

Lunch/Breakfast. Describe the plan for providing meals to students, including homeless students and others students eligible for free or reduced price meals. If the school plans to contract for meals, identify the contractor, if known, and describe the services to be provided.

(Note Passed In 2013, 14 Del. C. §506(f) states that if a child would qualify for a no- or low-cost breakfast or lunch under a federal national school breakfast or lunch program, then the charter school shall provide breakfast and lunch to the child at no or low cost to the child's family, beginning in the 2014-2015 school year. Charter schools shall not consider whether a child would qualify for no- or low-cost breakfast or lunch under a federal national school breakfast or lunch program when making enrollment decisions.)

VPS intends to participate in the National School Breakfast/Lunch Program, and will contract for meals from a qualified food service vendor. Meals will be served on-site five days each week to all students. Meals will be provided to all students, including those eligible for free/reduced meals and students who are homeless. Eligibility for free/reduced meals will be determined annually during the first week of school and in accordance with established state and federal procedures. The school leader will work with the food service vendor to ensure that all meals are consistent with state and federal guidelines and compliant with USDA regulations.
