Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

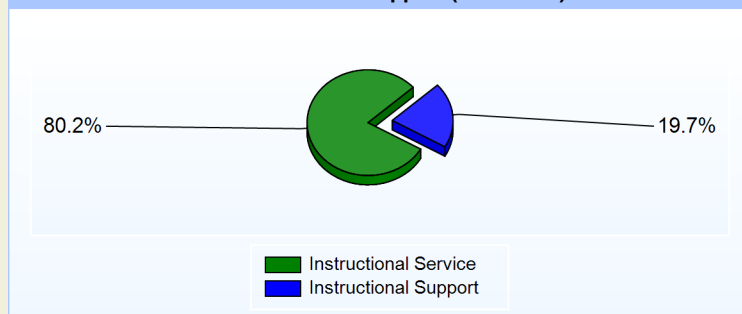

The Lake Forest School District Intensive Learning Center (ILC) is a specialized program of services provided for students whose social and emotional issues impede their learning in the traditional school setting. Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

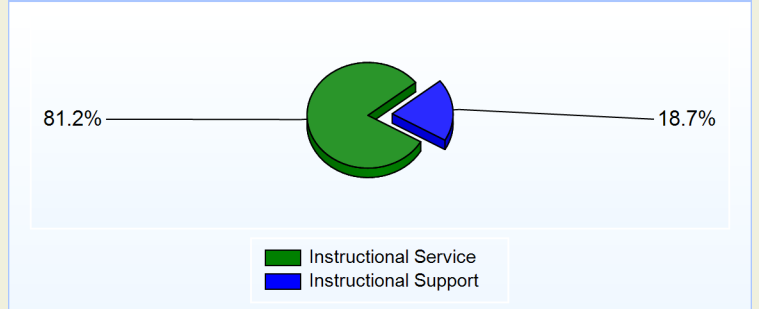

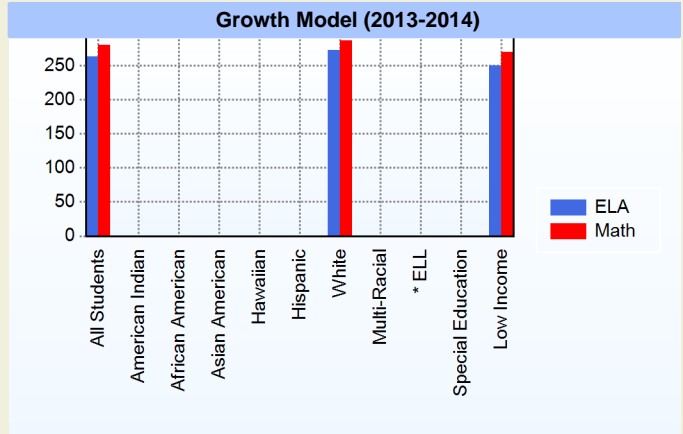
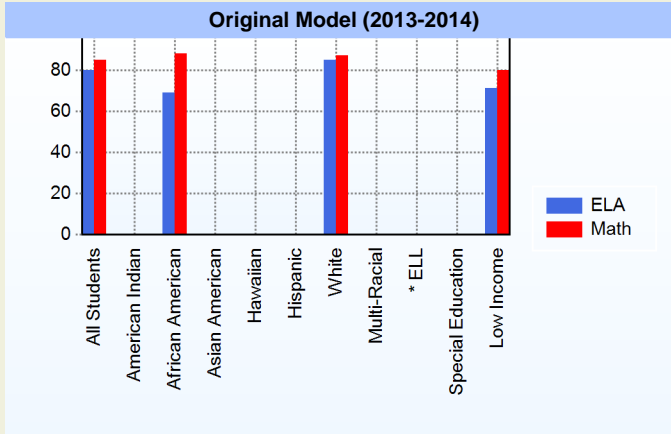
Lake Forest South is committed to student success by working with a variety of research-based resources to help our students achieve the Common Core Standards.

