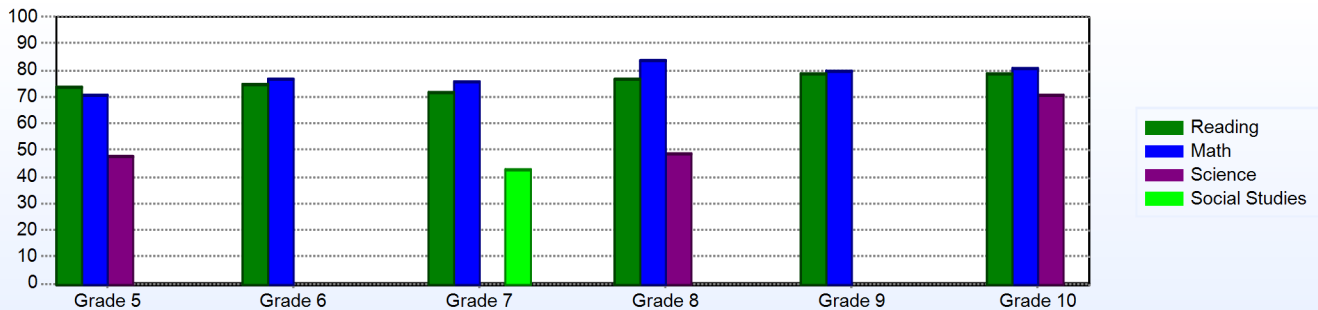

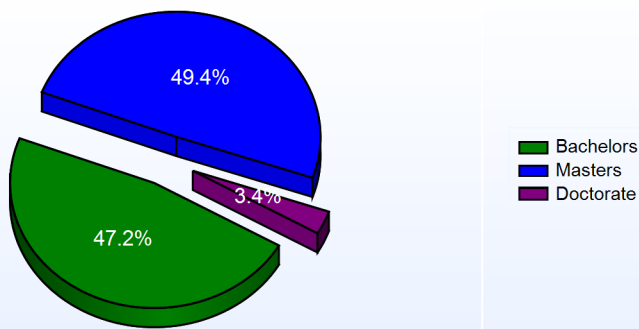

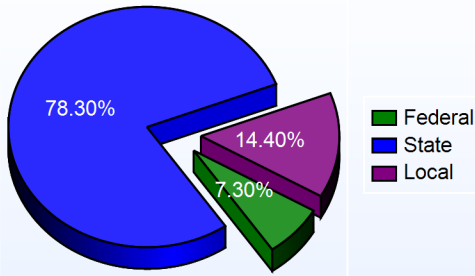

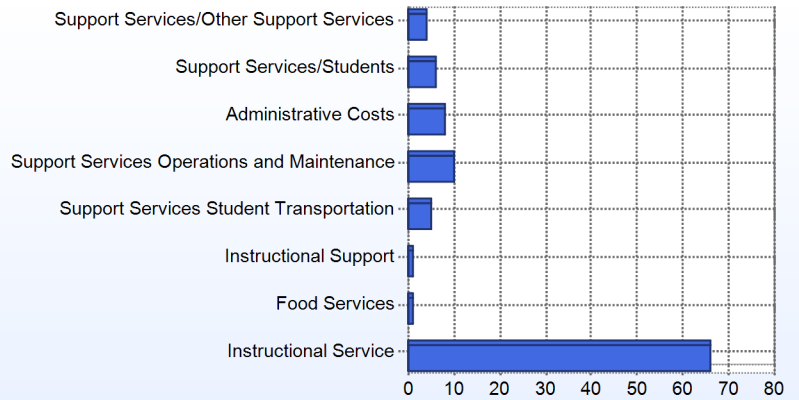

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category

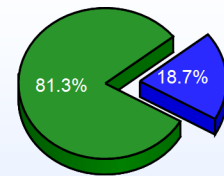

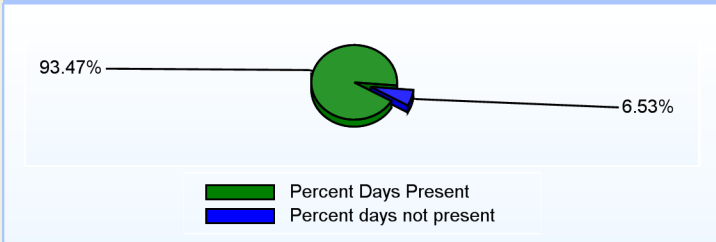

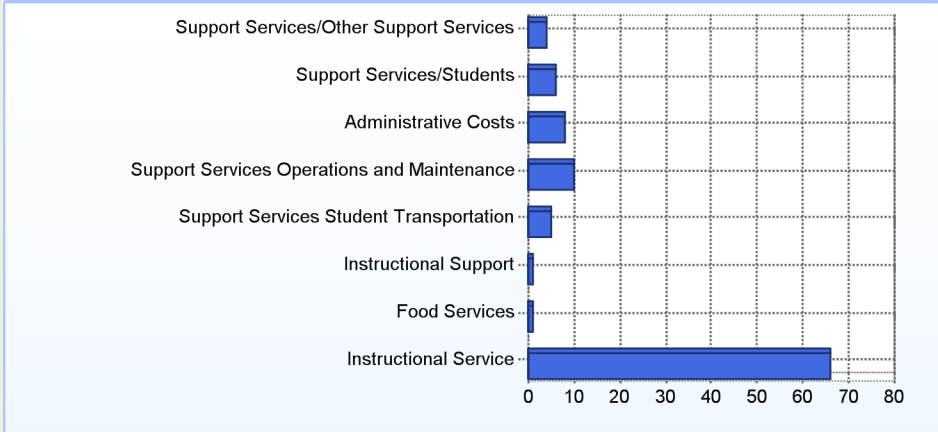

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2010-2011)

