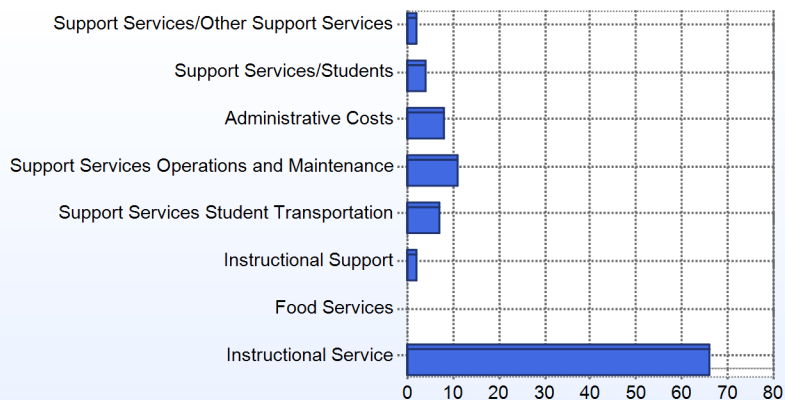

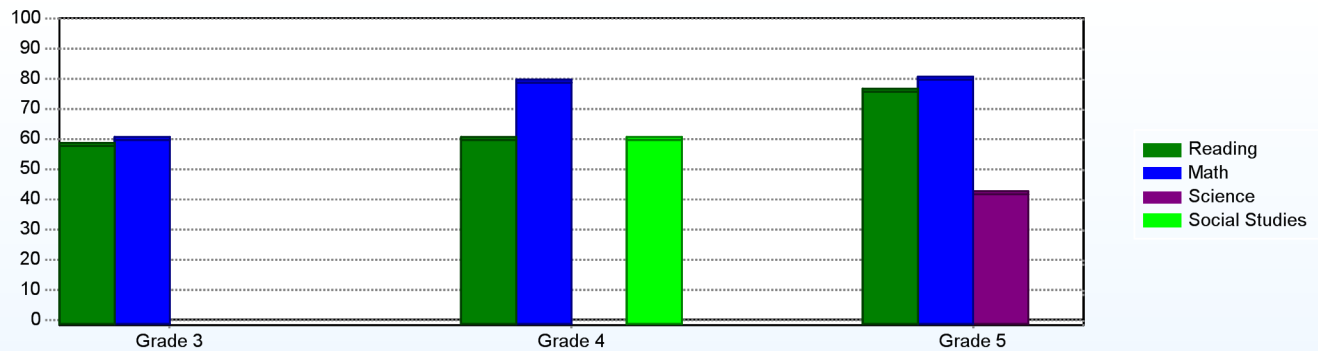

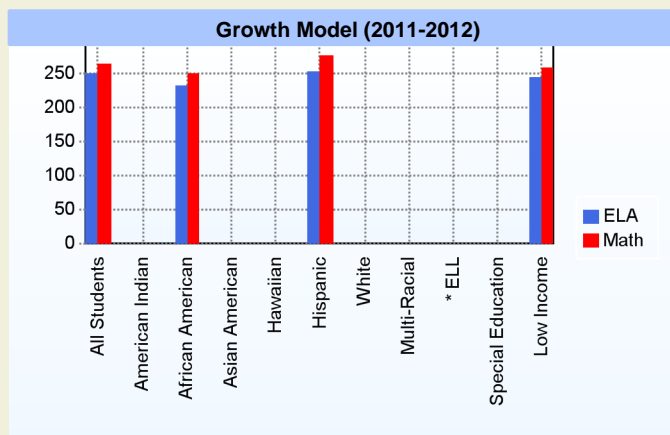
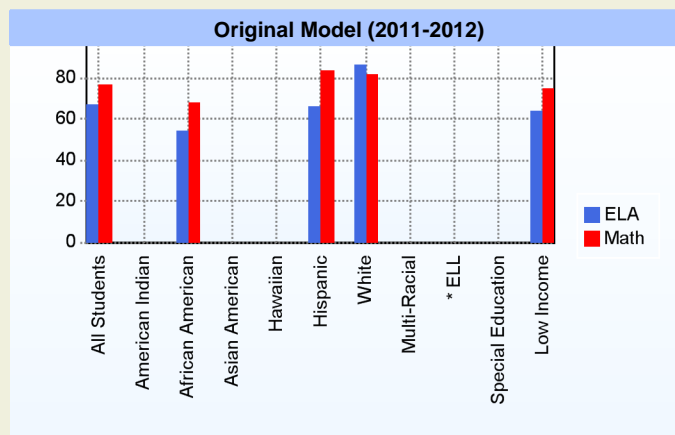


Curriculum Highlights

Brookside Elementary uses a standards-based curriculum that is aligned with current state standards (DE Recommended Curriculum) and Common Core State Standards (national). We utilize the 90 Minute ELA Block Model with a 30 minute additional targeted intervention period. The current ELA series is Houghton-Mifflin Journeys and for mathematics we are using Macmillan's Math Connects. Science utilizes the Delaware Science Coalition Smithsonian and Foss kits and Social Studies is supported by Harcourt Brace with additional Delaware units. Teachers differentiate instruction to meet the needs of our students. Field trips are curriculum related and include Junior Achievement's Biztown and Delaware's Aquatic Resource Center. Ongoing professional development focuses on literacy instruction and best practices in the classroom to increase student learning.

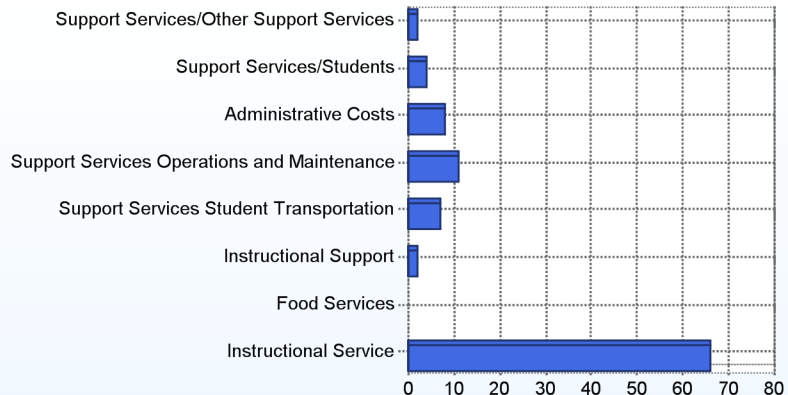

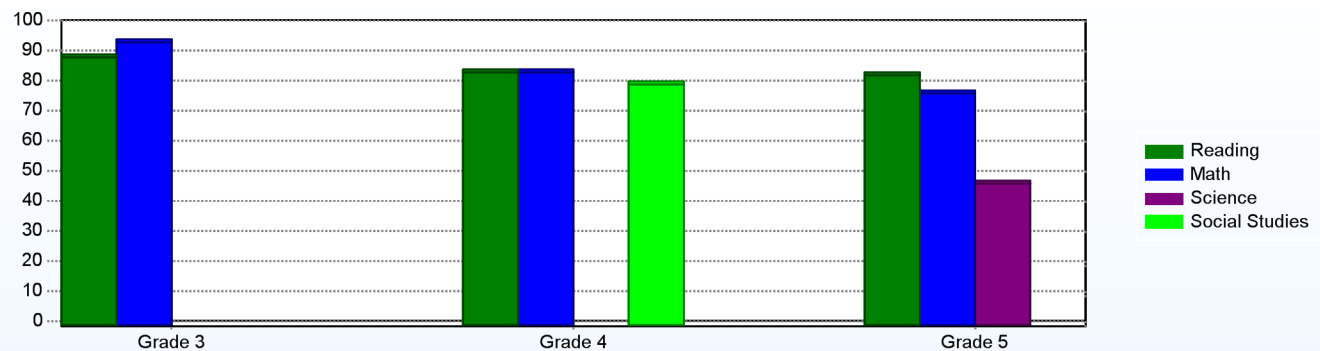

Exemplary Programs

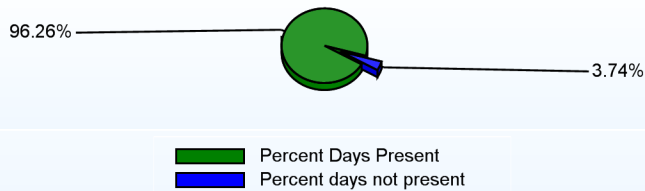
Marshall has a wide variety of exemplary programs. Students are able to receive intervention and enrichment throughout the school year. Our school administration team analyzes student data and schedules reading and math intervention to students who demonstrate an academic need, seeing some students twice a day to provide support. Teachers participate in 90 minutes of Professional Learning Communities each week to focus on student achievement and teaching strategies. Fourth and fifth grade students are able to participate in the Chorus and fifth grade students have the opportunity to receive instrumental instruction. Our talent development program works with students to extend the regular curriculum as well as compete in academic contests, including the Stock Market Club, Xcelerated Math League, and the Lego League. We offer several after school programs including Mad Science, Music IQ, and Girls on the Run to acknowledge special interest in extracurricular activities.

