybody's kids at
12 this point.

13 Also, the fact that we are with
14 other schools in the building, it's just for
15 little kids or babies, because there's six, to
16 like, eight years old, and being with the
17 grownups, I don't want to call them grownups,
18 but the older kids, it's very difficult for
19 them. Because they feel they're taking all
20 this space, they feel that they're not able to
21 do as much as the other kids. I'm kind of
22 nervous right now.

23 And another thing, too, I just
24 think that for them to be able to go to



1 Odyssey, I've seen the place on Saturday, it's
2 just a beautiful place. I think that as a
3 school, we can grow together, and I just think
4 they would be safe for our kids. And there's
5 so much stuff we can do there because we will
6 have the, I want to say the freedom. I mean,
7 as a parent, I don't believe that I'm free
8 there where we are now. We're not able to do
9 as much as we want to do. And I think if we're
10 able to move to the new place, we are able to
11 do so much for our kids, because at this young
12 age, they need so much. They need parents to
13 get involved. And one of the reasons parents
14 don't get involved now is because we're not in
15 a safe area, and parents don't want to stay
16 there after 6:00.

17 That's all I have to say. Thank
18 you.

19 MS. WILLIAMS: Hello. My name is
20 Lavette Williams. My granddaughter goes to
21 Academia. This is her first year; she is in
22 kindergarten. And we went out to see the site
23 on this past weekend, and the fact that we
24 could get there, restructure it, we could grow



1 in it, and the different schools have their own
2 site. I come from an area where the schools,
3 you went to one kind of school for this grade,
4 and one school for this grade. So it's kind of
5 different with all the schools and all the ages
6 being together.

7 The site we went out to, it was
8 perfect, how they had it set up, how they would
9 do the cafeteria, how they would move
10 everything around. It would help the children
11 grow better, understand better, and learn
12 better if they go out and get in this better
13 environment. So I really hope you all really
14 think hard on this, but it's a great
15 opportunity for our children.

16 And my granddaughter is learning
17 Spanish, and it's so beautiful to hear her in
18 the car and hearing another language and
19 knowing what it means. And if things don't
20 change, it might have to change for her, and it
21 might be for the better. So I wish you all
22 would consider coming to this new environment.
23 Thank you.

24 MS. RYAN: Hi, my name is



1 Patricia Ryan; my son is in first grade at
2 Academia Antonia Alonso.

3 I only have one concern. Each
4 day they eat lunch at 10:45. By the time they
5 get home, they're starving. If we had a
6 standalone school, they could eat at a
7 different time, and a lot of kids wouldn't come
8 home starving.

9 That's all I have; thank you.

10 MS. SUAREZ: Hi, my name is
11 Anagreh Suarez. I have two kids; one in first
12 grade, one in second grade.

13 MS. NAGOURNEY: What is the name?

14 MS. SUAREZ: Anagrah Suarez.

15 THE INTERPRETER: She says she
16 wasn't -- she marked that she wasn't going to
17 speak.

18 She said that the bathrooms in
19 our school, they are not safe; she said the
20 doors don't lock all the way. And she said her
21 kid was inside the bathroom, and as he tried to
22 pull the door to get out, he got cut right here
23 on the right side.

24 And she said the time it takes to



1 get them into the elevator, she said it's not
2 safe. And she said she said the time they take
3 to go in the transition, it just takes too much
4 time away from them that they could be doing
5 something else, you know, like learning more
6 stuff. And also she doesn't feel that the
7 school is safe at all.

8 MR. HRONSKY: Hello. My name is
9 Bob Hronsky. I'm the father of a kindergarten
10 student who is attending Academia.

11 I live in the neighborhood. I
12 have the pleasure of walking him to school
13 every morning, and often seeing the head of
14 school, Dr. Phelps, by the elevators helping
15 transition the kids to go upstairs. So clearly
16 that's not the highest and best use of his
17 time. And that's just one example of why I'm
18 here in support of the major modification.

19 I have read it, and I am in full
20 support of it. I'm happy to be here, and I'm
21 happy that the state is following this vetting
22 process and requiring charter schools to
23 prepare major modifications. I think it's a
24 good process, and I support it. I think it



1 will have a good impact on my child. And I
2 also went out, our family went out to see the
3 new proposed site, and we fully support it.

4 Having met Dr. Phelps and some
5 members of the board, I also feel that the
6 board and the management are on the right track
7 here, and they have our full support.

8 I do want to say, kind of going
9 off topic a little bit, while my main purpose
10 of being here is to support Academia, I am a
11 resident of Midtown Brandywine, which also
12 recently received a charter school called the
13 Freire Charter School. That school did not go
14 through this major modification process when it
15 changed locations. That vetting, that public
16 process did not take place. It has begun to
17 have negative impact on the quality of life for
18 me and my neighbors. I urge the state and all
19 of those who are in charge to follow the same
20 process for all the schools according to all
21 the regs and laws, and to look into whether
22 there were any laws or rights that weren't
23 followed in that process for that school.

24 But I just want to finish by



1 saying that's not the main purpose for me to be
2 here. We should shine the light on this
3 process; the charter schools are the future of
4 our schools in the city.

5 MS. ROMERO: Hello, my name is
6 Maribel Romero, and I actually have three kids
7 go to Academia Antonia Alonso. As a parent, my
8 main concern is when the kids go outside for
9 recess, the intersections that they have to
10 cross. And again, when they have the fire
11 drills and stuff like that, going down the
12 stairs, I can just imagine the kids. A lot of
13 times the teachers know these are fire drills,
14 the kids don't. They get scared, I imagine
15 stampedes, running down the stairs, a couple of
16 flight of stairs.

17 A another things is they have to
18 stand outside, another busy intersection. As a
19 parent, that's my concern, the intersection
20 around the school; I feel the kids are in
21 harm's way.

22 So I also went to go see the new
23 location, as other parents did. I liked it. I
24 kind of felt it was a little bit more secure;



1 not as much traffic. I think the only time we
2 would be worried about traffic is the kids
3 coming in or when they're being dismissed, but
4 not like they have to deal with the traffic now
5 nonstop. That's all I have; thank you.

6 MS. NAGOURNEY: Is there anyone
7 else that wishes to speak for Academia Antonia
8 Alonso? If not, this hearing is now closed; I
9 thank everyone for participating today.

10 (Hearing adjourned at 5:26 p.m.)
