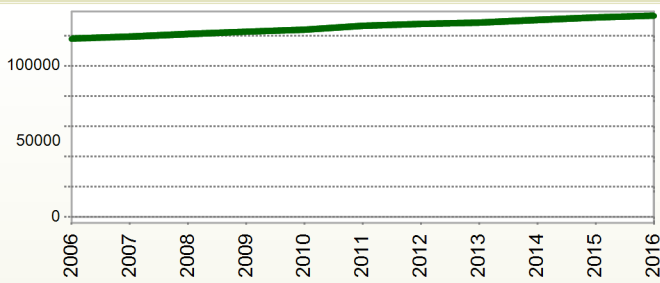

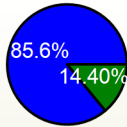

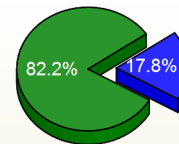

Instructional vs. Support (2015-2016)



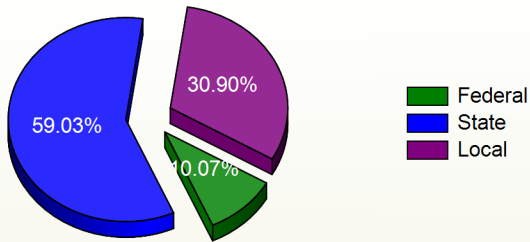

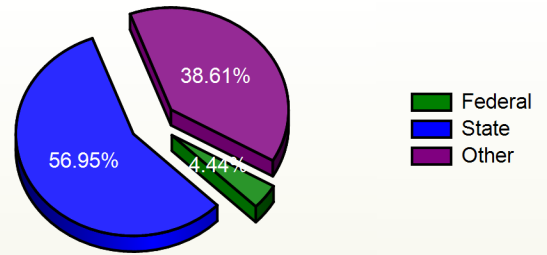

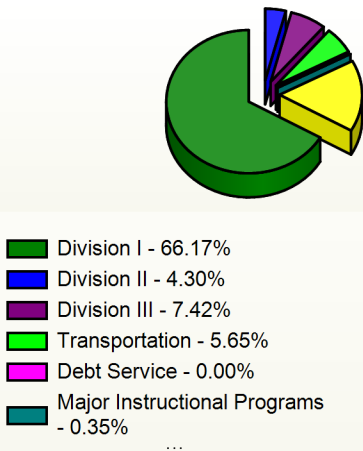
State Source of Educational Revenue (2014-2015)



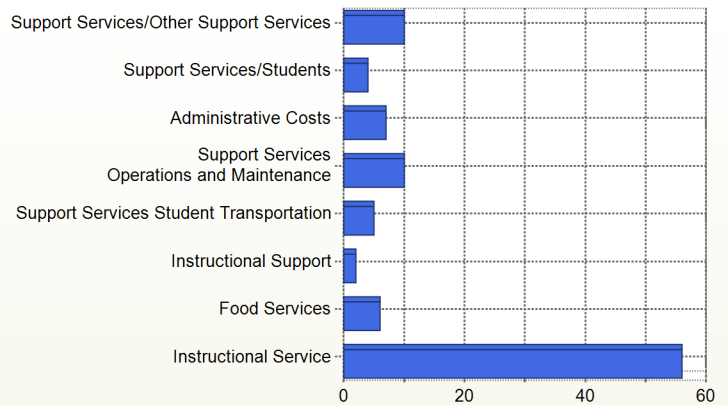
Charter Schools Source of Educational Revenue (2014-2015)