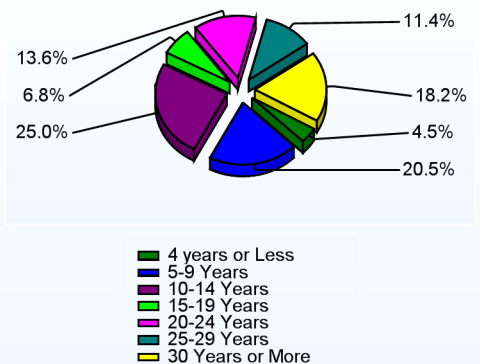

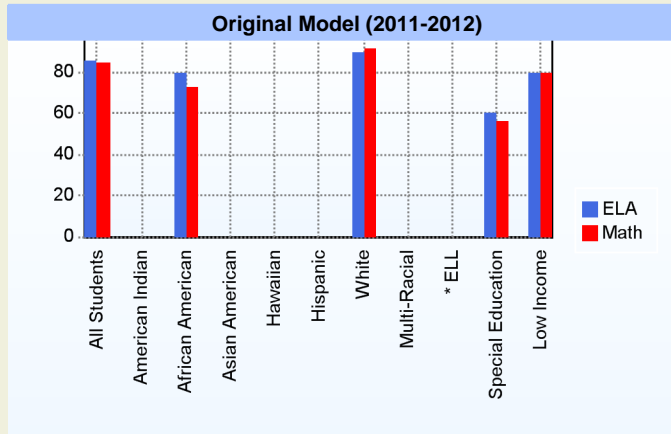


Curriculum Highlights

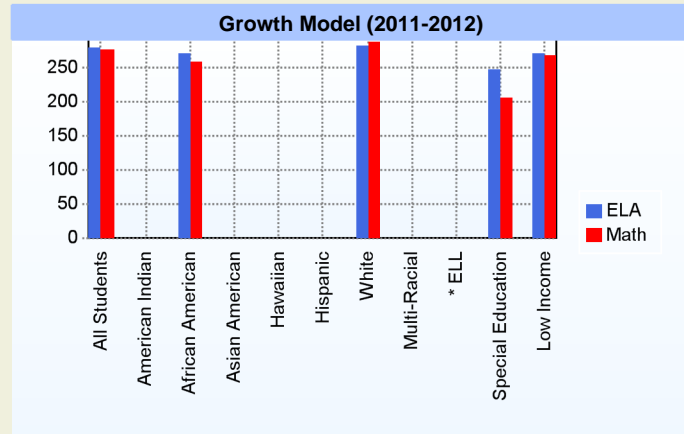
Marshall Elementary School utilizes standards based curriculum aligned with the Common Core State Standards. The core of our reading curriculum is the Houghton Mifflin literacy program "Journeys." Our writing program is grounded in the six traits of writing and encourages students to write in all content areas - especially with non-fiction text. Our math curriculum is Math Connects by McGraw Hill. Our social studies curriculum is grounded in state content standards and utilizes Harcourt Publishing materials. For science Marshall, in partnership with the Delaware Science Coalition, utilizes Smithsonian Science Kits. All of our programs encourage problem solving skills and higher order thinking through problem based learning, questioning and describing their answers in written form. Our School Improvement Plan guides our staff and their continuous work of improving student achievement and building a positive climate.

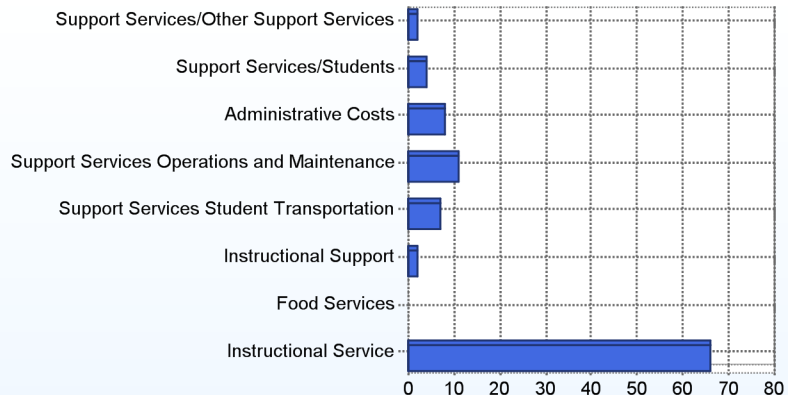

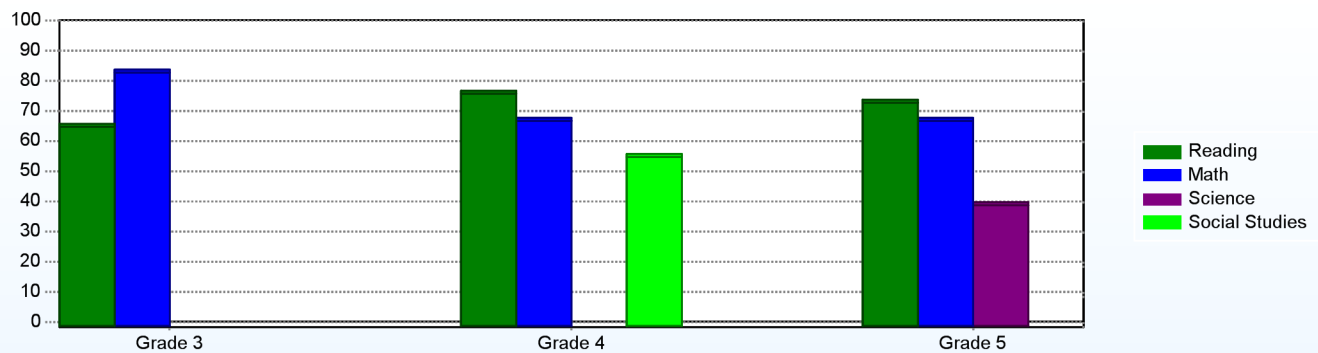

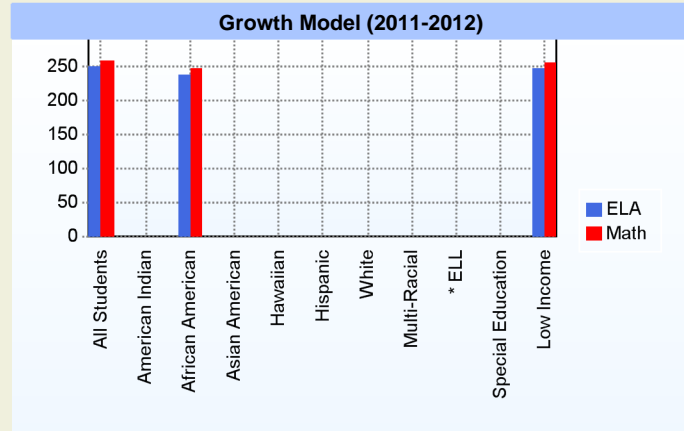
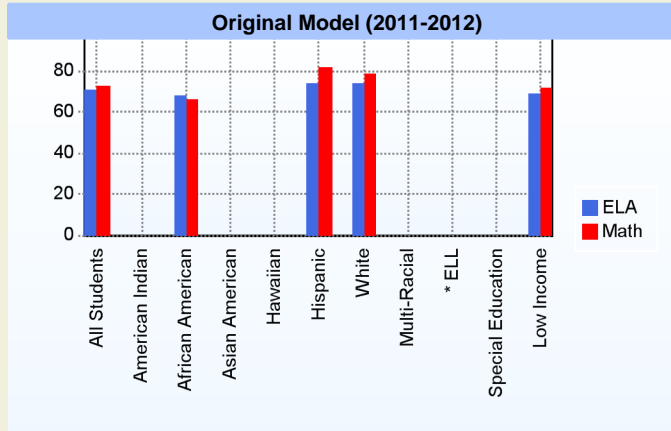


Curriculum Highlights

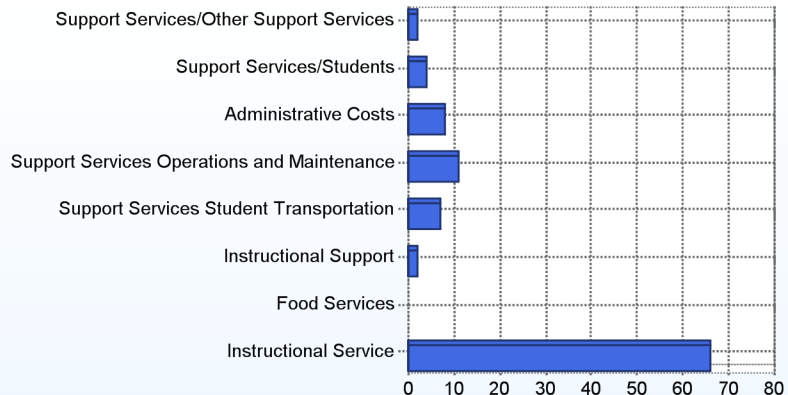

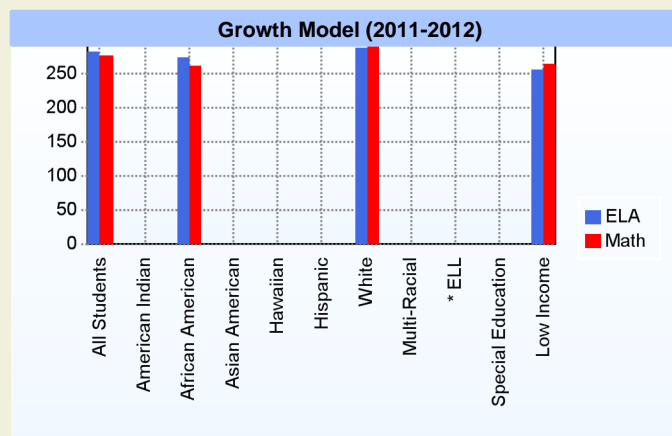
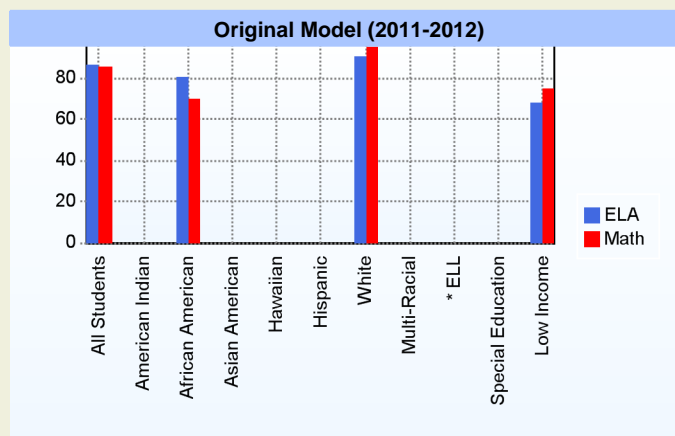


