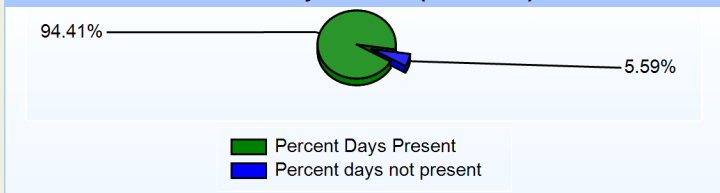

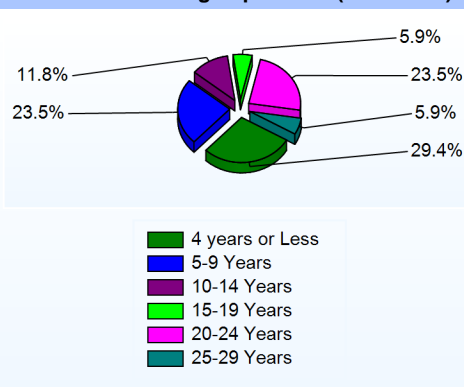

Curriculum Highlights

The goal of the ECHS @ DSU is to increase the number of students from underrepresented groups who attend and complete college degree programs. The ECHS @ DSU is the first early college high school in Delaware. Students follow an academic program of study that combines high school and college-level coursework through dual enrollment and dual credit courses to form a coherent program in which they earn a high school diploma and up to two years of college credits during their four years of high school. The key features of the ECHS @ DSU include:

- A huge cost benefit: Higher education is more accessible, affordable and attractive by bridging the gap between high school and college
- An accelerated high school education program that allows students to graduate from college in only two to three years by earning college credit during high school attendance.
- A personalized four-year plan and learning environment
- Access to Delaware State University's accomplished faculty and resourc

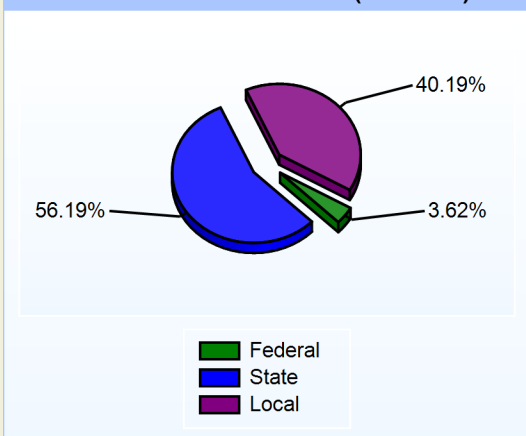

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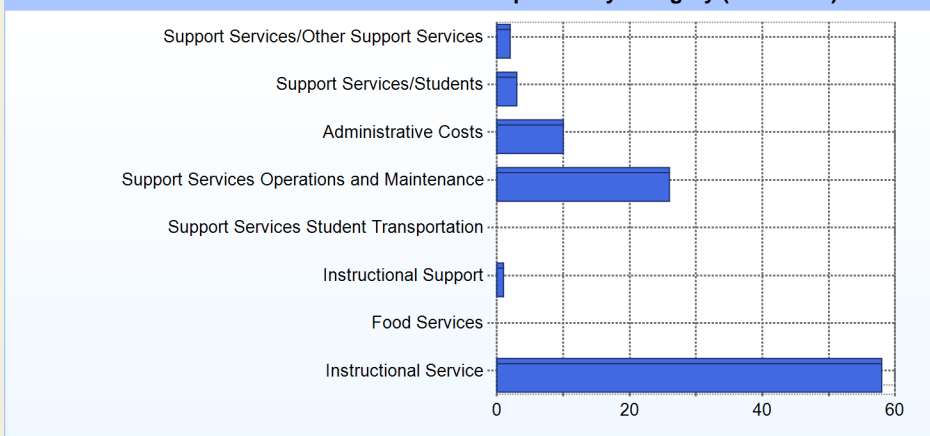

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2016-2017)

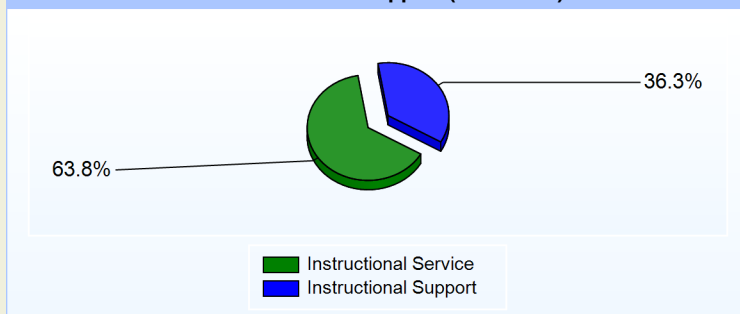
