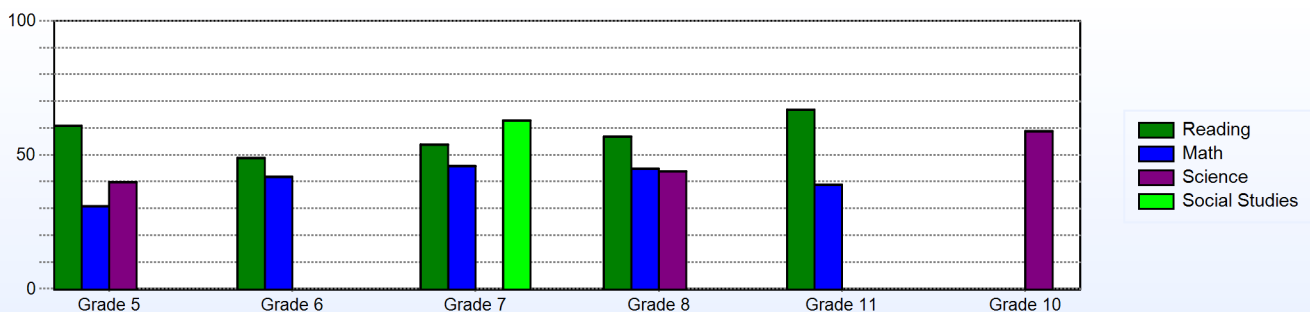

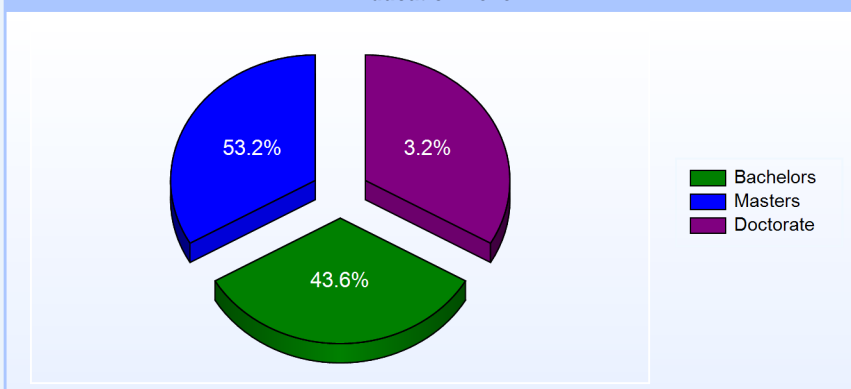

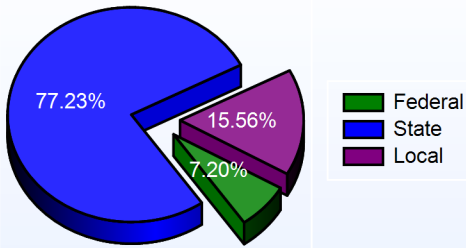

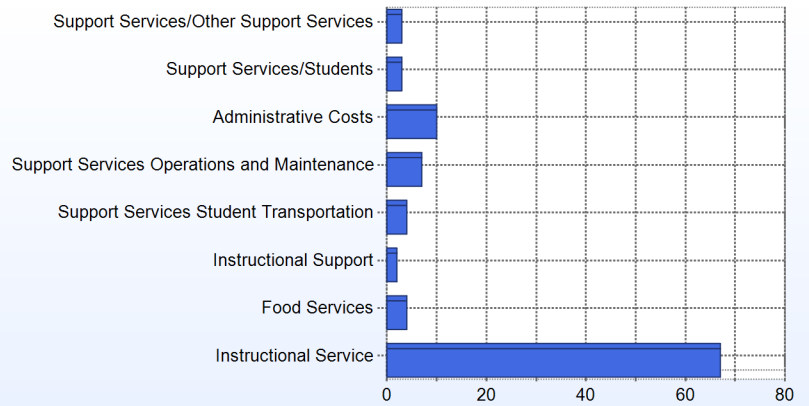

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category

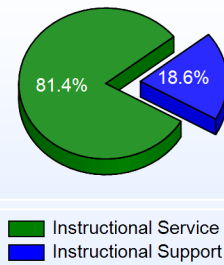