Curriculum Highlights

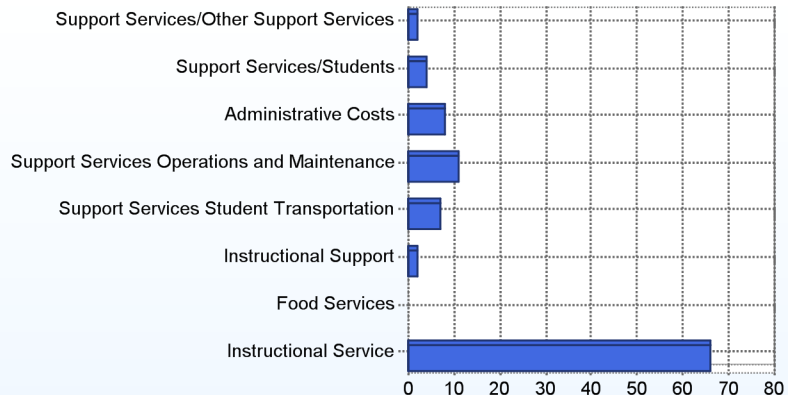

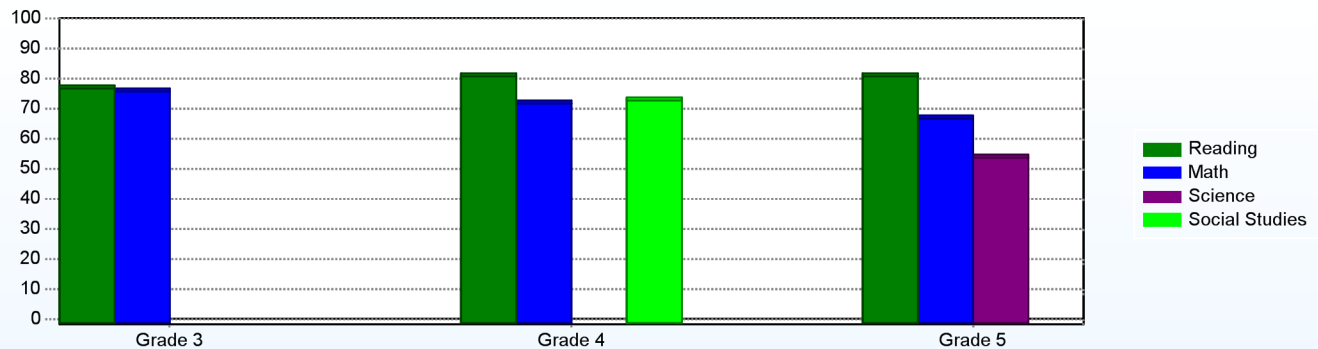

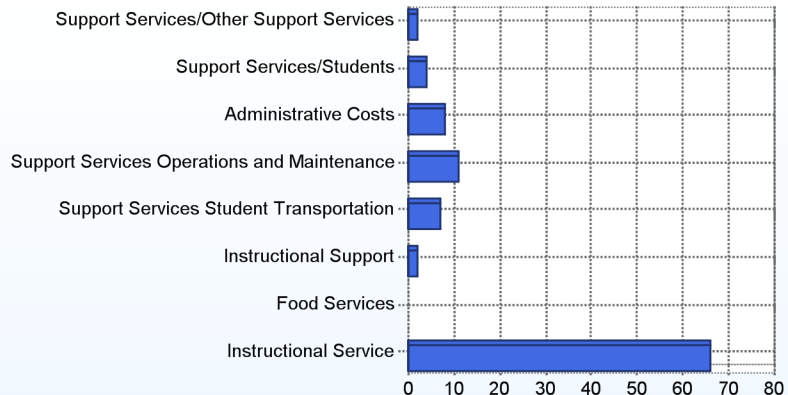

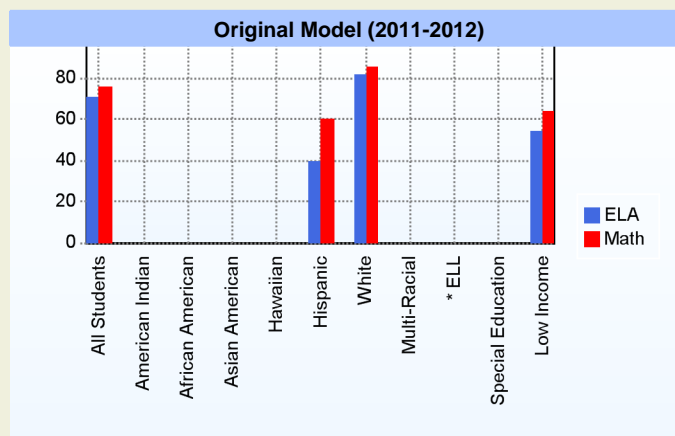


Curriculum Highlights

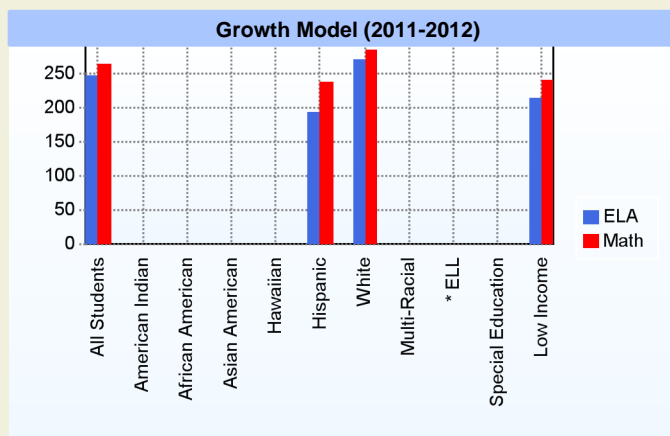
Curriculum is designed to ensure that all students meet/exceed state standards in all subject areas. Maclary staff implements a daily 90 minute literacy block offering students a diverse approach to reading and text-based writing. The use of our classroom libraries fosters a love of reading and improves student fluency. Math Connects Program is used at all grade levels. Students explore methods for problem solving; use manipulatives to facilitate understanding of numbers, number sense, and computation; communicate mathematically; and learn to relate Math to daily life. Science lessons at all grade levels are presented using the Smithsonian kits. Students at each grade level explore three or four topics extensively through experimentation. Staff teaches students a variety of graphic organizers to aid in the development of their writing skills. Comprehensive staff development and Professional Learning Communities are on-going to ensure that staff continue to use best practices.

