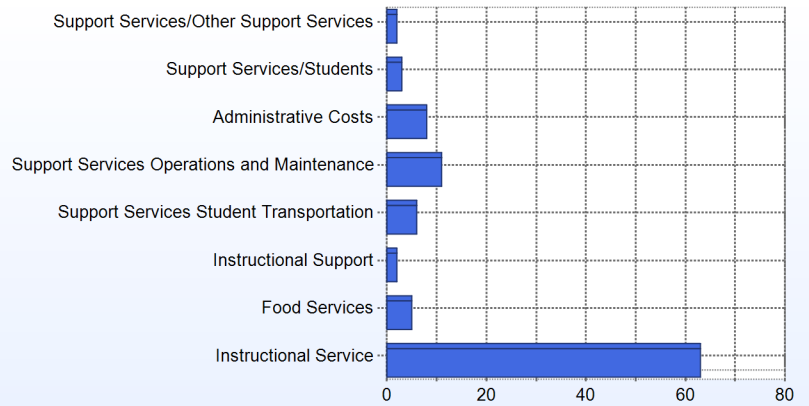

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category

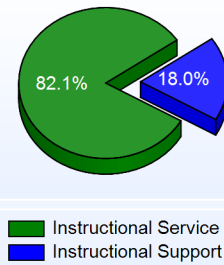

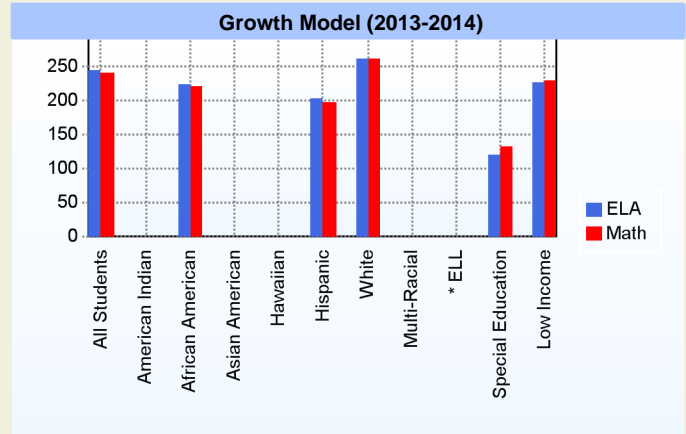
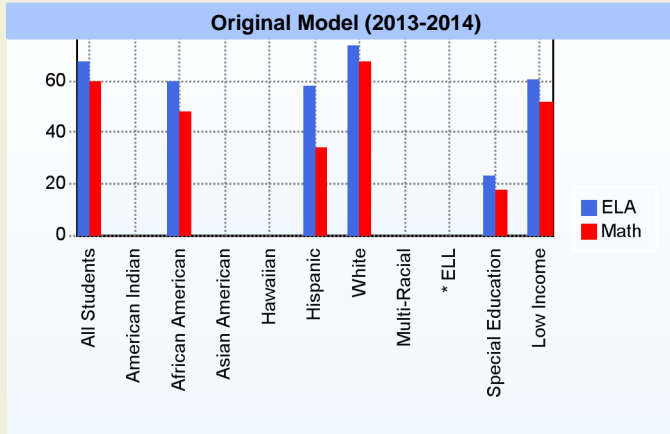


Curriculum Highlights

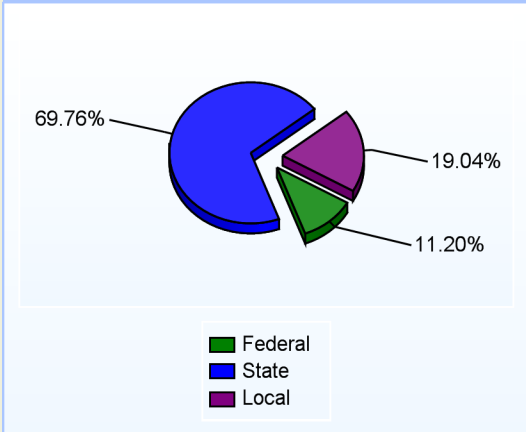

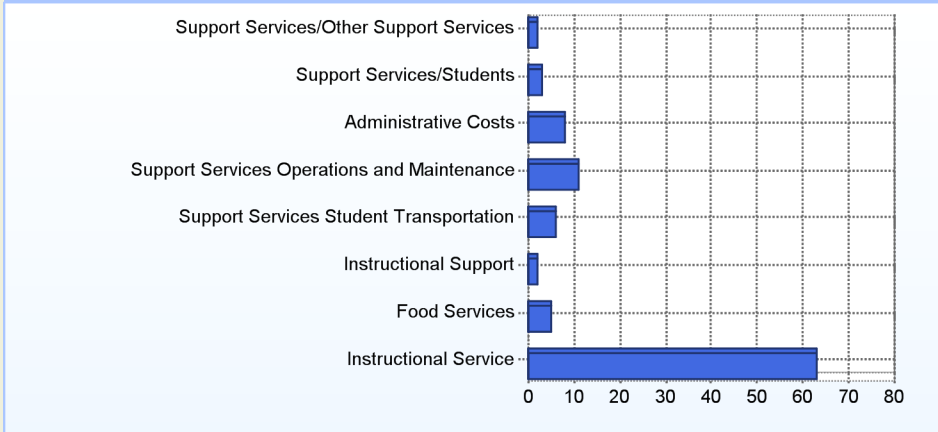

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2012-2013)