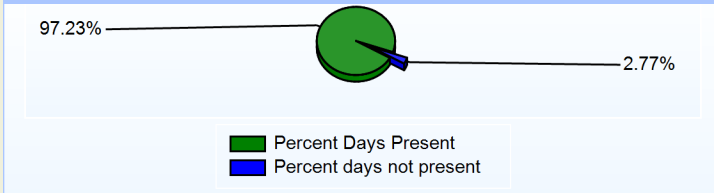

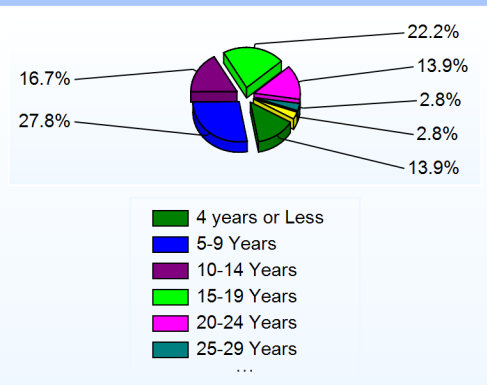

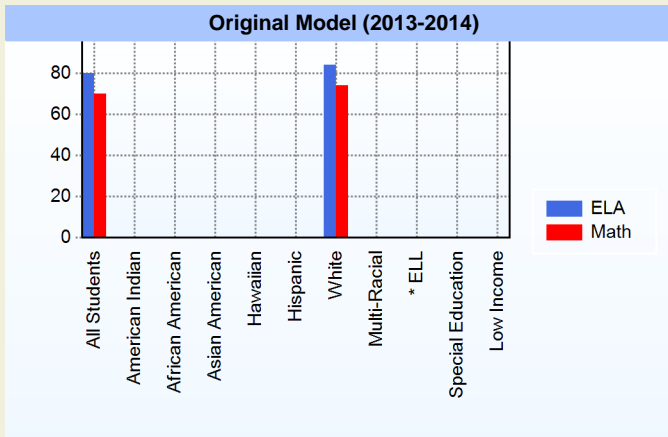

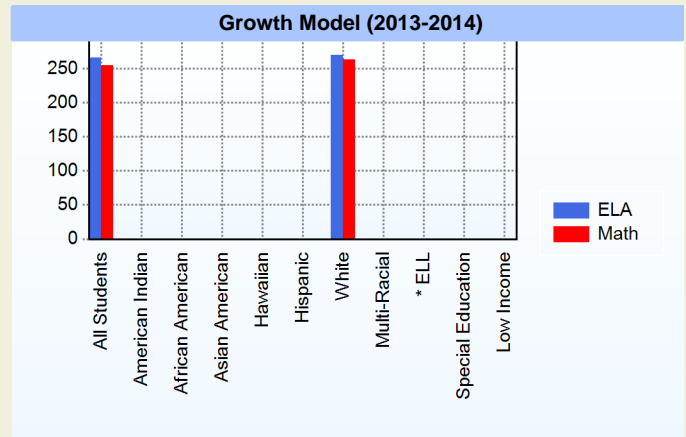

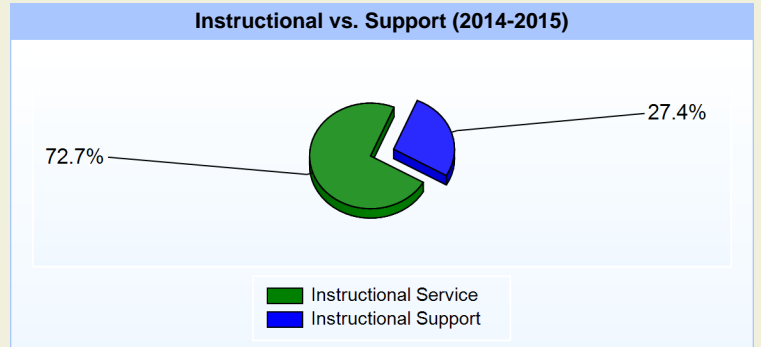
Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2013-2014)