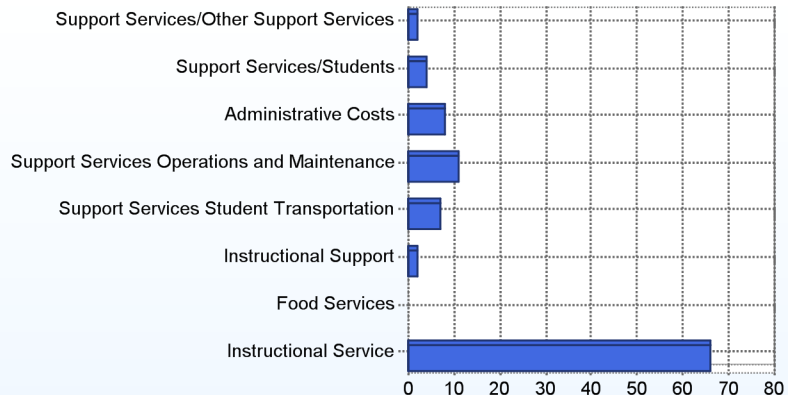

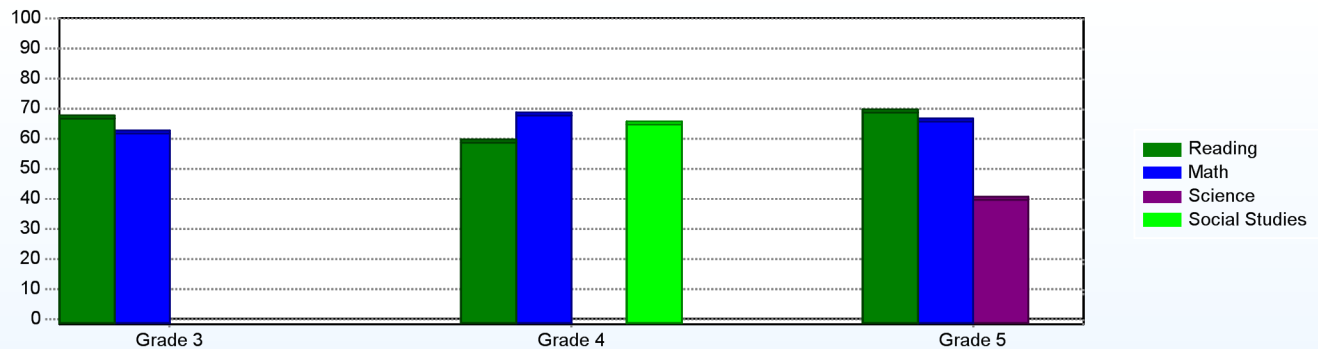

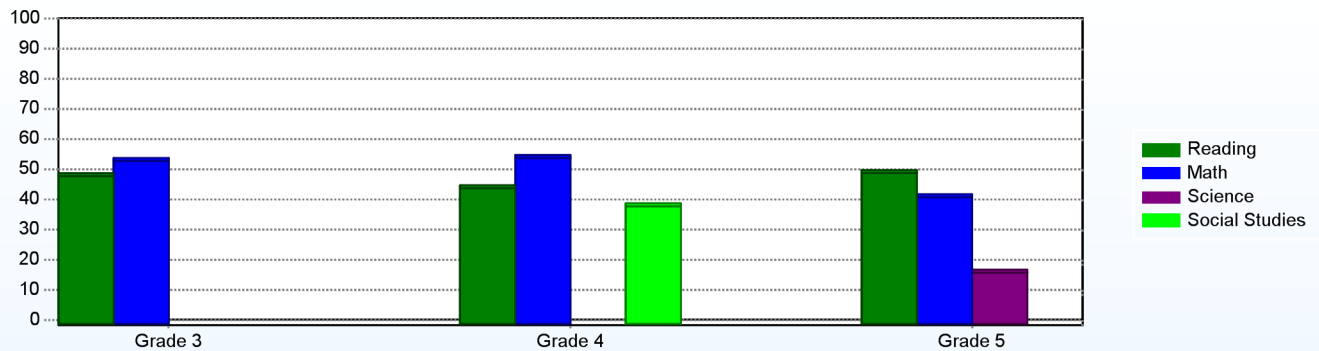

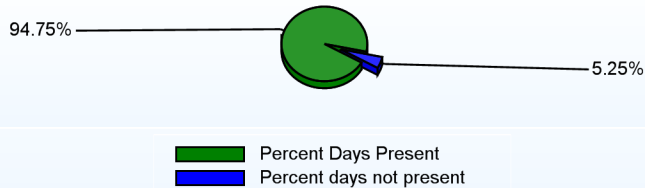

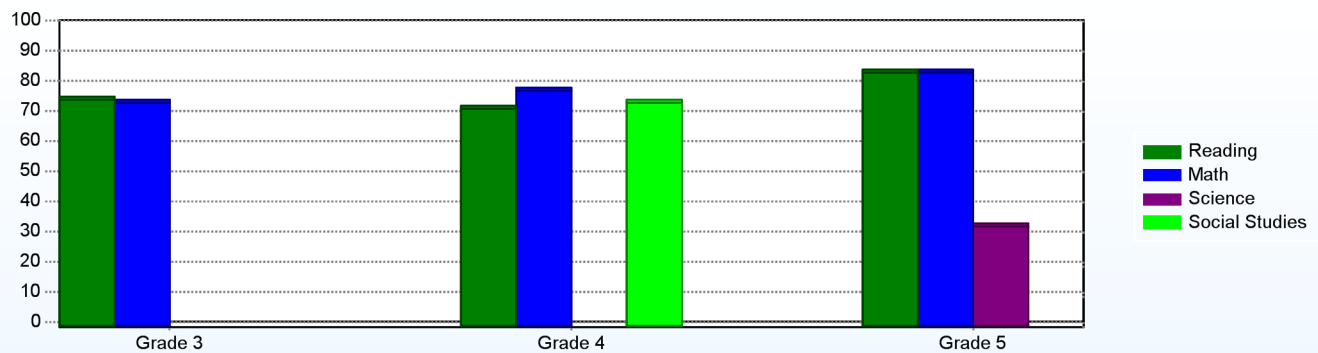

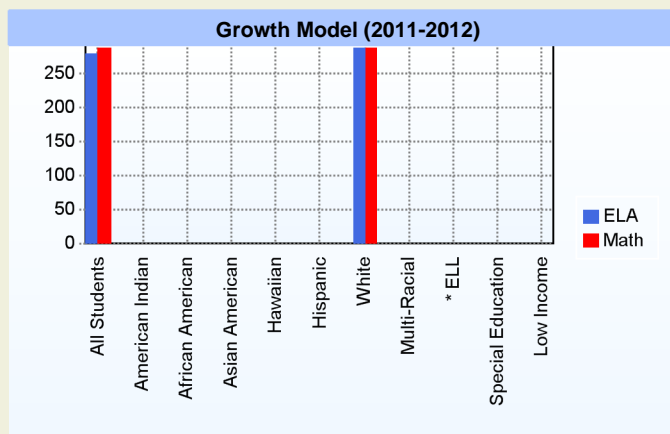
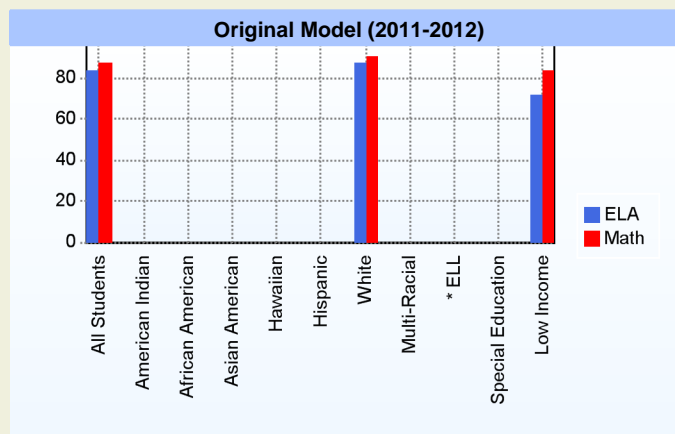
Curriculum Highlights

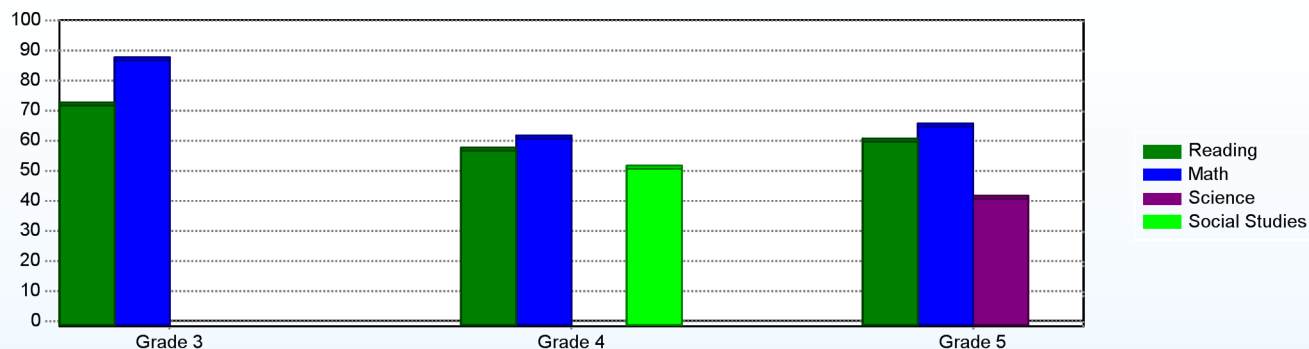

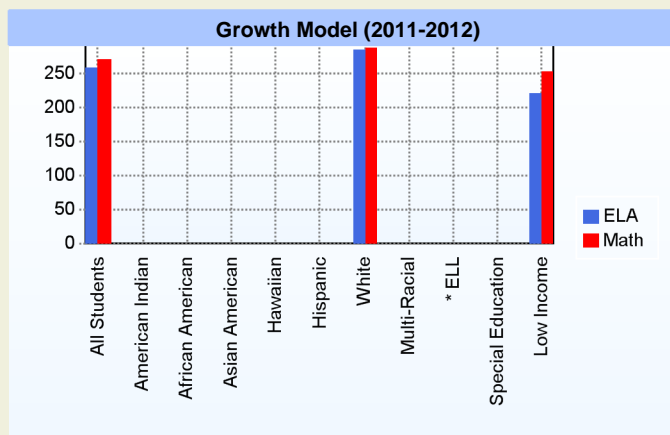
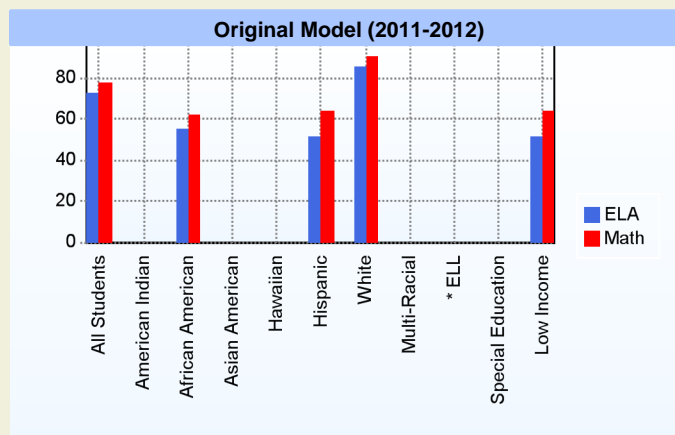