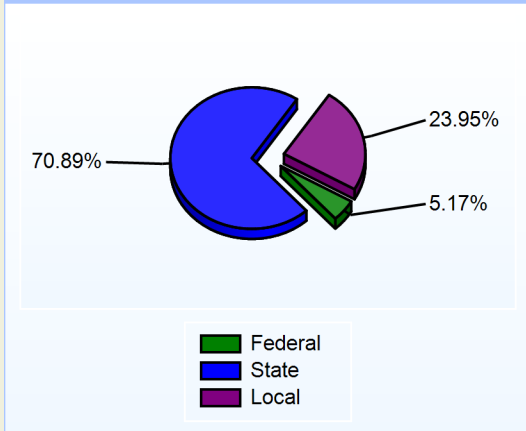

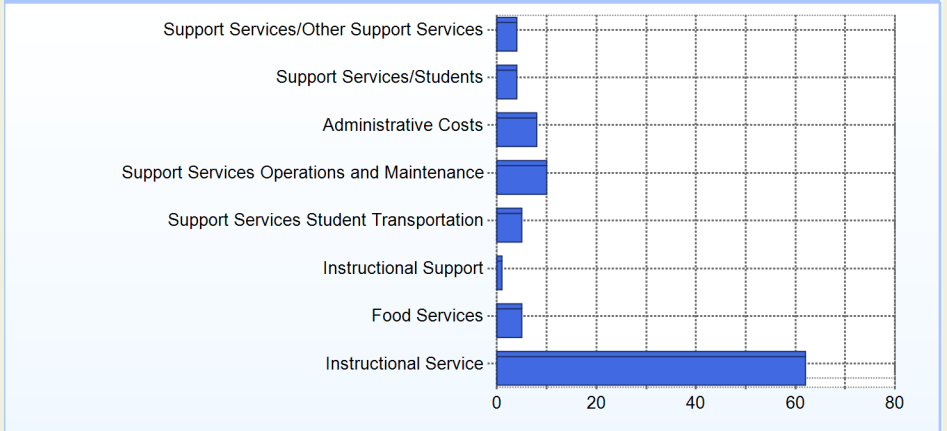

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

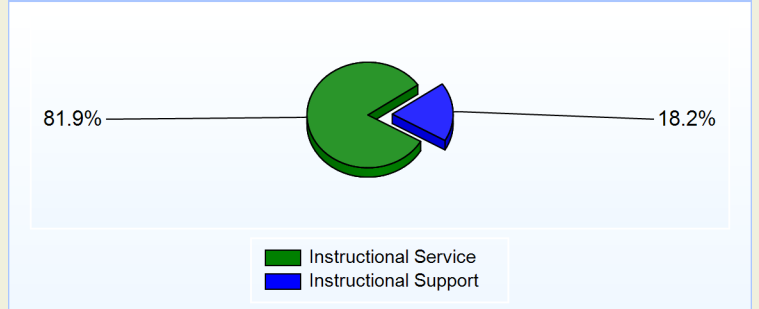

The driving force behind all of our instruction is the Common Core State Standards. With that, we implement Learning Focused Strategies as a staple for instructional design at Chipman Middle. The staff at W.T. Chipman has embraced LFS and developed units of study centered on the strategies developed from Learning-Focused. This year, Chipman Staff will be revamping our units of study to incorporate a more student centered approach to teaching and learning. 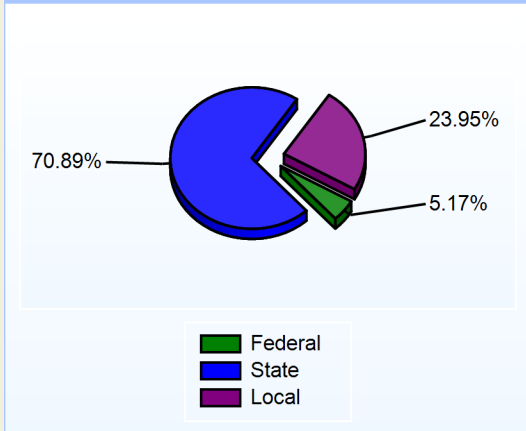