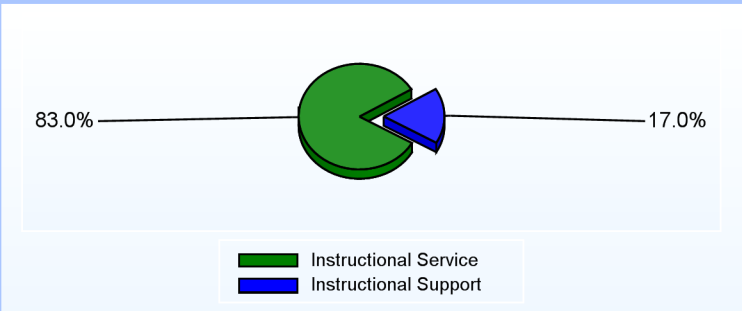

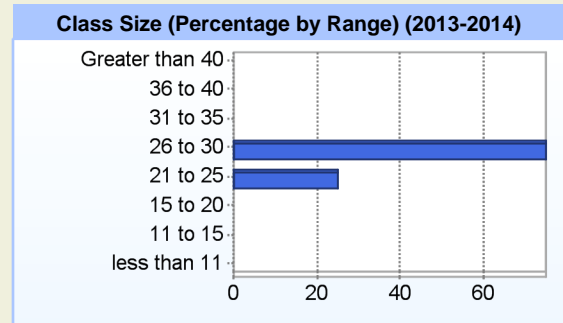

Dunbar is proud to provide students with a variety of positive & proactive support services to help each child reach his/her potential academically, socially, & emotionally. Support services provided through the individual & team efforts of the guidance counselor, 2 reading specialists and an intervention assistant make Dunbar a child-centered learning community. Scheduling revision for the 07-08 school year brought 90 minute reading blocks to kindergarten and first grade. By pooling staff for reading instruction, we were able to maintain groups with only 5-7 children per group. Our goal is for all children to be successful in all areas of development & to meet with success. Quarterly Pupil Progress Review & Staff Support Process monitor student achievement. Skills for Success & Safety are taught by the guidance counselor. The Everyday Math program offers children a broad background in mathematics. The Smithsonian Science Kits are used as the primary tool for science instruction.

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2012-2013)

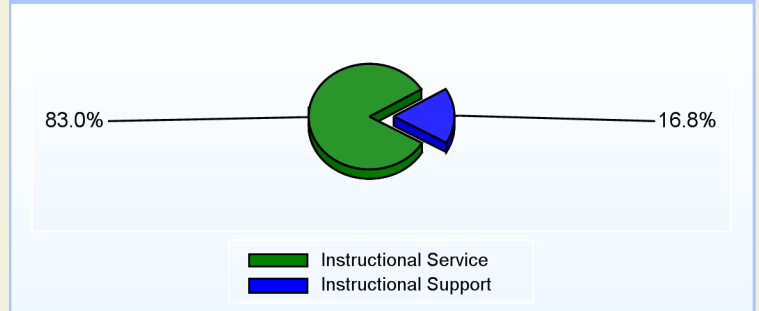

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2012-2013)

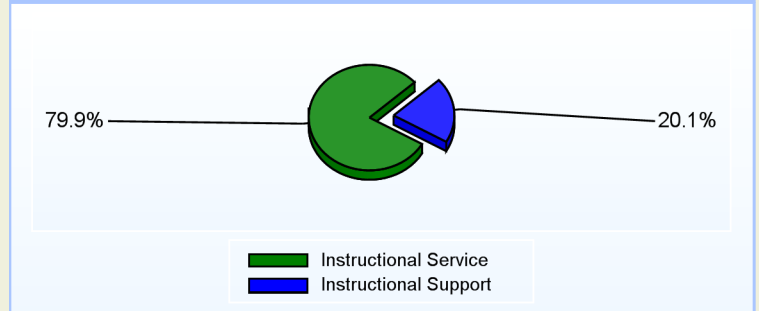

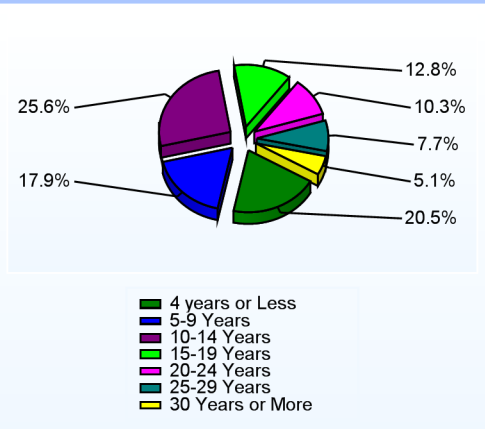

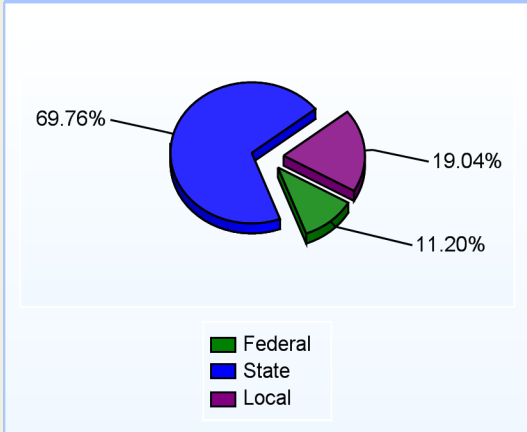