Curriculum Highlights

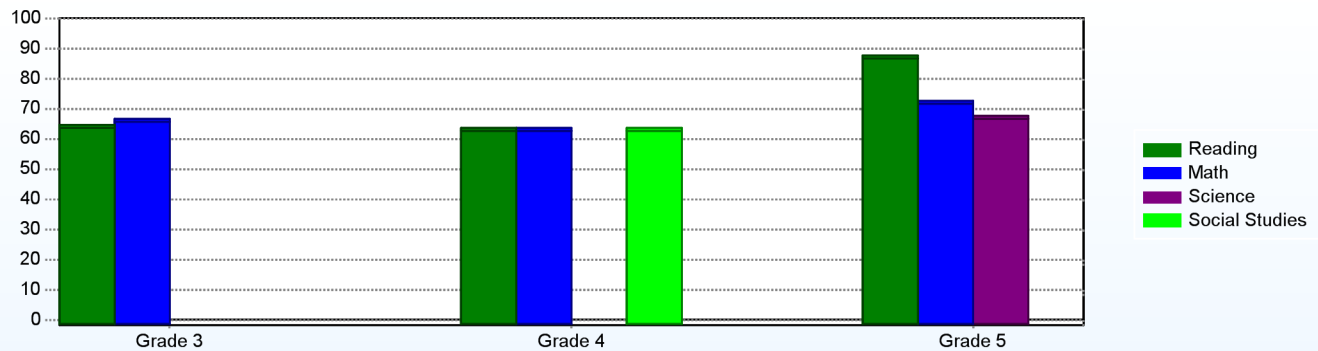

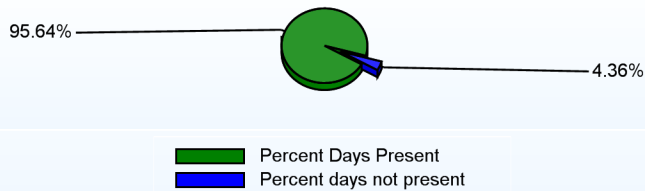
Programs currently being implemented at Brader Elementary School are directly linked to the Brader School Success Plan that is focused on student achievement. The use of a balanced literacy approach to reading instruction provides a systematic, multi-method, multilevel instructional program. The essential components of this balanced literacy program include 90 minutes of reading instruction with a whole group guided reading lesson followed by small, flexible groups focused on need and Writers' Workshop. Intervention and/or enrichment is provided to all students using some of the following programs: SOAR to Success, Quick Reads, Reading Assist strategies and Explicit Phonics Instruction. The use of best practices for math education includes using multiple methods for problem solving, using manipulatives, operations and computation. Math Connects, a standards-based math program, is utilized across grade levels. Smithsonian kits are used in classrooms for science instruction.

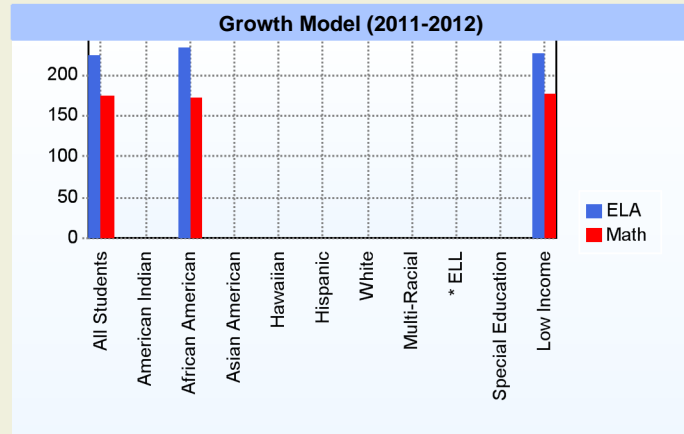
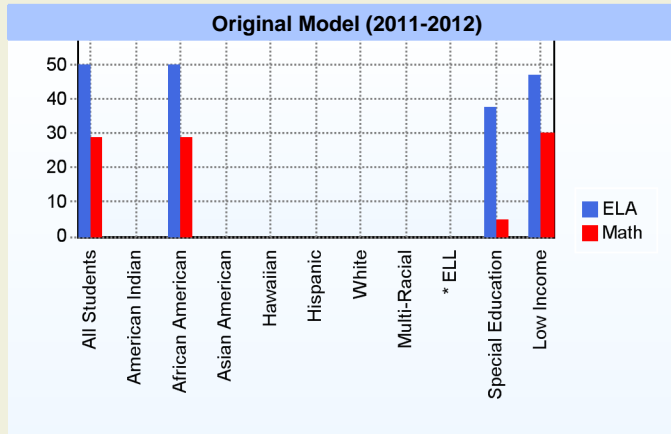


Curriculum Highlights

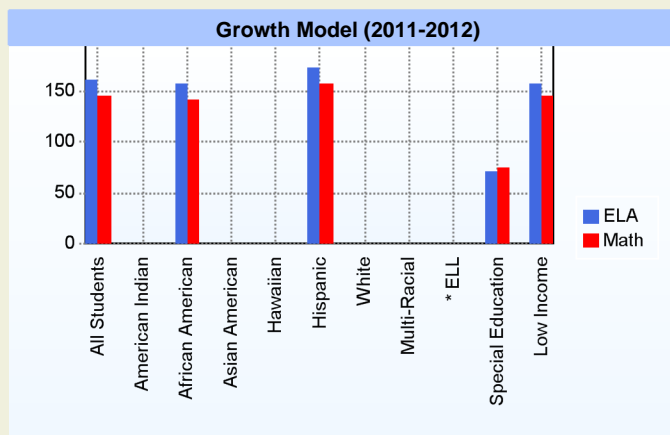
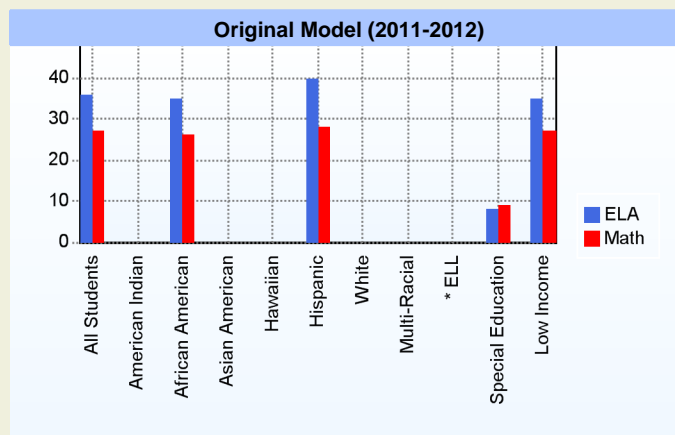


Curriculum Highlights

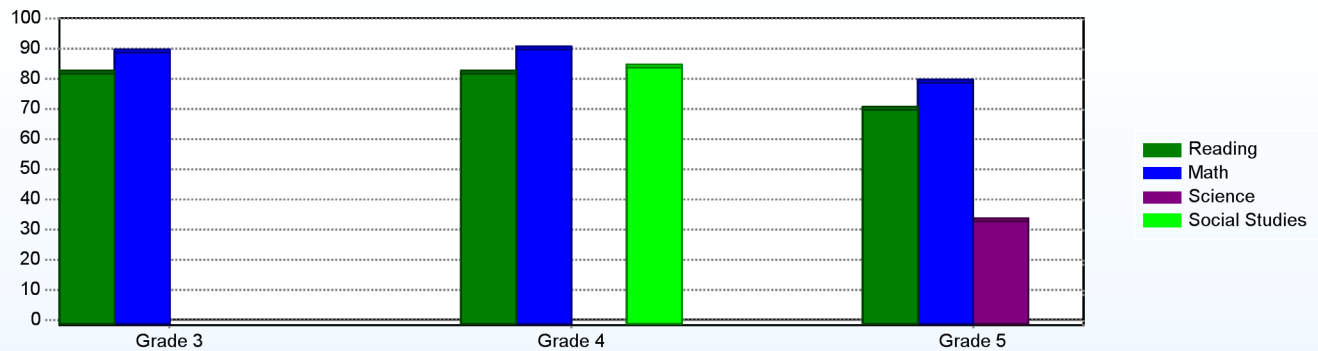

At Elbert-Palmer we are proud to be the "Peacocks". Elbert-Palmer offers many programs to build and strengthen our students' abilities to learn. We offer a music program of instrumental band and strings, enrichment services for high achieving students, extra support for reading during an intervention block, counseling services (including a Family Crisis Therapist), after school academic and stepping programs, and a Positive Behavior Support Program. 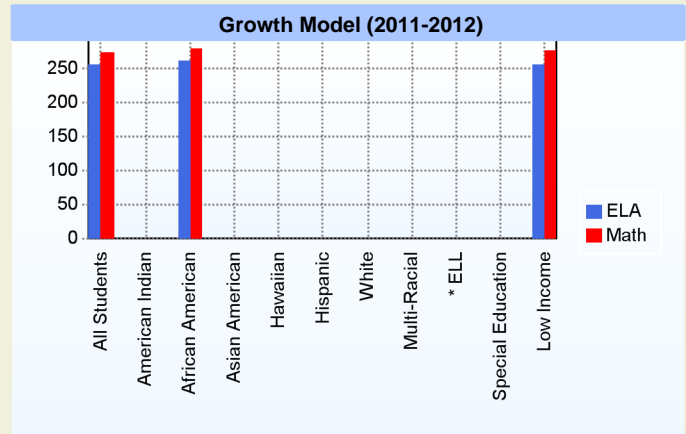
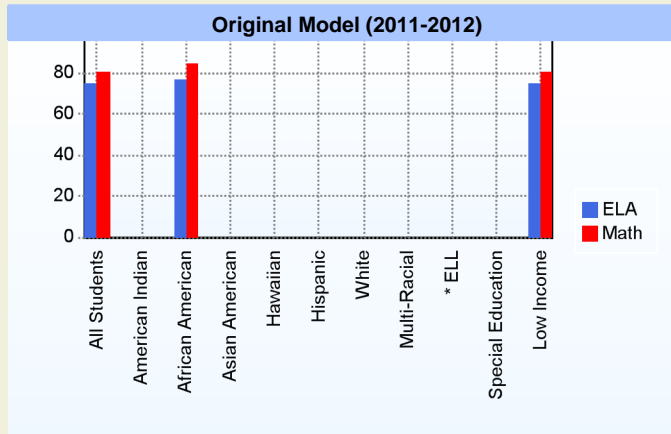