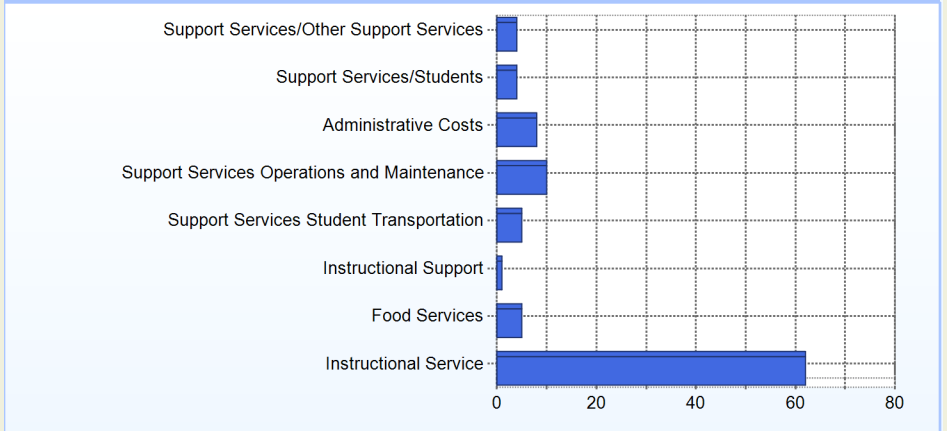

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

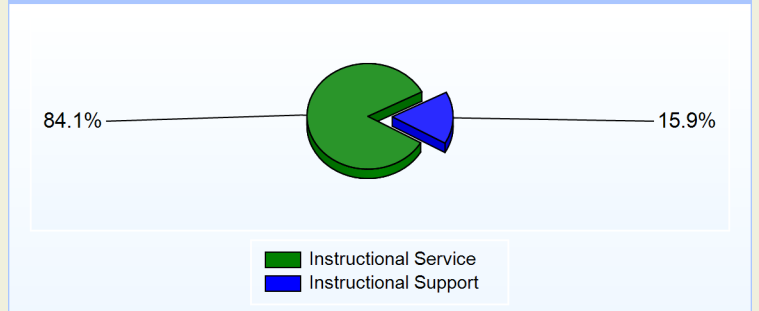

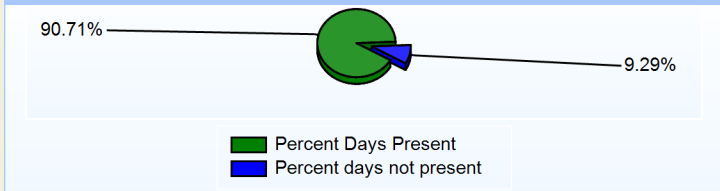

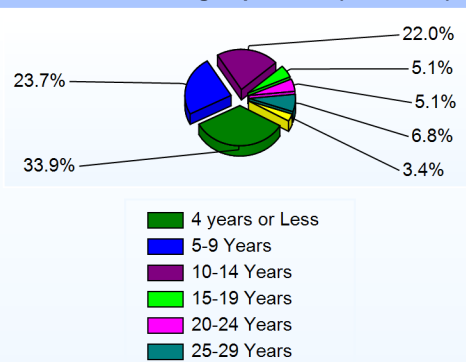

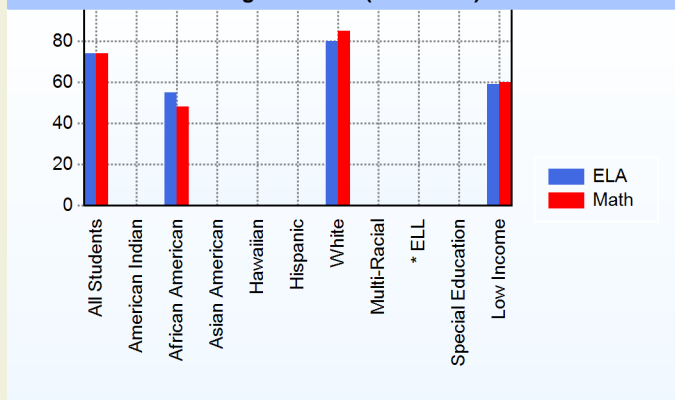

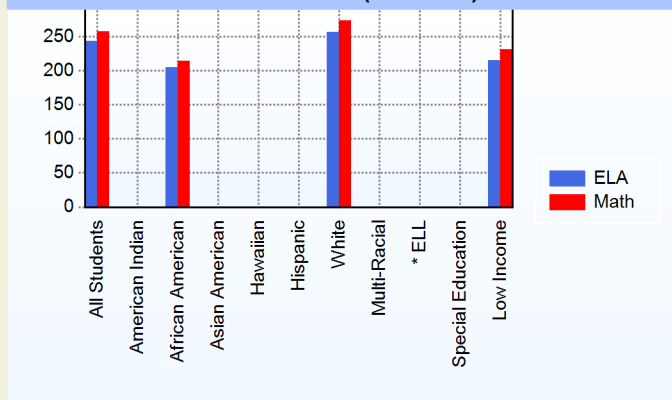

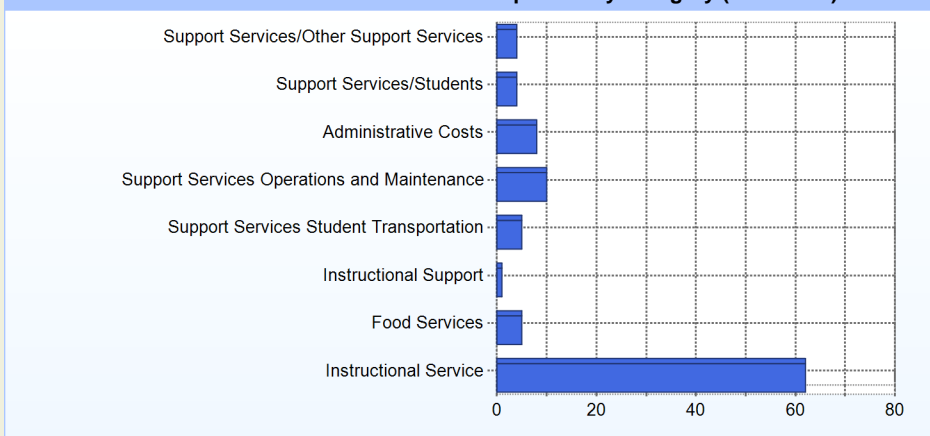

Percent District Allocation of Current Expenses by Category (2014-2015)

