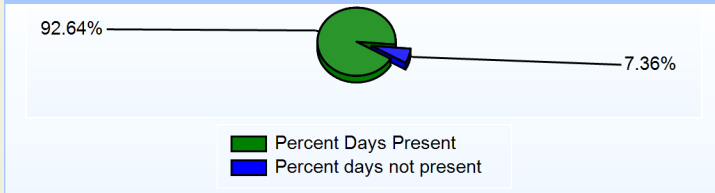

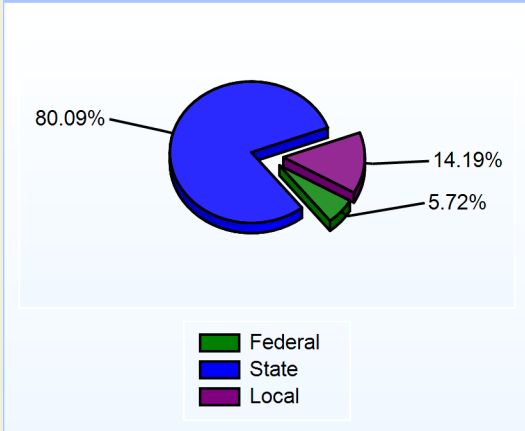

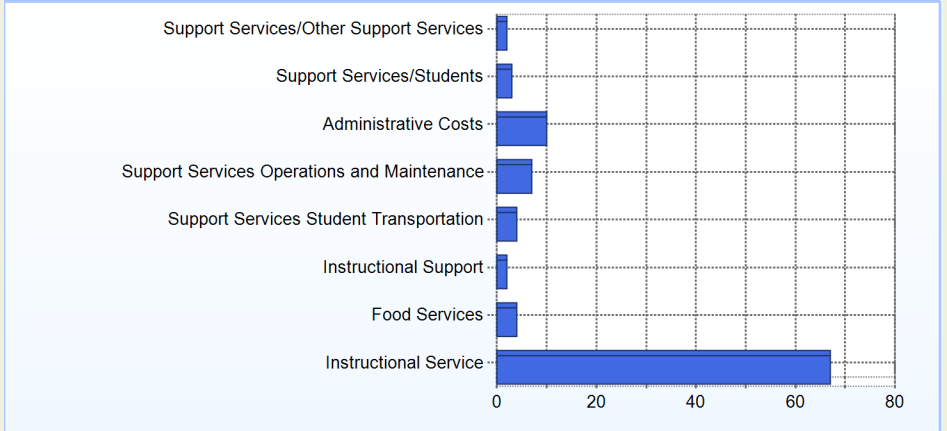

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

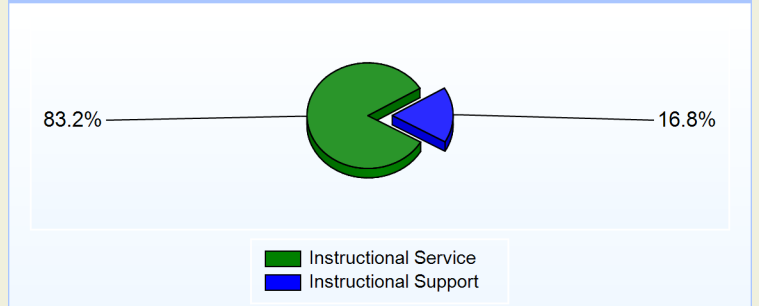

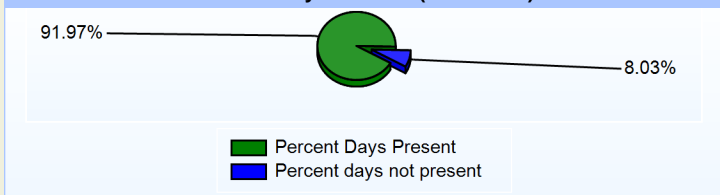

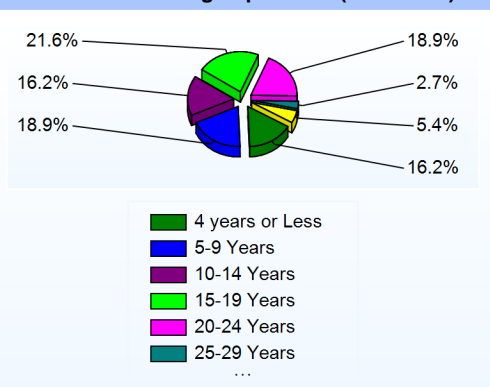

Curriculum Highlights

High standards for academic achievement are established for students at Delmar High School. Our academic pathways are college preparatory and our elective courses support the academic areas while also providing students with an opportunity to explore career options that both require college degrees or do not. Agriculture, Business, and Technology Education are available CTE pathways. AP courses, Wilmington University Dual Enrollment, and Academic Challenge Dual Enrollment courses through Delaware Technical Community College and the University of Delaware are available for students meeting the ACAP (Accelerated Course Access Policy). The administration and staff at Delmar High School are regularly evaluating the rigor and content of the courses offered and adjusting them as necessary. Several of the teachers work on projects at the state level in an effort to stay current on the latest developments on their curricular areas.