Curriculum Highlights

At Elbert-Palmer our reading is guided by the Reading First Framework which combines whole group instruction with small group needs based instruction daily for at least ninety minutes. Students participate in an additional intervention block daily, where students receive extra support or enrichment in reading. The Accelerated Reader Program, which is a reading incentive program, is available to students in grades three through five. In math our students spend sixty minutes daily in the Math Trailblazers Program which focuses on problem solving through multiple approaches. Selected students have participated in the Math 24 District Challenge each year. Our students also benefit from the availability of a computer lab in the building. Our school has a partnership with the Delaware Nature Society which provides in and out of school experiences related to science standards.

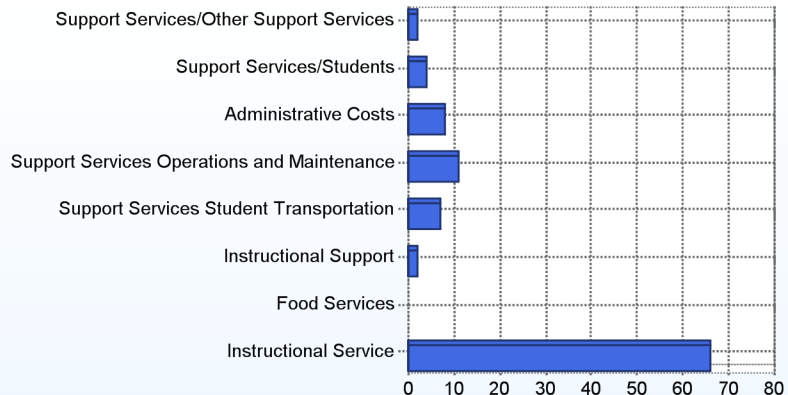

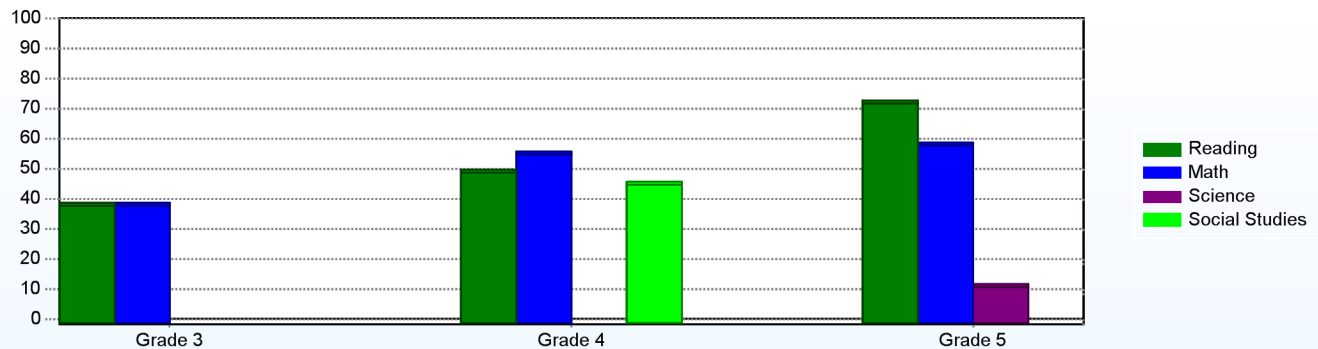

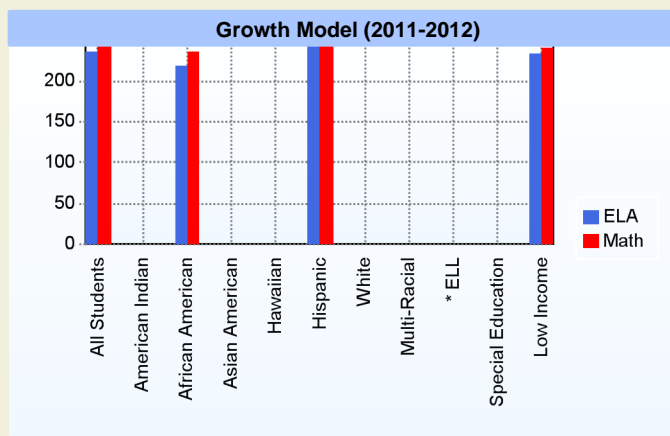
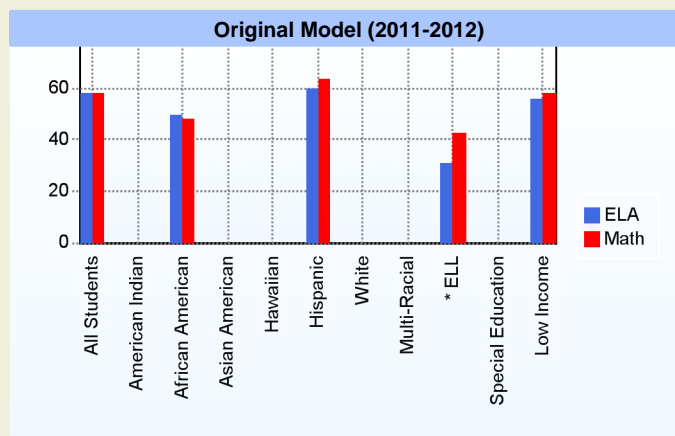


Curriculum Highlights

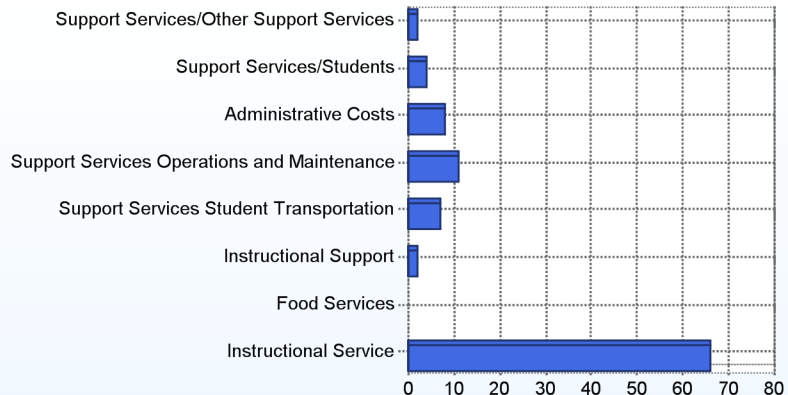

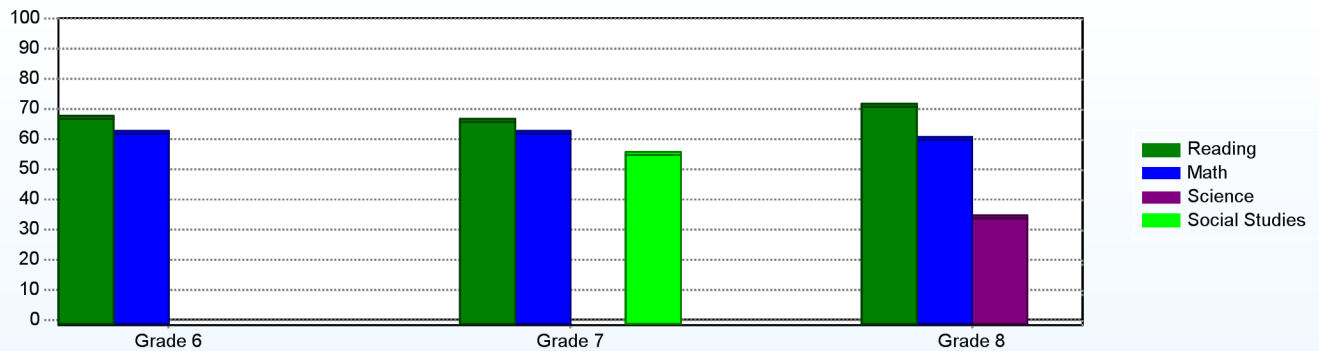

Years of Teaching Experience (2011-2012)



