The State has a responsibility under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) to annually collect and examine post-school outcome data from Local Education Agencies (LEAs). See, 20 U.S.C. 1416(a)(3)(B)

The State has examined data of the number of students who left high school (exiters) from the 2012-2013 school year for Indicator 14. The data is outlined in the table below.