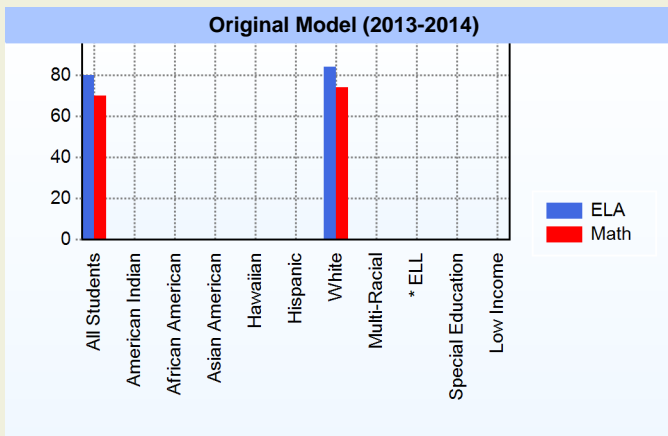

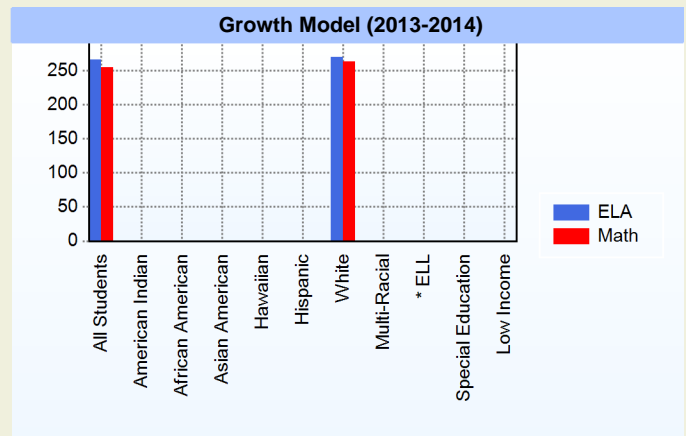

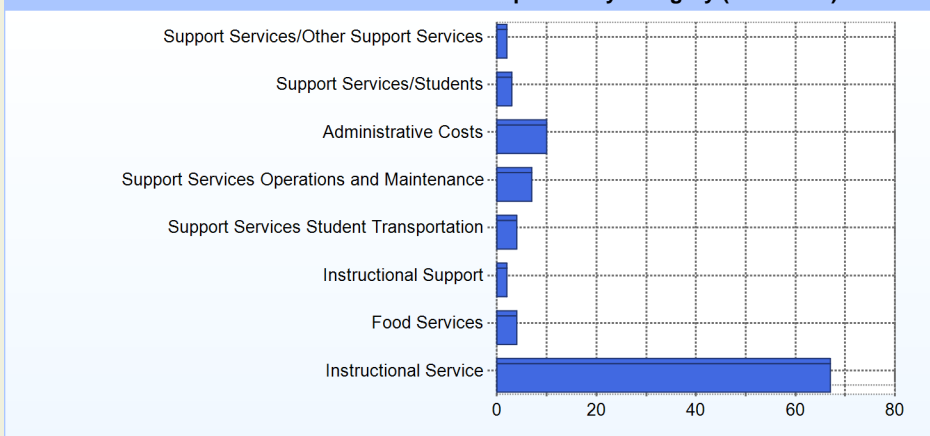

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

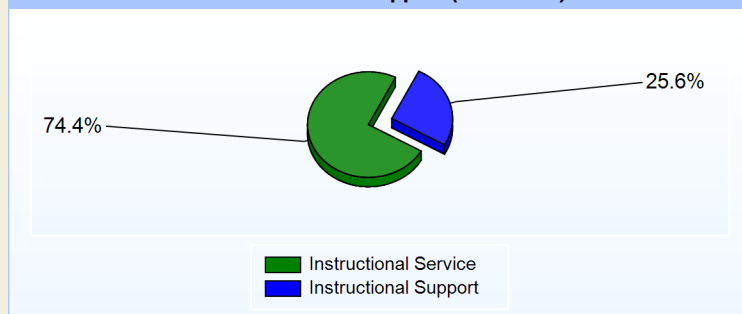

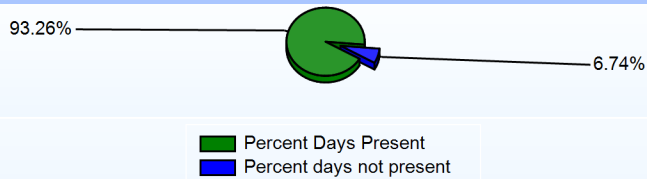

The Delmar School District continually strives to achieve top performance from their students. The administration and staff are always looking for ways to increase student achievement through the use of Learning Focused Strategies to engage students in higher order thinking as our