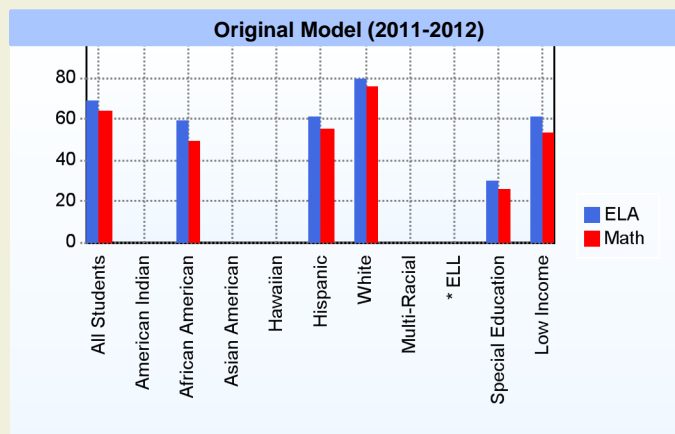
Curriculum Highlights

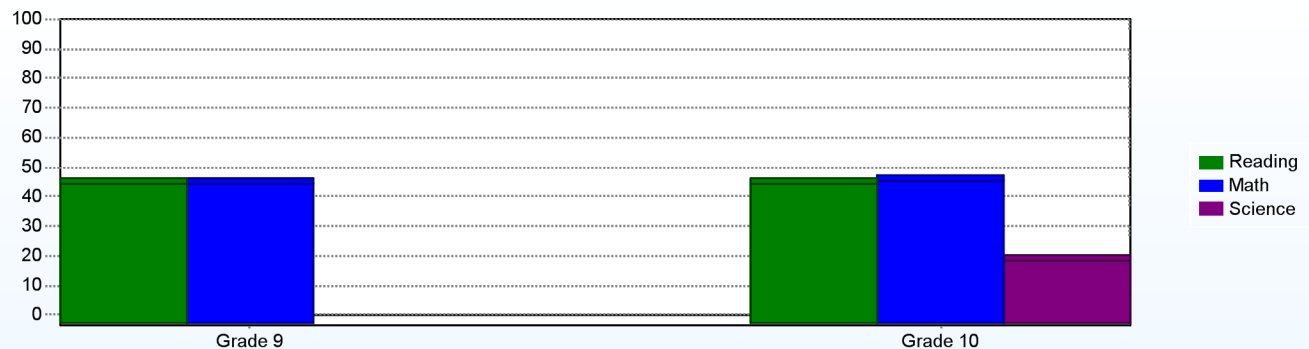

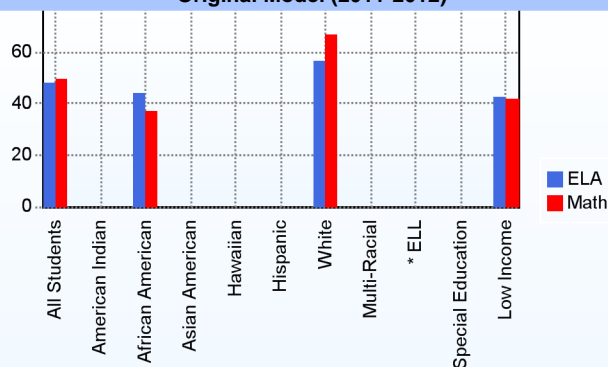

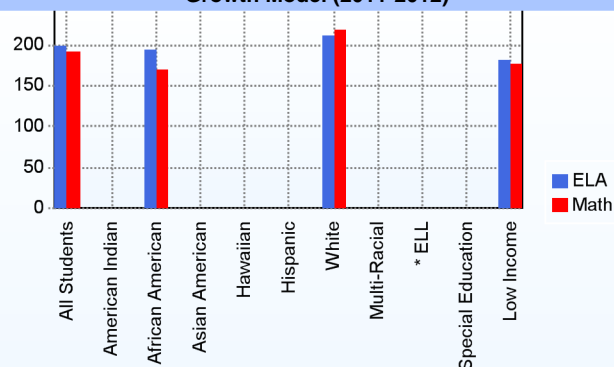

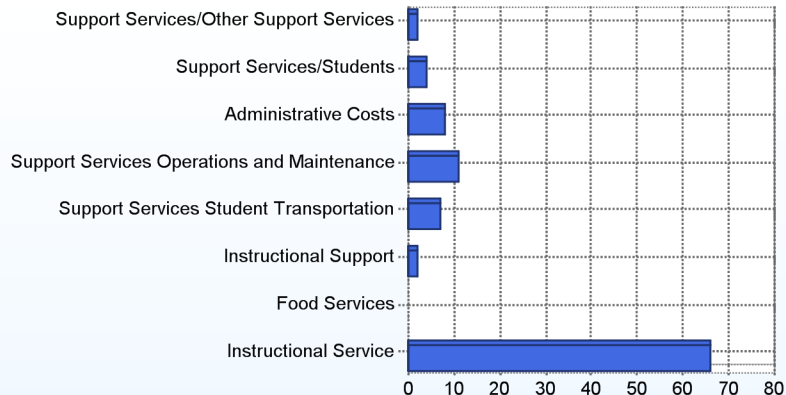

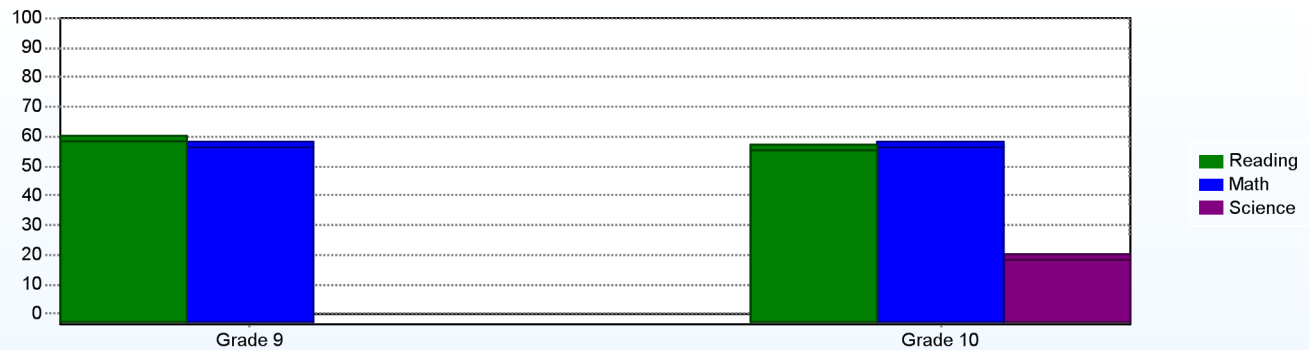

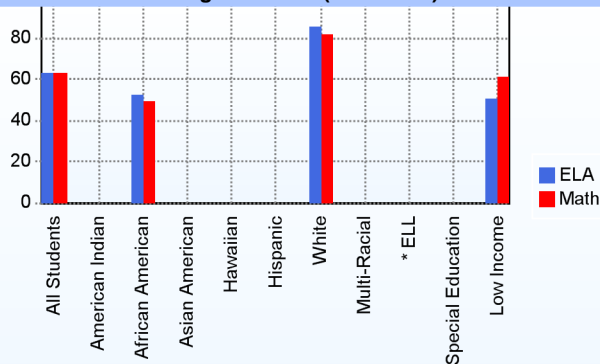

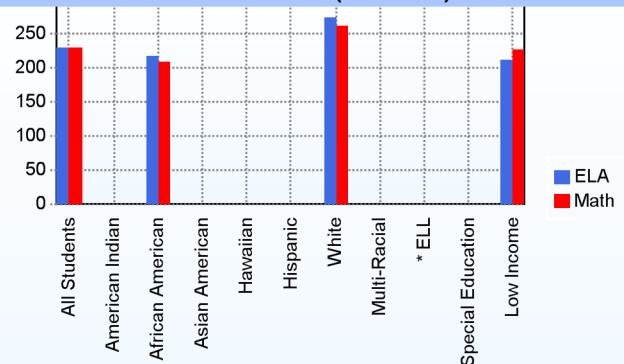

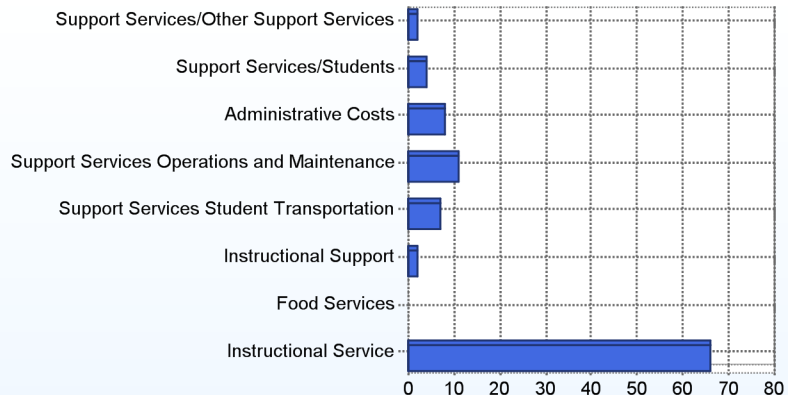

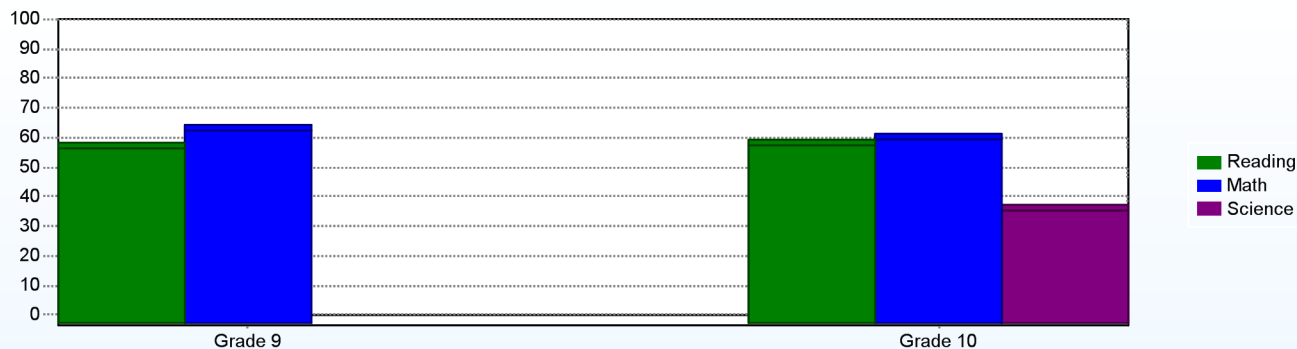

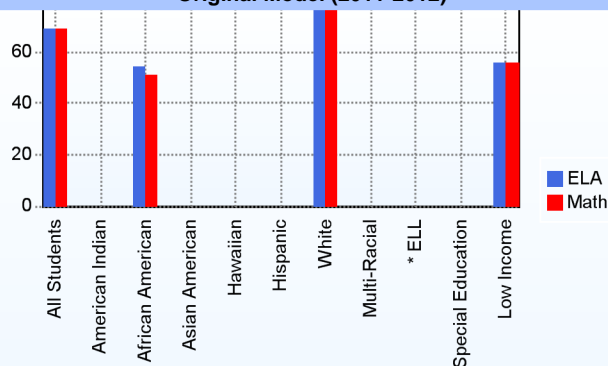

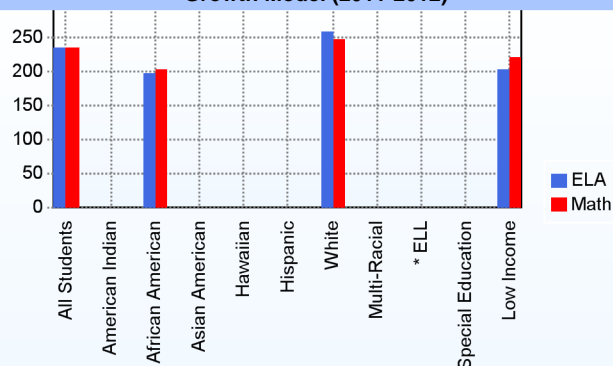

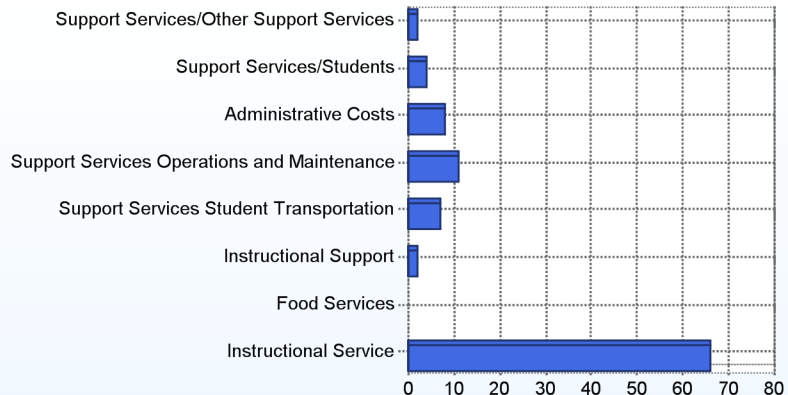

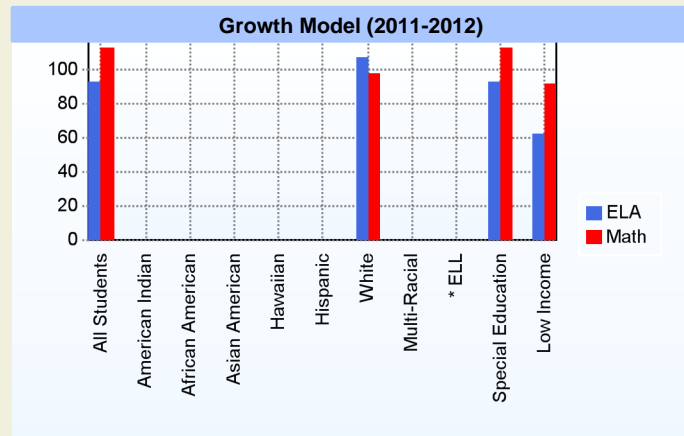
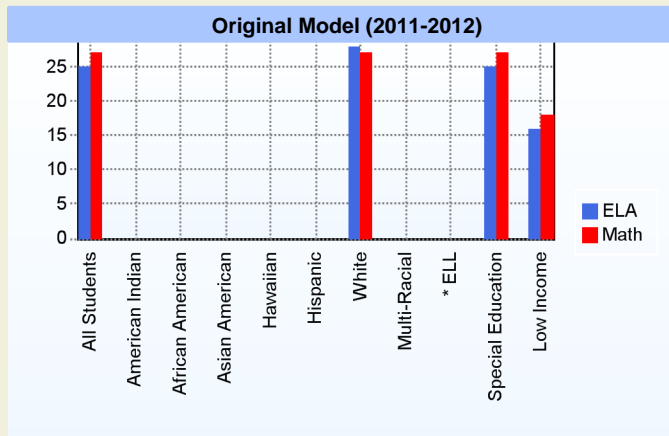


Curriculum Highlights

All students in Brennen School programs, regardless of educational placement, have an Individual Education Program developed by a multidisciplinary team and designed to meet the student's needs to enable him or her to be involved in and make progress in the general education curriculum. A comprehensive array of educational placements is available to meet our students' needs. The Brennen School itself serves students with the need for an educational placement of "separate school" and a curriculum focusing on the development of functional life skills with educational goals that are derived from the Delaware Recommended Curriculum but do not lead to a High School diploma. Students who need less