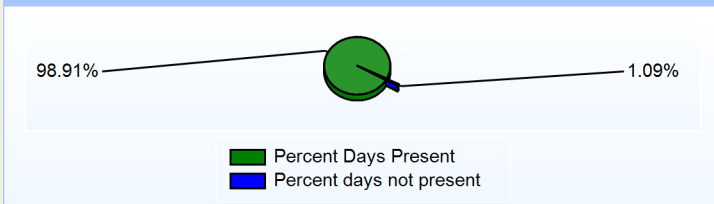

Curriculum Highlights

The Delmar School District continually strives to achieve top performance from their students. The administration and staff are always looking for ways to increase student achievement through the use of Learning Focused Strategies to engage students in higher order thinking as our instructional staff integrates Common Core Standards in the classroom. One measure of students' academic achievement is through performance on the DCAS (Science / Social Studies) or the Smarter Balanced Assessment (English/Language Arts & Mathematics). Our modified block schedule for English and Language Arts classes allow for more instructional time in smaller classes. The district also provides academic assistance through tutoring, double-dosing classes, Learning Lab, and RTI (Response to Intervention) classes.

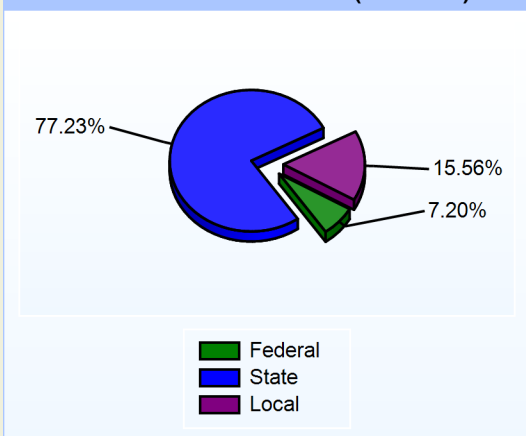

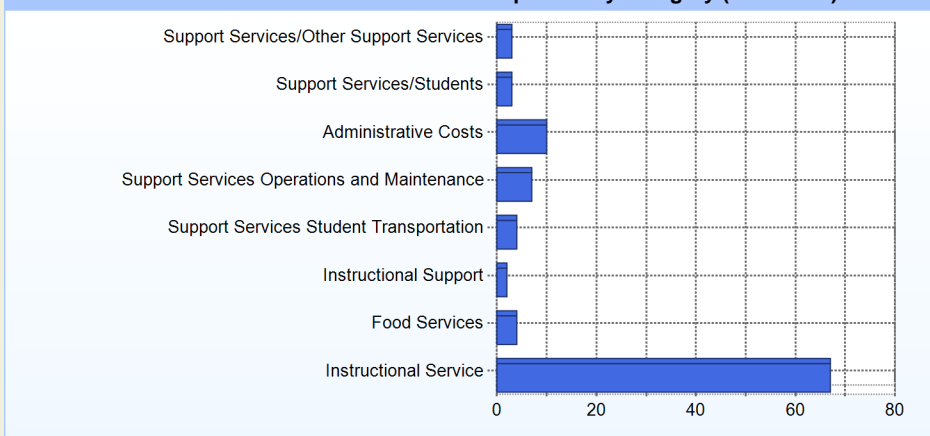

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2013-2014)

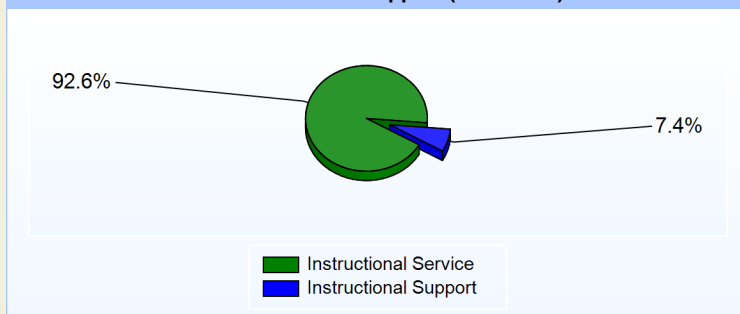
