Senate Bill 172

- Prior to SB172, Delaware had not reported education spending at the school building level.
- Adopted to increase school funding transparency.
- Intended to provide comparable financial data statewide, to be used in education policy-making discussions and decisions.

Since then ...

- Collaborated with the Division of Accounting, Office of Management and Budget and LEAs to standardize expenditure account codes.
 - Starting in July 2019, LEAs began using codes aligned with National Center for Educational Statistics (NCES) categories.
- Released Financial Coding Guidance.



What's next?

- Working with LEAs to standardize revenue account codes by July 2020.
 - Rebuilding financial reports to align with NCES categories.
 - Collaborating with the Division of Accounting and Open Data Portal to provide additional expenditure data.