restrictive education placements are served in a variety of general education schools within the Christina School District. The 12-month program follows the Christina School District calendar for the regular school year and a modified school calendar during the summer months.

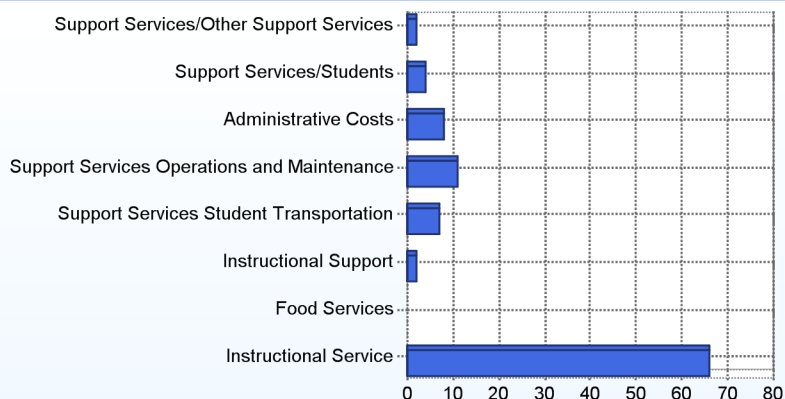

Curriculum Highlights

At DSD, the Four Blocks framework is our guiding force in instructional planning. It truly incorporates "best practice" methods that have been identified by leaders in Deaf Education. We support our students in their goals as they work from more teacher support to independence in ASL/Signacy (signing/viewing), print English/Literacy (reading/writing) as well as spoken English/Oracy (speaking/listening). Learning across curricular areas occurs at all grade levels at DSD. Through an emphasis on application of skills and pragmatic language, our students utilize their literacy skills when acquiring new information in Science, Math, Social Studies, etc. Moreover, many of our staff plan thematic units in various content areas that tie-in the learning for our students. Third, experiential learning is valued at the Delaware School for the Deaf and Statewide Programs via opportunities presented for students to utilize skills in "real world" environments.

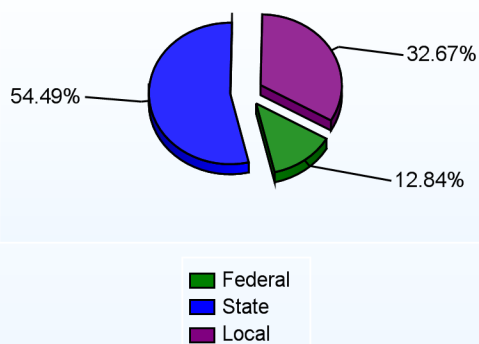
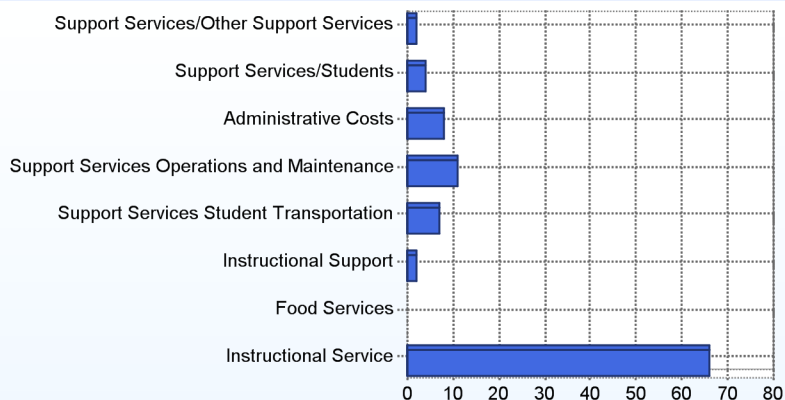
