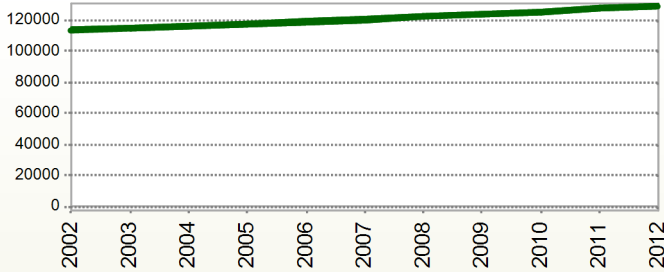

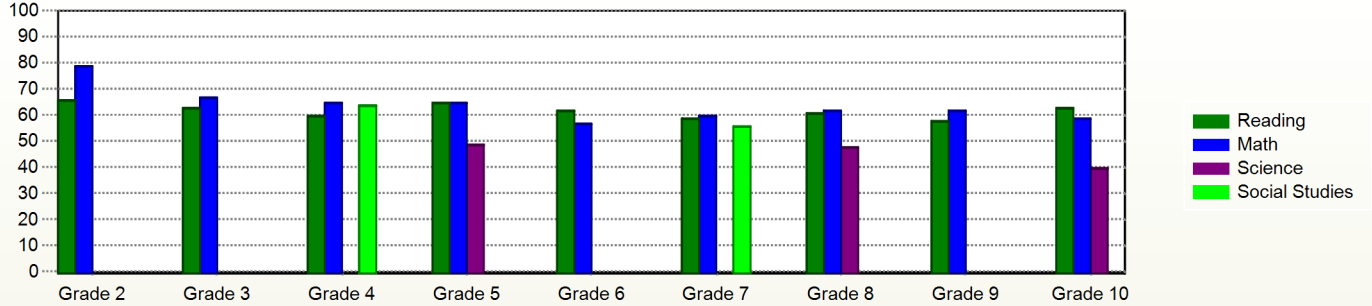

Percentage of Students Meeting State Standards (2010-2011)



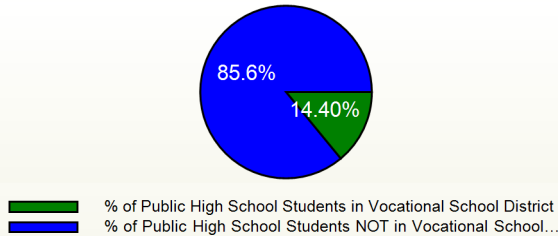

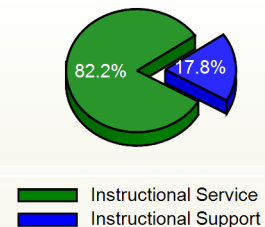

Instructional vs. Support (2011-2012)

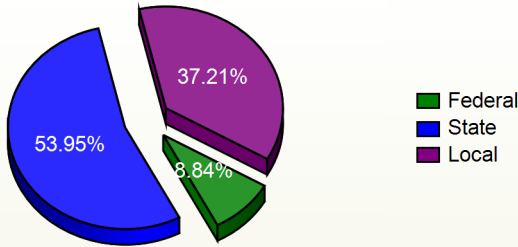

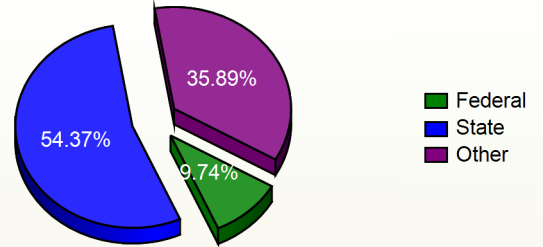

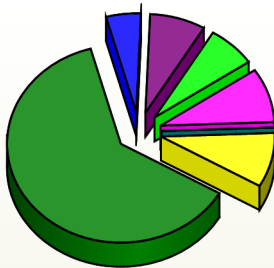
State Source of Educational Revenue (2009-2010)



Charter Schools Source of Educational Revenue (2009-2010)

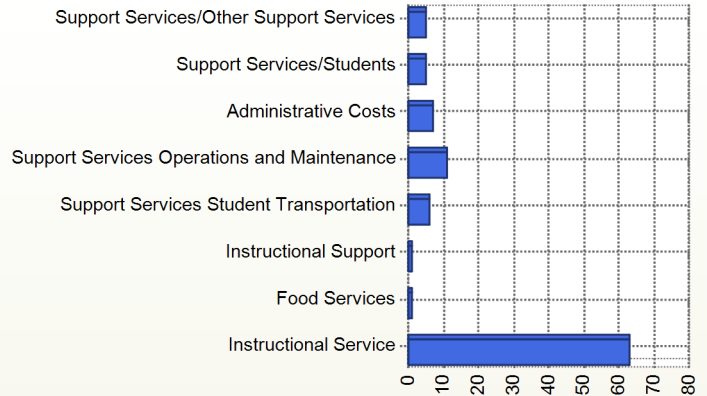


Revenue Receipts - State Appropriations (2009-2010)