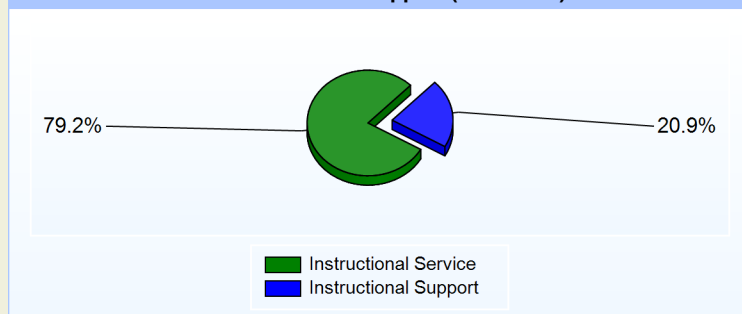

Years of Teaching Experience (2015-2016)



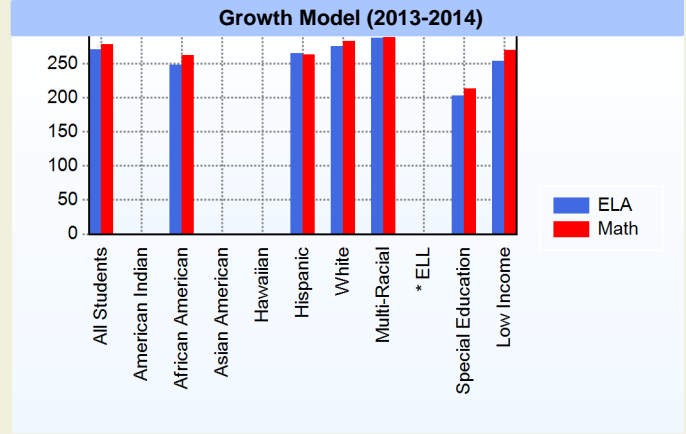
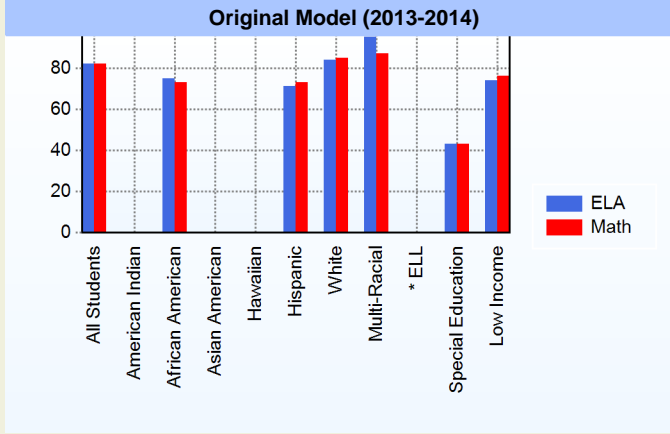

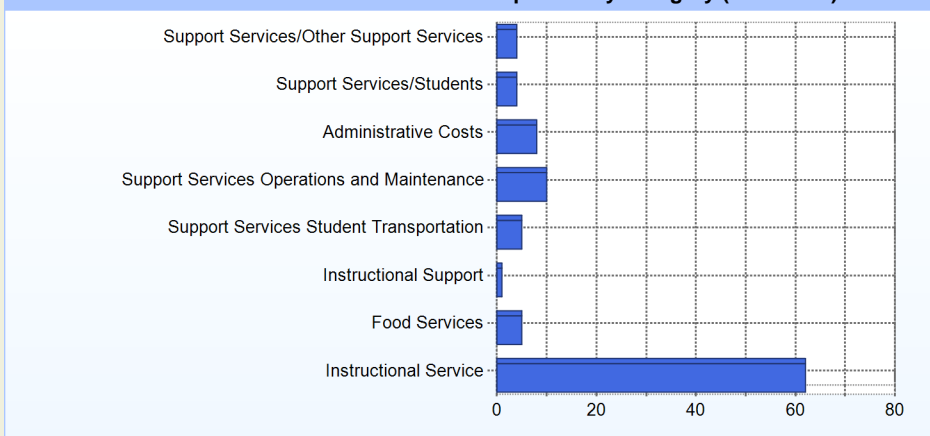