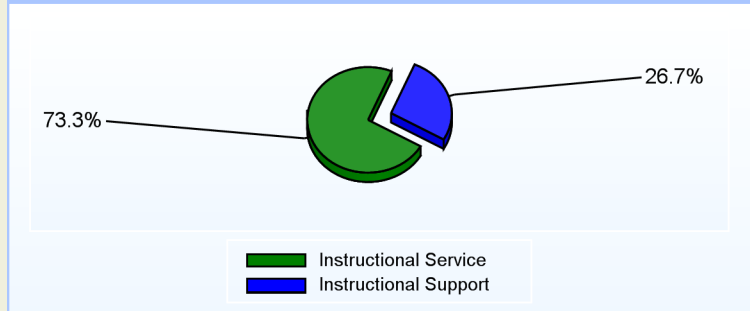

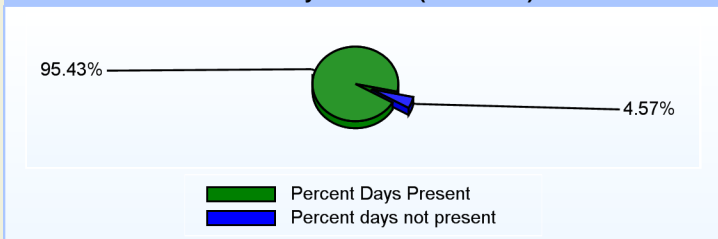

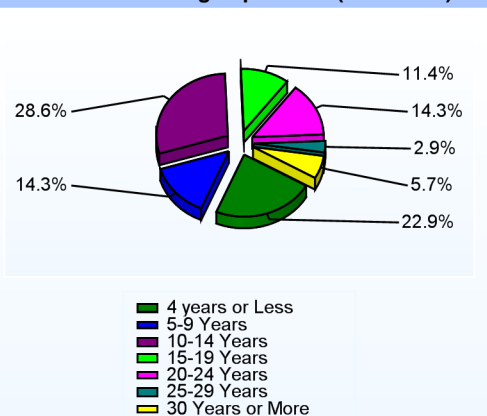

Curriculum Highlights

The Delmar School District continually strives to achieve top performance from their students. The administration and staff are always looking for ways to increase student achievement in the classroom and on the DSTP. Recent changes include a modified block schedule for English and Language Arts classes which allow for more instructional time in smaller classes and the implementation of an eight-period day to reduce class sizes. The district also provides academic assistance to lower performing students in an effort to increase their class grades and DSTP scores. The Wildcat Literacy Club was established to assist students in meeting standards covered in the Delaware testing program and to develop a passion for reading. It has become one of the most popular middle school clubs available to students.

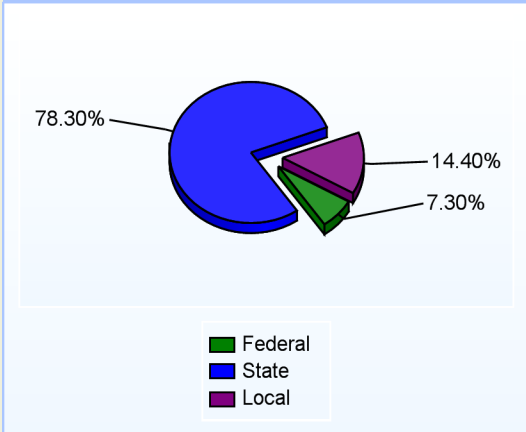

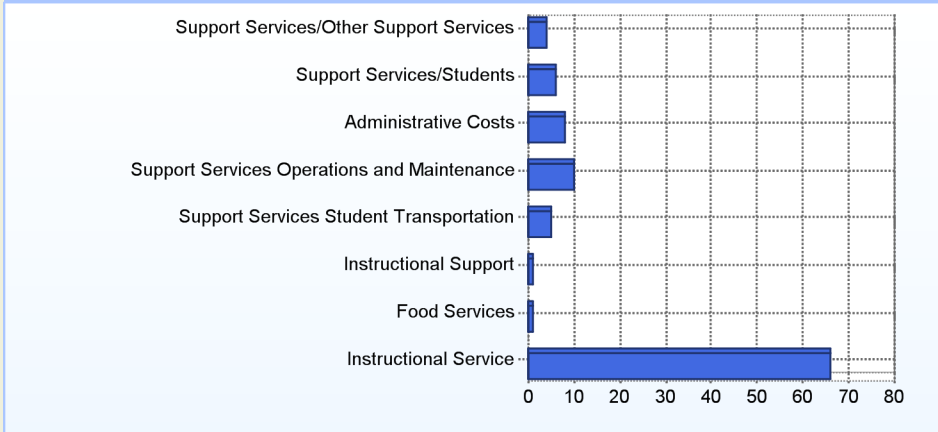

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2010-2011)

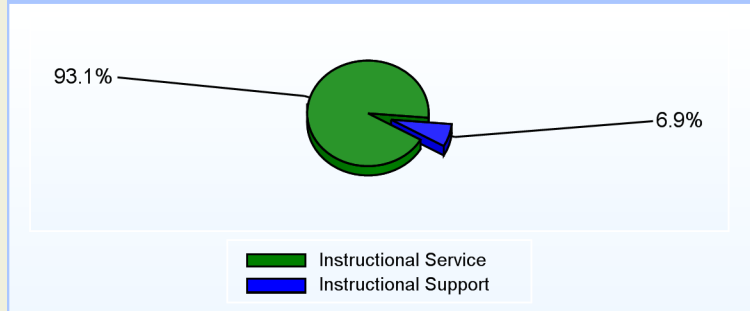
