Para to Teacher – Work in a Delaware public or charter school as a Paraeducator in year one and a teacher of record in year 2, while completing a Master's degree in Special Education. Leads to Licensure & Certification.

ARTC – Work in a Delaware public or charter school as a teacher of record in year 1, while completing coursework for a Master's degree in Special Education. Leads to Licensure & Certification.

Add-On Programs – Licensed and Certified teachers, adding a certificate in a special education area while teaching special education, must enroll in an ARTC COE program.