instructional staff integrates Common Core Standards in the classroom. One measure of students' academic achievement is through performance on the DCAS (Science / Social Studies) or the Smarter Balanced Assessment (English/Language Arts & Mathematics). Our modified block schedule for English and Language Arts classes allow for more instructional time in smaller classes. 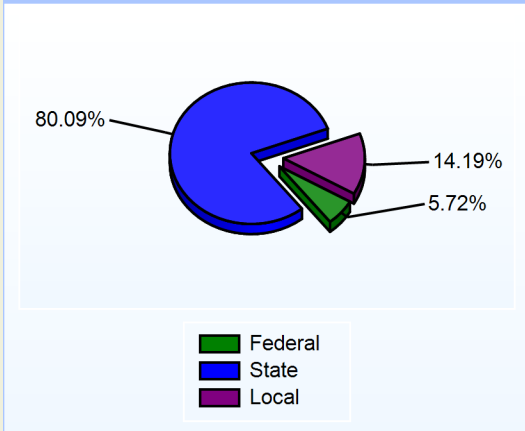

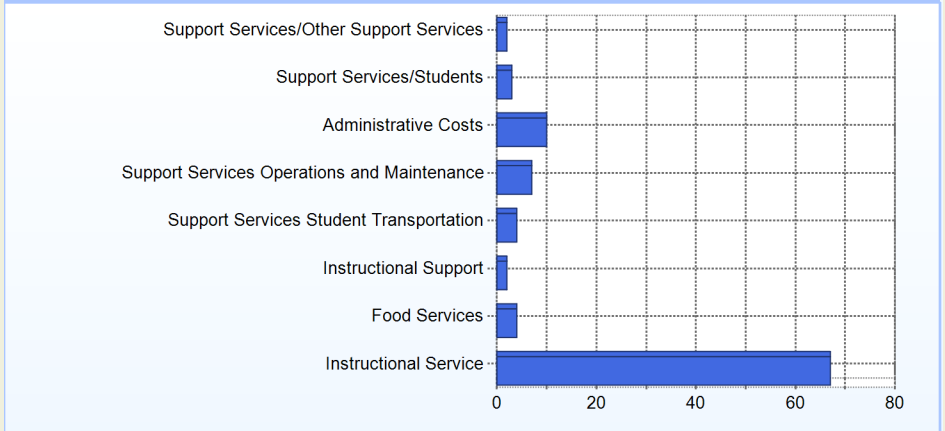

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

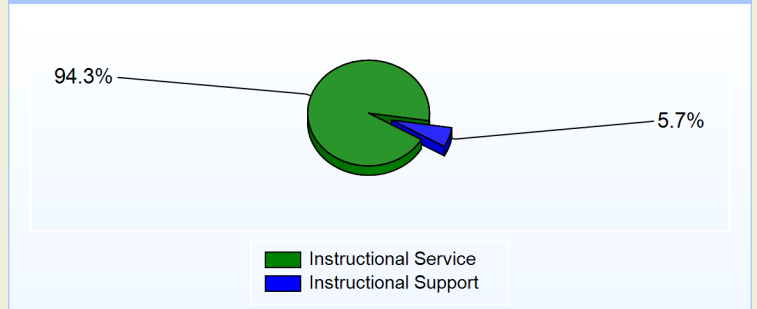
